### **DEPOSITS IN 823** TEXAS BANKS ARE INSURED BY FDIC

Number is 89 Percent of All Licensed Institutions In State Figures Show

### PLAN MISUNDERSTOOD

nsurance Offers Protection To Depositors up to \$5,000 Even Though Bank Fails

WASHINGTON, D. C .- The deposits of more than 823 Texas banks are insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation, Chairman Leo T. Crowley has announced. This number is more than 89 per cent of all the licensed institutions in the state.

In the nation more than 14,000 banks or over 93 per cent of all the icensed institutions are now insur-

Athough deposit insurance is now permanent part of the nation's banking system people generally do not understand it very well, Mr. rowley said.

"The Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation is just what the name implies." he pointed out. "It is an insurance organization insuring deposits in banks. This protection is paid for by the banks. The insurance offers full protection to indi-vidual depositors up to \$5,000. In other words, if an insured bank fails and a person has, say, \$4,800 on deposit the Corporation would pay him in full. Our studies have shown that the \$5,000 maximum fuly protects more than 97 per cent

of all the depositors in insured banks." The insured bank gets into dificulties






