

Prison construction by end of July forecast

Construction of the Snyder 1,000-man state prison unit should begin by the last week in July, the on-site administrator for the project said Wednesday.

David J. Ritter, a construction specialist with HCB Contractors of Dallas, made this prediction following a meeting Tuesday between TDC board officials and representatives of Lt. Gov. Bill Hobby, House Speaker Gib Lewis, Gov. Bill Clements and

Public Finance Authority Chairman Harry Whittington.

No official word from any of those involved with the closed-door meeting had been received by TDC staffers as of Wednesday morning, but Charles Terrell of Dallas, chairman of the TDC board, was quoted in news accounts as saying "The Snyder unit will go on as scheduled."

There were also reports that Brown & Root of Houston, the on-site managers for the two 2,250 maximum security units to be

built in Amarillo and Gatesville, had been relieved of these duties.

Wednesday, Ritter said there has been no official confirmation of this either. His company, also known as H.C. Beck of Dallas, has been contracted to serve as the on-site construction manager for the four 1,000-man units to be built here as well as in Woodville, Marlin and Dayton.

Brown & Root had been responsible for initial cost projections for all six of the TDC projects.

Regarding the bid received for

the local project, Terrell was quoted as saying, "We do not think that the bid is out of line. We think the estimates last year were too low."

Wednesday morning, Ritter speculated that the only TDC project which might see a substantial delay in construction would be the last 1,000-man unit to be built.

Last Tuesday, TDC officials delayed selling some \$83.8 million in bonds to finance the prison units in Amarillo, Wood-

ville and Marlin.

The Snyder 1,000-man unit and the 2,250 maximum security unit for Gatesville have already been funded through the bond sale of some \$115 million which included several other projects related to existing TDC units.

The Snyder unit, the first to be built, is to be the prototype for the three other 1,000-bed prisons.

The discussions in Austin Tuesday were in preparation for a July 11 meeting of the full TDC board. It will be held in

Gatesville to coincide with groundbreaking ceremonies for the maximum security unit to be built there.

Ritter said he currently expects bids for construction of the Snyder unit to be officially let at that meeting.

When these bids were opened June 9 in Huntsville, the apparent low bidder, Argee Corp. of Denver, submitted a base bid for construction only of \$14,449,500. This increased the total prison

Young killers

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Supreme Court today struck down an Oklahoma man's death sentence but stopped short of ruling whether capital punishment may be used for convicted killers who committed their crimes before reaching age 16.

In what had been expected to be its most important capital punishment decision of the year, the justices could not muster a majority of votes to resolve a key question: Does execution of teen-age killers violate the Constitution's ban on "cruel and unusual punishment?"

Midwest Co-Op announces new general manager post

The man who will be only the fourth fulltime general manager for Midwest Electric Co-Op in its 50-year history was officially announced Wednesday.

The board of directors for the cooperative have named Vesta Orr to the post. He will be moving to the Roby-based headquarters office for Midwest from Tulia, where he has served with Swisher Electric Cooperative.

Orr replaces Parker Wetsel,

who will be retiring effective July 1 after 36 years with Midwest. Wetsel has served as general manager for the rural co-op since July 1, 1976.

The new general manager has some 33 years experience in the field of rural electrification.

He will now head a company first formed in 1938 which today provides rural electrical service to approximately 6,000 customers in nine counties. These include Scurry, Borden, Garza, Kent,

Stonewall and Mitchell Counties.

The co-op employs some 42 staffers who maintain an estimated 2,800 miles of electric line.

Orr and his wife Nelda have two daughters, Terry Orr of Wichita Falls and Mrs. Shari Morris of Childress.

Company officials have also extended an invitation to all co-op customers to meet the new general manager at the Roby Midwest office.

School said near hiring decision

The selection of an administrator to head Snyder ISD's business office is expected to be announced Thursday at a called meeting of the school board.

The official will replace Nick Williams, current assistant superintendent for business, who will leave the district effective July 15 to accept the post as chief appraiser for the Hockley County Appraisal District.

Superintendent Dalton Moseley noted the title for the position will be officially changed back to business manager for the district rather than assistant superintendent.

The change in title in no way affects the job responsibility, he noted. "Where I've come from, we've always called this position a business manager, and that's what I'd like to call it here," he said.

He noted the title "assistant superintendent" also causes some confusion among the general public. Until Moseley accepted a dual post as superintendent and assistant superintendent for personnel, the district had three "assistant superintendents."

The teller on Deep Creek says, "Visits always give pleasure—if not the arrival, then the departure."

In solving problems of the nation's schools, educators may be spending their time on the wrong matters.

Here in Snyder, for example, school folks are knee-deep in budget matters. Expenses continue to rise while available revenues continue to decline.

On top of fiscal matters, local educators have to concern themselves with state and federal regulations, changing social values and an explosion of scientific and technical knowledge.

Half-day kindergarten, bilingual education, gifted and talented curriculum, drug education, sex education, maximum class sizes, duty-free lunch periods, teacher evaluations and career ladders have engulfed the education system.

But in New Jersey, one school board has decided to zero in on the key issue—chocolate milk.

On a split vote of the school board in Pemberton, there is now a ban on chocolate milk at all 10 of the elementary schools in the community.

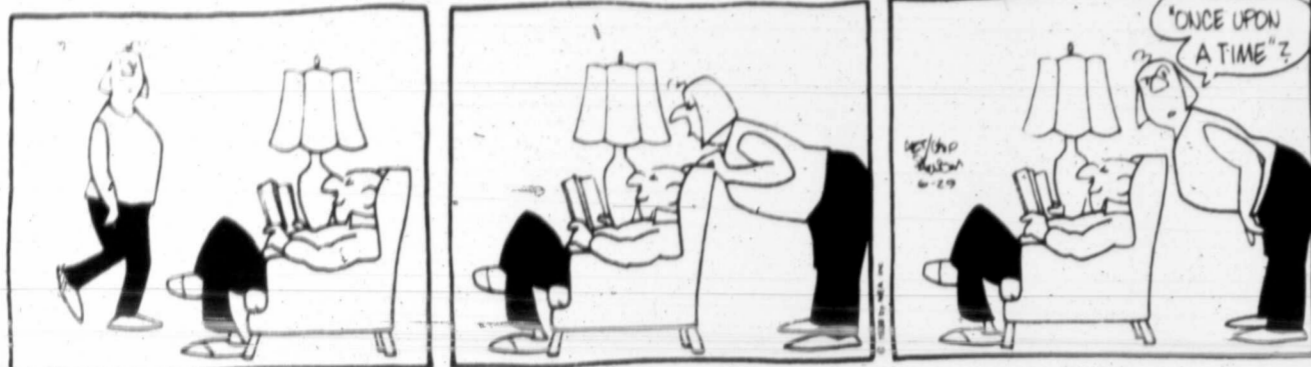
Starting next fall only white milk will be served in the school cafeteria. The board reasoned that chocolate milk is too closely akin to "junk food."

School officials say the rule was a necessary one to help prevent kids from getting rambunctious after lunch. One principal claimed one chocolate milk was bad enough, but two pints of the brown stuff and kids would be "bouncing off the walls."

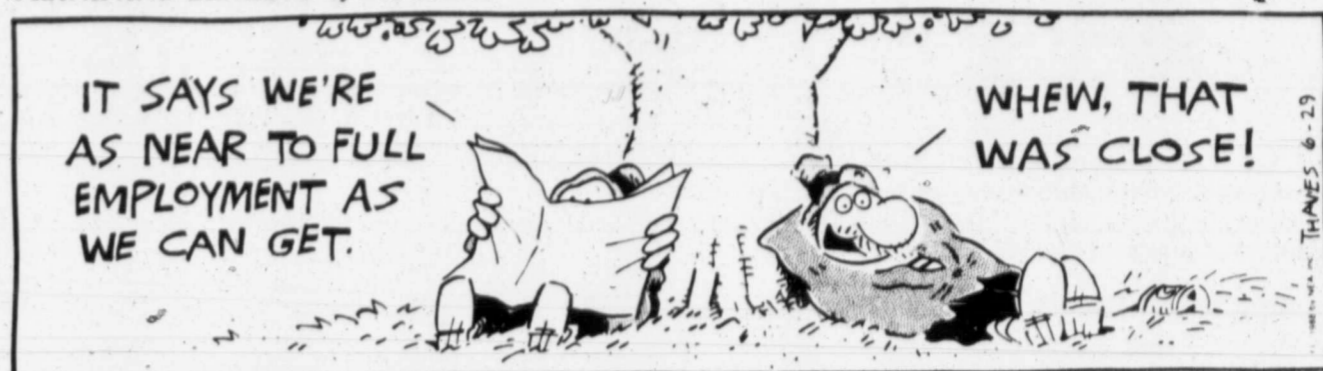

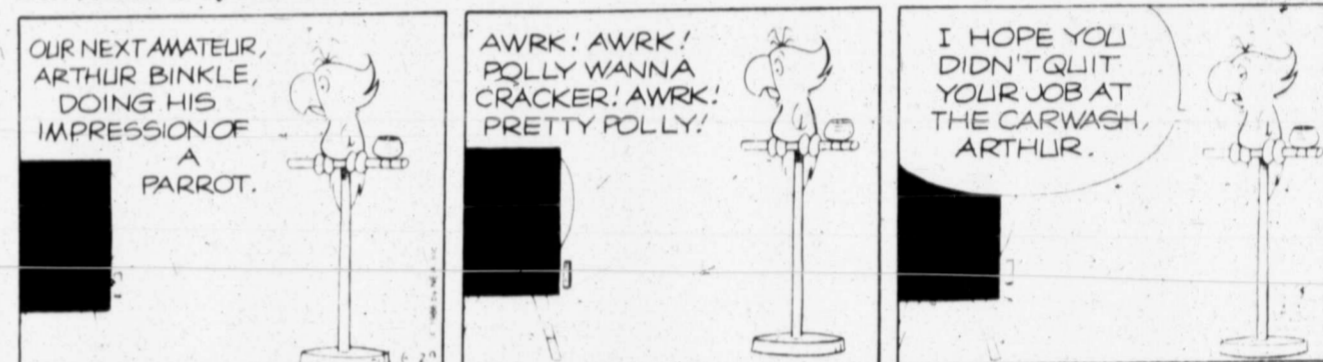

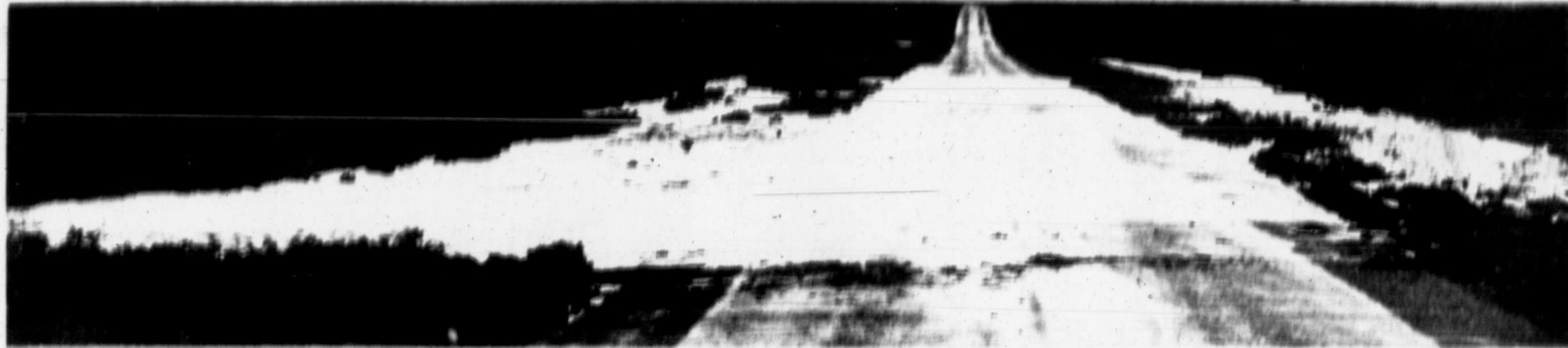

Central America decisions delayed

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Reagan's spokesman conceded that efforts to pry concessions from Nicaragua's Sandinista government have stalled, and the administration's next step won't be decided until Secretary of State George Shultz returns from Central America.

Amid increasing reports that Contra rebel troops are returning to base camps, and with no new peace talks scheduled, White House spokesman Marlin Fitzwater was asked Tuesday whether Reagan had decided to submit a new aid package to Congress.

A. SCA shall provide and maintain PEG access channels for purposes outlined below, which shall be capable of providing service 24 hours per day.

1. SCA's sole responsibility shall be to facilitate use of access channels and not to provide a studio, production or play back equipment or personnel. SCA shall lend technical assistance to users in order for users to deliver video signals to SCA for showing on access channels.
2. Educational access channels shall be available for use by public and private school authorities.
3. Government access channels which shall be available for local governmental use.
4. SCA shall incorporate into its cable television system equipment which will permit the City, in times of emergency, to override the audio on all channels simultaneously. It will be activated by telephone provided by SCA.

ARTICLE IV. ADMINISTRATION

Section 1. Performance Evaluation

A. The City and SCA shall schedule performance evaluation sessions and public hearings at the April Council meeting during the fourth (4th) and eighth (8th) years. The sessions shall be open to the public and announced in a newspaper of general circulation in accordance with legal notice. When there exist other reasonable evidence, which in the judgement of the City, questions the quality of service, the City may require SCA to test the signal quality and performance.

B. Topics which may be discussed during evaluation may include, but not be limited to, rate structures, franchise fee, penalties, free or discounted services, application of new technologies, system performance, services provided, programming offered, customer complaints, amendments to this ordinance, judicial and FCC rulings, and SCA or City rules.

C. SCA shall file with the City a report giving an assessment of its performance evaluation 60 days prior to review. SCA shall bear reasonable cost of City to review performance in the fourth and eighth years.

D. SCA shall run proof of performance tests during the fourth and eighth years conforming to FCC and franchise requirements, and present the results to the Council for consideration of performance review. (When there exists other reasonable evidence, which in the judgment of the City, questions the quality of service, the City may require SCA to test the signal quality and performance.) The City may require the tests to be supervised by an engineer, whose reasonable expense shall be paid by SCA, chosen by the City. The engineer shall sign all records of special tests and forward such records to the City with a report interpreting the results, and recommending action to be taken.

Section 2. Reporting and Availability of Records

A. SCA shall keep complete and accurate books of accounts and records of its business and operations in connection with this franchise. All such books and records shall be consistent with generally accepted accounting practices and shall be made available to the City at SCA's principal office in the City.

B. The City shall have the right, relating to rate regulation of cable service provided by SCA, at reasonable times and for reasonable purposes, to examine, audit, review, and/or obtain copies of the papers, books, accounts, documents, maps, plans, and other records of SCA and/or its affiliates and to inspect, inventory, and/or appraise the plant, equipment, and other property of SCA within the City's jurisdiction. SCA shall fully cooperate in making available its records and otherwise assisting in these activities.

C. The City shall have the power to require that SCA report such information relating to SCA and/or its affiliates as the City may consider necessary for the purpose of regulating rates, when applicable. The City shall have the right, relative to rate regulation of cable service provided by SCA to establish forms for all reports, determine the time for reports and the frequency with which any reports are to be made, and require that any reports be made under oath.

D. The City shall have the right relating to cable service provided by SCA, when necessary for the purposes of regulating rates, if applicable, to require that all contracts or arrangements between SCA and any affiliated interest be in writing and that copies be filed with the City.

E. The City may, at any time, make reasonable inquiries concerned with the management and affairs of the SCA System. SCA shall respond to such inquiries on a timely basis.

F. SCA shall provide the following reports:

- (1) Quarterly reports to be furnished 90 days after end of calendar quarter:
 - (a) Gross revenues and the basis for calculation of franchise fee.
- (2) Annually by April 30:
 - (a) Copies of audited financial statements of income, assets, and liabilities.
 - (b) Summary of operations certified by SCA officer: number of subscribers by class, connects and disconnects, miles of trunk and distribution, homes passed.
 - (c) Future plans: rate changes, service changes, possible introduction of new features, services, or new technology.
 - (d) Description of investment and property installed by type and account number and cost.
 - (e) Ownership report, showing partners or major stockholders or parents holding 5% or more of stock or ownership.
 - (f) Copies of petitions, applications, and non routine communications with FCC, SEC, or other state or federal regulatory agency having jurisdiction over matters affecting system or this franchise.

Section 3. Franchise Fee

A. SCA acknowledges that the streets, alleys, easements, and rights-of-way of the City to be used by SCA in the operation of this system within the boundaries of the City are valuable public properties acquired and maintained by the City at great expense to its taxpayers. The grant to SCA for the use of its streets is a valuable property right without which SCA would be required to

invest substantial capital in right-of-way costs and acquisitions; therefore, SCA shall pay the City an amount equal to three percent (3%) per annum of SCA's gross annual revenue from all sources attributable to the operations within the confines of the City. This payment shall be in addition to any other tax or payment levied or required by the City from SCA.

B. Nothing in this Article shall limit the fees, taxes, and charges required by this franchise for other permitted purposes or costs, but this fee shall include the amount of tax, fee, or assessment imposed by the City on SCA or its cable subscribers solely because of their status as such. The term "franchise fee" does not include bonds, security funds, letter of credit, insurance, indemnification, penalties, liquidated damages or other requirements which are necessary to the enforcement of this franchise. The franchise fee shall be in addition to any tax, fee, or assessment imposed on other persons as well as on cable operators or cable subscribers.

C. The franchise fee shall be payable quarterly to the City, and SCA shall file a detailed, verified statement of all gross receipts within the City during the period for which the payment is made. The payment shall be made to the City not later than ninety (90) days after the expiration of SCA's fiscal quarter. The City shall have the right to inspect SCA records and to audit and recompute any amounts determined to be owed; provided, however, that such audit shall be initiated within thirty-six (36) months following the submission of the report. Additional amount due as a result of the audit shall be paid within thirty (30) days following written notice to SCA. The notice shall include a copy of the audit report or findings of the recomputation. Costs of any independent audit or special accounting shall be charged to SCA if the audit finds the actual amount due to be higher than the amount paid.

D. The acceptance of any payment required by the City shall not be construed as an acknowledgement that the amount paid is the correct amount due, nor shall acceptance of payment be construed as a release of any claim which the City may have for additional sums due and payable. Fee payments shall be subject to audit by the City or its appointed agents, and additional assessment or refund shall be made if the payment is found to be in error. In the event that such an audit or audits result in an assessment by, and an additional payment to the City, the additional payment shall be subject to interest at the rate of eighteen percent (18%) per year from the date on which the said original payment was due and payable.

Section 4. SCA Rules and Regulations

SCA shall have the authority to promulgate such rules, regulations, terms and conditions governing the conduct of its business as shall be reasonably necessary to enable SCA to exercise its rights and perform its obligations under this franchise, and to assure uninterrupted service to each and all of its customers. Provided, however, that such rules, regulations, terms and conditions shall not be in conflict with the provisions of applicable State and Federal laws, rules and regulations. If such rules, regulations, terms, and conditions are maintained in written form, SCA shall provide copies to City.

Section 5. Compliance with State and Federal Laws

Notwithstanding any other provisions of this franchise to the contrary, SCA shall at all times comply with all laws and regulations of the state and federal government or any of its administrative agencies. Provided, however, that if any such state or federal law or regulation shall require SCA to perform any service, or shall permit SCA to perform any service, or shall prohibit SCA from performing any service in conflict with the terms of this franchise or of any laws or regulations of the City, then SCA shall notify the City of the conflict believed to exist between such regulation or law and the laws or regulations of the City or this franchise.

If the City determines that a material provision of this ordinance is affected by subsequent actions of the state or federal government, the City and SCA shall have the right to modify provisions to such extent necessary to be in compliance with all laws and to carry out the full intent and purpose of this franchise.

ARTICLE V. TRANSFER, TERMINATION AND REMOVAL.

Section 1. Transfer of Franchise

Any such franchise shall be based on the qualifications of SCA, and cannot in any event be sold, transferred, leased, assigned or disposed of, in whole or in part, either by forced or involuntary sale, merger, consolidation or otherwise without prior consent of the City Council expressed by resolution, and then only under such conditions as may be prescribed herein. The consent of the City will not be unreasonably withheld; provided, however, the proposed Assignee must show financial responsibility and must agree to comply with all provisions of this ordinance, and provided, further that no such consent shall be required for a transfer in trust, mortgage, or other hypothecation as a whole, to secure an indebtedness.

Section 2. Termination

A. In addition to all other rights and powers retained by the City under this franchise or otherwise, and the City reserves the right to forfeit and terminate the franchise and all rights and privileges of SCA in the event of a substantial breach of material terms and conditions. SCA shall not be excused by mere economic hardship nor by misfeasance or malfeasance of its directors, officers or employees.

B. In the event that the City decides to initiate procedures to terminate this franchise pursuant to this Article V, the City shall make a written demand that SCA comply with any such provision, rule, order, or determination under or pursuant to this franchise. If the violation by SCA continues for a period of thirty (30) days following such written demand without written proof that the corrective action has been taken or is being actively and expeditiously pursued, the City may place the issue of termination of the franchise before the City Council. The City shall cause to be served upon SCA, at least twenty (20) days prior to the date of such City Council meeting, a written notice of intent to request such termination and the time and place of the meeting. Public notice shall be given of the meeting and issue which the City Council is to consider.

C. The City Council shall hear and consider the issue and shall hear any person interested, and shall determine in a reasonable manner whether or not any violation by SCA has occurred and whether the violation has been cured.

D. If the City Council finds that the violation by SCA has occurred and that the violation has not been cured, the City Council may, by resolution, declare that the franchise of SCA shall be forfeited and terminated. SCA retains all rights to challenge such termination in the appropriate court of law.

Section 3. Renewal

This franchise may be renewed in accordance with the terms of the Cable Communications Policy Act of 1984 as amended from time to time.

Section 4. City Right to Negotiate to Purchase System

In the event SCA forfeits or the City terminates the franchise pursuant to provisions in Section 2, Article V of this franchise, the City reserves the right to enter into negotiations for the purchase of the cable communications system, and applicable provisions of the Cable Communications Act (Section 627, Conditions of Sale) shall apply, but such right shall not be interpreted to exclude other parties from simultaneously entering into the negotiations for purchase of the cable system.

Section 5. Removal of Cable Television System

At the expiration of the term for which this franchise is granted, or any renewal, or upon its termination as provided, SCA may be required, upon notice by City to remove at its own expense all designated portions of the cable television system from all streets and public property within the City. If SCA fails to do so, City may perform the work at SCA's expense. A bond shall be furnished by SCA in an amount sufficient to cover this expense.

ARTICLE VI. EFFECT DATE

Passed and approved on the first reading this 1st day of February 1988 A.D.

APPENDIX Technical Requirements

I. Technical Standards

The system will operate and be maintained to meet the highest standards required by law.

A. Standards:

The standards required by the city for all classes of video signals shall be as follows:

B. Tests

(1) SCA shall test the system in accordance with FCC recommended procedures good industry engineering practices. Tests will be conducted at 10 locations in the system.

(a) Four at the end of the largest cascade in each of East, West, North and South directions from center.

(b) Six random locations in the City.

(2) Compliance with performance specifications shall be determined from measurements and tests applied to the worst case, e.g. the signal received by the farthest subscriber, including distribution system and largest super trunk effort.

Meese uses FBI plane 40 times

WASHINGTON (AP) — Congressional investigators have learned that Attorney General Edwin Meese III is a frequent flier on FBI executive aircraft, but the bureau won't say where he goes or what he does.
Rep. Glenn English, D-Okla., who is directing an inquiry into Meese's use of FBI aircraft, says the secrecy raises concern that the administration may be trying "to keep embarrassing information from public view."
English also says that from what he's learned so far, it appears at least some of Meese's travel may have violated President Reagan's mandate to fly on commercial airlines when it is cheaper for taxpayers.

At English's request, the General Accounting Office, the investigative wing of Congress, asked the FBI to supply flight logs showing where its aircraft had flown and who had been aboard.
The request was part of a larger review by the English-chaired Government Operations subcommittee on government information, justice and agriculture to determine whether the VIP aircraft owned by various federal agencies could be put to better use in the war on drugs.

See specialist about blisters

DEAR DR. GOTT: I have been getting blisters on the edges of my eyelids for years, and lately they have been getting worse. Now I'm noticing them on my 3-year-old son. What are they and what can I do about them?
DEAR READER: From the information given, I am unable to diagnose the condition that you describe. Various viral skin afflictions come immediately to mind as a diagnosis in any person with recurrent crops of skin blisters, yet this must be substantiated by medical examination and testing. I suggest that you make an ap-

pointment for you and your son with an ophthalmologist at a time when the blisters are present. This way, you may be able to discover a cause for the blisters.

DEAR DR. GOTT: In a recent column you gave some advice to a woman who wanted to pay for a friend's liver transplant, and you said that Medicare or the hospital would pick up the bill. Surely you jest! Two hospitals told us to raise \$200,000 up front before they would even consider my son for a transplant. He was already on Medicare, but our state only allows 12 days hospitalization a year. So please be a little more realistic in your advice.

DEAR READER: Fair point. I should have mentioned the tremendous variation from state to state with respect to medical reimburse-

ment. There are some government-funded medical plans that would pay a major part of the enormous cost of organ transplantation; on the other hand, many state/federal agencies would not. The pattern of coverage is inconsistent.

Many hospitals do require that funds be raised in advance before a transplant will be done. However, I must add that hospitals and doctors do play a vital role in the financing of organ transplants because most hospitals and doctors will, on a case-by-case basis, perform charity work. Of course, this varies from institution to institution. However, I continue to believe that the U.S. health system is flexible enough to permit lifesaving and expensive treatment to be made available to appropriately screened needy patients.


