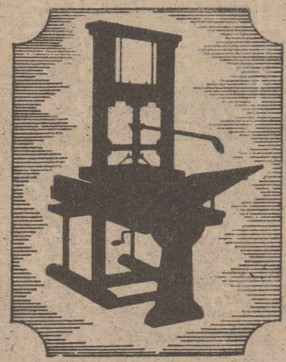

A total of 674 votes were cast for four candidates running for three open spots on the Rotan School Board, according to Jerry Dickson, Superintendent.

All three of the incumbents were re-elected to the board. James Carter was the top candidate total votes with 201. He was followed by Roger Blackwelder with 186 and Donnie Gruben with 185. Larry McClain lost in his bid for a term with 103 votes.

Larry Landes was elected to fill out the one-year term with 135 votes. The new candidates will officially take the oath of office on Monday, April 11th.

A total of 5 candidates were named in the election last Saturday to form the school board at Hobbs under a plan to revise the board from 7 members to 5 members, according to M.B. Maxwell, Superintendent.

The five members elected and their vote totals included: Howard Gordon (50); Gary Hyer (42); George Price (40); Walt Cave (35); and Terry Porter (34).

Two other candidates were on the ballot. Gary Finley received 28 votes and Dan Davousett captured 27 votes.

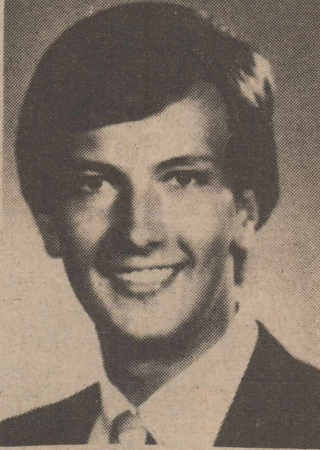

Fisher County residents returned two former Fisher County Hospital Board members to seats on the hospital board in light voting last Saturday, according to Fisher County Hospital Administrator Gary McGee.

Kirmit Terry, a charter member of the board, was the top candidate accumulating a total of 295 votes. Second in the running was board incumbent Glenn Copeland with 275 votes. David Hill of McCaulley ran a close third with 241 votes.

Others in the race were Kim Pease with 202; Annie Weems with 144; Ada Jo Brashears with 129 and Bill Gribbins with 21 votes respectively.

The two new board members officially take the oath of office and seats on the board on Monday night, April 18th, according to McGee.

## LAST DAY for 1982 IRA TAX-DEFERRED DEPOSITS

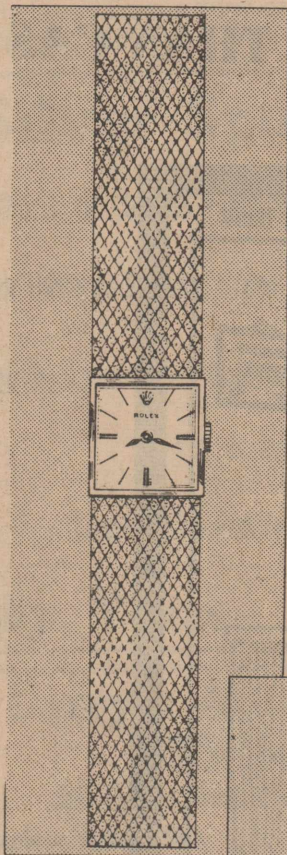
April 15. That's the last day to file your 1982 income tax report. It is also the last day to deposit up to \$2000 in an Individual Retirement Account at Homestate Savings. Even though you are enrolled in a retirement program, you can put up to \$2000 (\$4000 for a working couple) annually into IRA. A married couple with one spouse working, can set aside up to \$2250 into IRA annually. The money deposited into IRA, and the interest it earns, is tax-deferred until withdrawn at retirement.



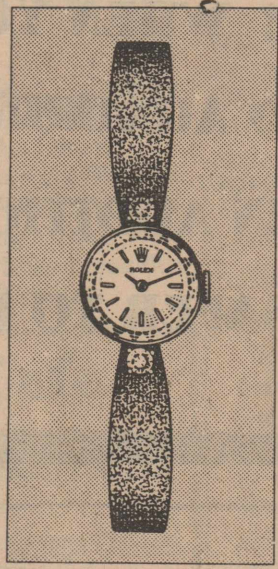

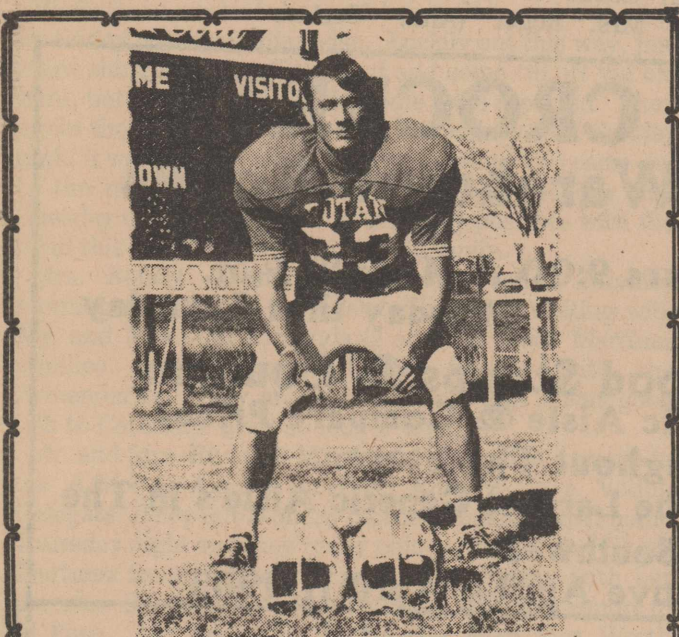

#### IRAs-MORE ADVANTAGEOUS

Because of the more liberal contribution levels, an Individual Retirement Account (IRA) looks better now than in the past.

An individual with earned income (wages or self-employment income) can make a tax deductible contribution to an Individual Retirement Account of 100% or earned income up to a maximum contribution of \$2,000. If each spouse on a joint return has earned income of \$2,000 or more, each is entitled to a full contribution for a maximum deduction on a joint return of \$4,000. If one spouse is not working, the maximum contribution is \$2,250 with no more than \$2,000 allocated to the plan of either individual.

You are not required to make contributions simply because you have an IRA. If you establish a plan and find that you are short of cash in some future year, you may reduce or skip the contribution.

If you own a business and your spouse is not working, consider providing your spouse with enough work to justify \$2,000 wages. This would allow for a full contribution to an IRA for your spouse as well.

Some institutions setting up IRAs will let you direct the investments. You can tell the Trustee to put your money in stocks, real estate, money market, etc. These institutions will normally have a minimum administrative fee since they will not necessarily make money from your investment program. If you feel you have a talent for making a good return on your investments, this might be the plan for you.


Individual Retirement Accounts can be established and contributions made through the due date for the filing of the tax return including any extensions requested. The contribution for 1982 can still be made up through April 15th or as late as August 15th if you extend your return.

An IRA funded for 30 years at \$2,000 per year earning 12% will accumulate to \$482,000. Your total contributions would be \$60,000.

## Prove Your Own Yields For Federal Crop Insurance

### COTTON

You may prove your actual 10 year average yield, add up to 10 per cent for participation in PIK, and insure 65 per cent or 75 per cent of that amount at 60 cents per pound.

In proving your cotton yields the ASCS may insert an adjusted yield for certain years in which you had low production. This is based on how your "good" years compare with the county average for those same years, and may be used in place of up to six consecutive "bad" years.

Proving your own yield does not raise your premium, only the guarantee. Premium is based on the usually lower yields which have been assigned each farm by FCIC.

### GRAIN SORGHUM

Grain sorghum insurance is also available. Although most farms have no proven grain sorghum history, the FCIC has assigned each farm a yield upon which both insurance premium and guarantees are based.

The sales closing date for cotton and grain sorghum has been extended until April 30th. If interested in cotton insurance, you should allow time for obtaining your 10 year average from the ASCS office.

Premium is due only after the crop is harvested.

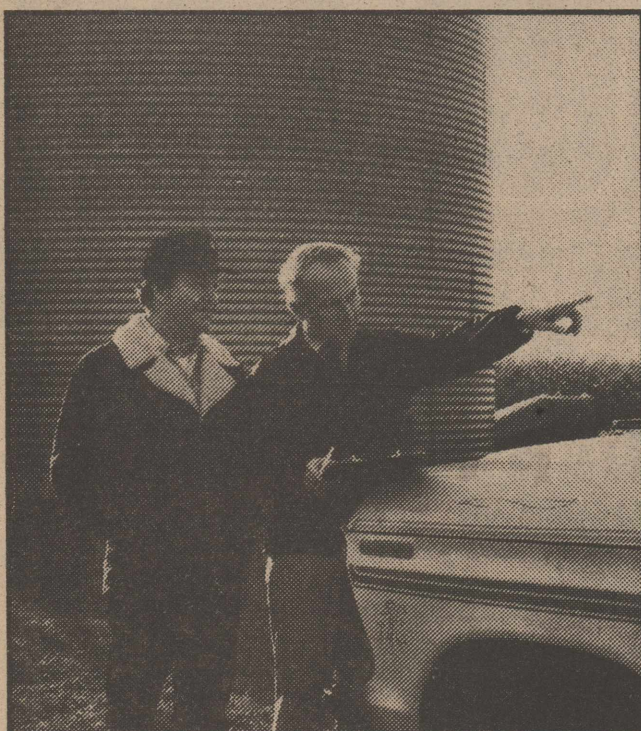

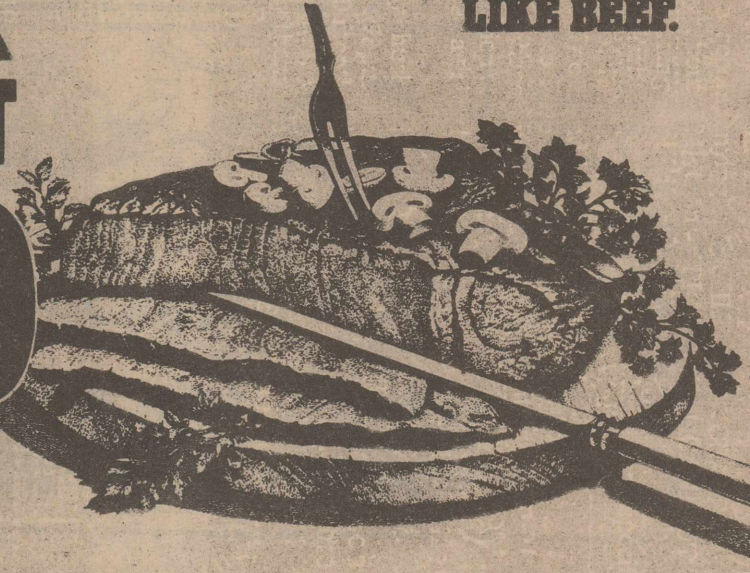
