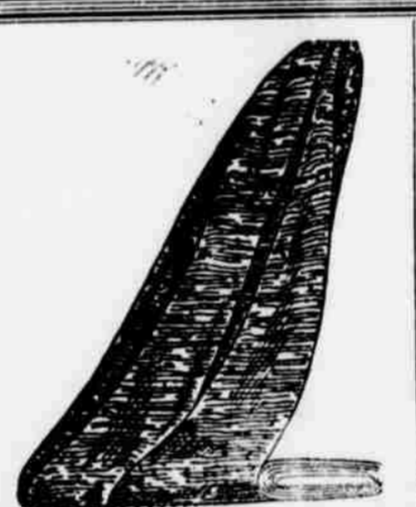

Amendment to Postal Laws and Regulations

Order 3721: The Postal Laws and Regulations of 1932 are hereby amended by adding a new section immediately following section 156, to be known as "section 156 1/2," as follows:

Section 156 1/2. Ninety days after date of enactment of this act no person over 16 years of age shall take any migratory waterfowl unless at the time of such taking he carries on his person an unexpired Federal migratory-bird hunting stamp issued to him in the manner hereinafter provided; except that no such stamp shall be required for the taking of migratory waterfowl by Federal or State institutions or official agencies, for propagation purposes or by the resident owner, tenant, or share cropper of the property, or officially designated agencies of the Department of Agriculture for the killing of such waterfowl when found injuring crop or other property, under such restrictions as the Secretary of Agriculture may by regulation prescribe.
