# Govan Will Begin 60th Year As Yellowhammer Trainer Next Monday, Memorial Due At Homecoming For Rotan Legend

"If a task is once begun, never leave it until it's done. Be the labor great or small, do it well or don't do it at all." This original motto has been good to William Henry Govan or "H" as he is known by the people of Rotan. The trainer, friend and "jack-of-all-trades" for the Rotan Yellowhammer football team the past 60

years, Govan will be honored during homecoming activities this fall with the unveiling of a memorial in his name at the local field. "Jack-of-all-trades" is a fitting superlative for a man who shined shoes, worked in an oil mill, janitored at a bank, and worked at a drug store in addition to his most

famous duty as football trainer, since coming to Rotan on the Missouri-Kansas-Texas train in 1923. Govan leads a simple life based on a simple formula, God. "Don't try to do anything yourself. Put God first in your life and always thank Him for everything." There is however, more to his

success. "Treat others as you would have them treat you and whatever you do, don't hate anybody. People might think I'm dumb with those little sayings, but by golly they are true," says Govan. Mr. H has been the topic of widespread publicity recently. Jerry Waggoner, former Rotan resident, and player under


Govan, wrote a piece on Mr. H for Family Weekly last September. In addition, AP and UPI wire services have done articles on his life. What does "H" think of this? "I don't think I've contributed anything." Modest words for someone who will turn 86 on November 27 of this year. Disaster dealt Govan a

cruel blow about three weeks ago. A powerful summer storm blew the top off a hot water heater and flames ignited bedding that was nearby, setting his home ablaze. It was not totaled, however, items were lost that can never be replaced. "I had collected annuals from 1925 to the present and I lost every one. Several letter jackets and the game ball from the 1962 State Championship (Rotan's first and only) that was given to me by the All-State Quarterback Steve Herron, was burned too."

Obviously, Govan has watched the rough and tumble sport of football go through a variety of changes. "Back in the early years coaches didn't know very much and the players weren't very smart either." Further, the era of prejudice in the 40's, 50's and 60's seemed to have little, if any, impact on Rotan or Govan. He can recall only one incident where he was forced to deal with this cruel practice. It happened at an area eating establishment, around 1947 or 48. "I was the first one in the cafe and the owner looked at me and said, 'that nigger can't eat here So Coach Marcum said if that nigger can't eat here neither will we.'" With that, the whole team marched out of the cafe and went home to Rotan. For Henry Govan, care and genuine concern for the young men he helps are probably his greatest assets. "They are what keeps me going, I never have and probably never will see a bad boy. I think there is some good in

every one of them." Mr. H's training is not, however, limited to the playing field. "I try to tell the boys not to mess with drugs or drinking or smoking. They will only make a problem for you." He also cautions them concerning money. "Don't let it swell your head or knock the buttons off your shirt." His basic, simplistic philosophies are a refreshing change in our fast paced, hectic society.

The greatest reward that he receives is when a former player drops by to say "Hi" or meets him on the street just to talk. "That makes me Happy." A former player himself at Prairie View A&M in 1917, Govan stays with the boys constantly during the season. "Everything they do, I'll be there." When will Mr. H say goodbye to the game and players that he loves so much? Probably when he dies. "I will keep at it until I can't go anymore." "You know football is like a bald-headed man. If you got one string of hair up there, you have to grab it and hold on or its gone." The memorial that will be unveiled this year seems a small token of appreciation for a man who has grabbed that string and held on for all its worth for so long.

In concluding his address to the Booster Club last Monday, Smith informed them of a rule change that would allow the wearing of football helmets beginning on the first day of

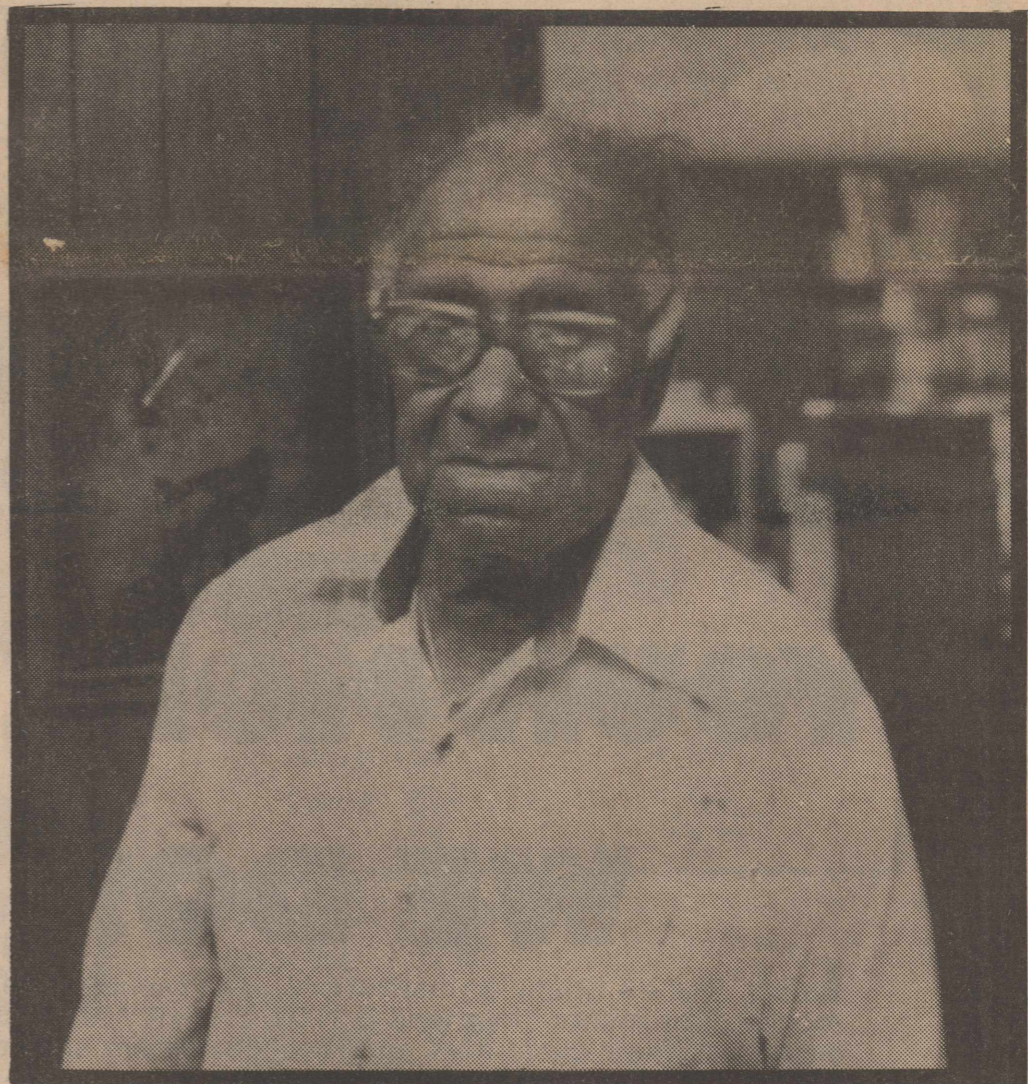

Gruben expressed the appreciation of all members for the work Copeland, Kiker and Carol Leverton did while officers.

In closing the meeting, it was agreed to continue filming all regular season games in color and continue meeting as a club each Tuesday night at the School Cafeteria at 7:30 p.m.

The next meeting of the club will be on Tuesday, August 16th at 7:30 at the School Cafeteria.

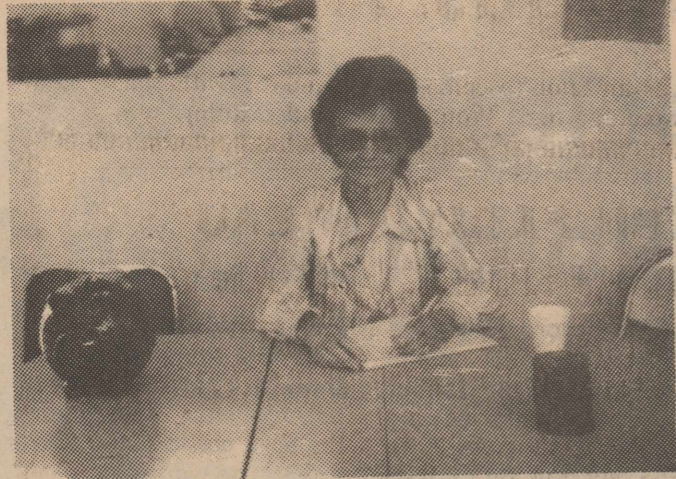

## Two At Rotan Arrested

Two Rotan individuals were arrested last week in connection with a surge of burglaries in Rotan in recent weeks, according to Rotan Police Chief Gene Pack.

Fisher County based DPS Patrolman Allan Arnwine recovered a stolen vehicle recently after stopping a suspect traveling between Anson and Roby for leaving an Anson service station without paying his gasoline purchase bill.

According to Arnwine, the individual was stopped approximately 2 miles east of Roby on July 19th and Arnwine received notification of the

Anson service station incident. Arnwine checked out the vehicle the subject was driving and found that it had been stolen from Dade County Florida.

The individual was arrested, placed in the Fisher County Jail and was released on July 25th after posting a \$10,000 bond. He was originally from California.

## Tax Planning by Gerald Rodgers, CPA



### TAX EXEMPT INCOME (When To Invest)

Although the yield on tax exempt securities is usually lower than other investments, there can be tax advantages to some people.

Tax exempt instruments are obligations of states, cities and other political subdivisions. The interest earned on these instru-

ments will not be taxable on your federal income tax return, and most states do not tax income from state or municipal bonds within their own state.

The following table compares the yield of a taxable investment with that of a tax-free security.

Taxable Income (Joint)	Tax Rate	Bond Yields			
		6%	8%	10%	12%
\$ 15,000	17%	7.23	9.64	12.05	14.46
\$ 30,000	30%	8.57	11.43	14.29	17.14
\$ 50,000	40%	10.00	13.33	16.67	20.00
\$110,000	50%	12.00	16.00	20.00	24.00

Example: A joint tax return with \$15,000 of taxable income (all taxable sources less all business and personal deductions and exemptions) in the 17% tax bracket would need a taxable yield of 12.05% to equal a tax exempt bond with a yield of 10%. A 50% bracket taxpayer would need a before-tax yield of 20% to equal a tax-free bond of 10%.

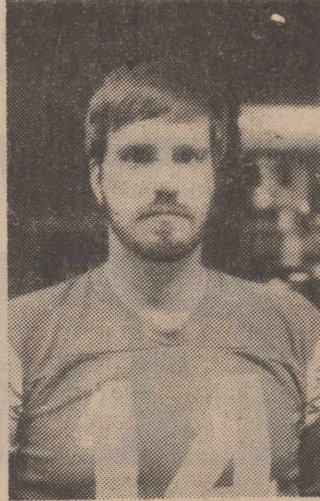
If you purchased nothing but tax exempt securities, your tax bracket would fall to zero and you may then

be in a position of wanting a certain amount of taxable income. The proper mix of taxable and tax-free investments to maximize your after-tax dollars depends upon your other sources of income and the marginal tax bracket in which you fall.

You need to review alternative investments to determine the appropriate level of tax-free investments for your best after-tax return. Such review should be done at least annually.
