

In striking at widespread apathy toward our public schools, Dr. Wallace intimated that both keen interest and generous support from the public's pocketbook will be necessary to mould and maintain an adequate and intelligent system of public schools.

"Our greatest opportunity," he observed, "is to learn and grow. Wealth can accumulate and people can decay."
