Boggess' company, H. E. McCulloch's First Texas cavalry. I served my country from the 20th of April, 1861, until the 20th of April 1862, on the frontier of Texas. On the 20th of April, 1861, we were mustered into the Confederate army for twelve months. months. After serving the twelve months we were mustered out of service at Fredericksburg, Texas, so we came back home and our Capt. M. M. Boggess was commissioned to raise an independent company and we all joined his company again So we were then ordered to Little Rock, Ark. After we got there we were attached to Morgan's battalion and served with it until the close of the war in 1865.

I don't suppose there was a man that belonged to Morgan's battalion that did not know me. I was in my 17th gan's battalion that did not know me. I was in my 17th year when I went in the army and very small to my age. I only weighed 107 pounds. I had one of the finest horses that was in the Confederate service. I was one of the dispatch bearers for the battalion. I will be eighty-three years old on the 7th day of August. There are only three of us low living, myself, John Wood and Bill Harris. John Wood lives in Graham, Young county, Bill Harris lives in Corpus Christi, I think. Please send them a copy of the Forum if they are not subscribers.

I am very feeble. I have about lost the use of myself from my waist down and also my left hand, so I am not expecting to be here much longer, but I do hope to see you and your dear wife contiinue to hold any office you ask for because I know you are the right kind of goods.

The governor opened her campaign at Sulphur Springs on May 22 and there was 25,000 people attending the occasion. There has never before been another such political meeting in Texas.

I could call by their first names 36 friends from 36 different counties. There were farmers, lawyers and doctors from all over Northeast Texas, and others from as far south as Houston and San Antonio.

This meeting was an eye-opener to the crowd who have inaugurated a hate campaign in Texas. While Mrs. Ferguson is working as faithfully at her post of duty as any governor ever did, two of her opponents are going over the state telling the people that her administration is so bad that she should be denied the customary second term, yet they have not specified a single act of dishonor or inefficiency upon her part. She burdened the people with only one legislative session instead of a half dozen. Her general appropriation bill was over \$10,000,000 less than her predecessor's. She expended some money to enlarge the asylums so the insane would not have to remain in the jails. Mr. Moody says she increased the expense of maintaining prisoners. She may have done so in order to provide them with more suitable food and clothing. My God! Is that a crime? The penitentiary was hard hit by the drouth, but she managed it so much better than her predecessors that the comptroller's April report shows it has a nice cash balance and said report also shows more money in the general fund than ever before at this time of the year. All state warrants are being paid in cash. Confederate pensions have been increased nearly every quarter since she was inaugurated. She has provided for the needs of all the state institutions.

Her anti-mask law has done away with midnight whippings, boycotts, intimidations and intolerance—buried most of them with the rubbish of the Dark Ages. She proposes a 3c gasoline tax that will raise \$12,000,000 so as to aid the schools and the highways and at the same time reduce state taxes from 35c to 25c.

Then what is the awful thing called "Fergusonism?" Ten thousand modern school buildings are silent but eloquent witnesses to the fact that they are the creatures of Fergusonism, and they are the hope of this state and nation.

Fergusonism means more protection of person and property, better government, more aid for the state's institutions, better schools, a square deal for all—the poor as well as the rich—and a reduction of taxes.

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
