## Workbench Glamor For Class Misfits

Serious thinkers have been stroking their beards thoughtfully of late and crying that the great American middle class is being squeezed almost to death by the pressure of hard times. What they fail to add is that the great middle class has just been asking for it by taking into its bosom a great many people who would be happier and more prosperous elsewhere.

This fact was neatly touched on recently by the publicist, William Feather in an article in Nation's Business.

In spite of unemployment, says Mr. Feather, the nation today suffers from an acute shortage of skilled workers, and the shortage is going to be even more acute in the near future. And why? Because the average ambitious high school lad of today has his heart set on a dignified white collar job, and scorns the prospect of being an expert turret lathe operator, a first-class pattern maker, a skilled machinist or anything else that requires manual labor.

It isn't the ambitious high school lad's fault. We have glorified the white collar man, as Mr. Feather remarks, we have taught the young chap to look forward to a career rather than a job. He feels that it would somehow be disgraceful for him to wear overalls.

The result of all this is that the swollen middle class is jammed with people who simply can't make a decent living in their chosen occupations.

We have penalized young lawyers who wait with desperate anxiety for the practice that never materializes; hopeful young dentists who can find no teeth to fill; salesmen by the score and the gross who skimp along on a hand to mouth basis, a scant jump ahead of the sheriff; clerks who get along on day laborer's pay; and a whole army of luckless mortals who try half a dozen jobs in the course of a decade, succeeding in none of them and eternally driven by the haunting fear of poverty.

Yet all the while the skilled lack men, and the skilled worker goes along happily and comfortably on an income that would look like very heaven to these harassed white collar misfits.

What's the answer? Mr. Feather suggests, simply, that we devise uniforms to take the place of overalls; and before you start laughing, just consider the prestige which a neat uniform gives to the jobs it goes with.

We have an abundance of good technical high schools to prepare boys for the skilled trades. It would be a fine thing if we could find some way—whether Mr. Feather's or some other—to show young men that the white collar is not the only badge of distinction in this country.

Maybe the uniforms would do it. Maybe a universal return to common sense would. Whatever the solution, it is high time we found it.

## Poverty to End of Time

From the Bonham Favorite:

"What mass poverty needs is prevention," says a newspaper writer. But the way to prevent poverty is not pointed out.

There is a way to prevent mass poverty, but it is not by legislation. Somebody in every age has dreamed about abolishing poverty. Many efforts have been made, many plans suggested and a few adopted. But poverty is still with us. It will be with us until the end of time, unless a way is found to completely change the lazy into the energetic, the spendthrift into the saver, the profligate into the thrifty, the prodigal into the penitent, the pleasure lover into the self-denier.

Just as long as a majority, or even a sizeable minority of men and women are willing to spend more than they earn, willing to rest when duty demands action, willing to feast today and let tomorrow take care of its own needs, willing to shirk their responsibilities and depend on others to supply their needs, just that long will poverty grip many.

Legislation can't abolish poverty; perhaps it may mitigate some of the evils of poverty, perhaps it may aid the worthy poor and the unfortunate, but it may also create more poverty than it relieves.

The dream that poverty can be abolished, without remaking the majority of the poor is an idle dream. Most poverty (except that caused by misfortunes), is the direct result of want of energy, or judgment, or ability—and legislation can cure none of these.

## Why Wait For Safety?

Reports from drivers license examinations reveal that poor vision is one of the most common defects found in those seeking license to drive an automobile in Texas. The percentage of motorists found with defective vision is rather high. In most instances the drivers had no previous knowledge of their defects but in many cases they knew of their weakness but had neglected remedying it.

As a result motorists of Texas have faced unnecessary hazards. We must continue to face many such hazards until April, 1939, when all motorists will be required to pass the examination.

That is the greatest weakness of the new drivers license law. It postpones the date of effectiveness too long, and allows those who are not properly equipped to operate a motor vehicle use of the highways too long. Most of us can qualify for driving by having glasses fitted, etc., and there is no reason we should not do it now, rather than wait until April of 1939.

## Filthy Rest Rooms Menace Health Status

Filthy rest rooms used by the public at Texas cafes, taverns, filling stations and retail establishments are a menace to the health of the community and the state, and cannot be further tolerated, it was announced this week by Dr. Geo. W. Cox, State Health Officer.

"The State Health Department at this time serves warning to all concerned that public rest rooms must be maintained in a sanitary manner under penalty of violation of the State Food and Drug Law, Article 695, which carries a fine of not less than ten nor more than one hundred dollars," Dr. Cox stated.

"Disease breeds in such places when they are allowed to be filthy and disease is spread from one person to another indiscriminately, under such conditions. Facilities should be available for washing the hands; toilets must be sanitary and kept that way. The rest room that does not meet adequate sanitary requirements is a reflection on the establishment which it serves and should be so interpreted.

"We ask the citizenship of Texas to join us in this campaign to clean up rest rooms that are filthy. Such conditions as are now prevalent throughout the state will not be tolerated any longer. When you find a rest room that is unsanitary, report that fact to the management and your local health authorities. If the management takes no steps to clean up its rest room, you are advised to withdraw your patronage from that establishment in the interest of protection to your health.

"To Texas business concerns, the State Health Department issues a warning to clean up their rest rooms and keep them clean. A court charge for them if they do not comply. To the citizens of Texas we ask that you demand of the establishments which you patronize, a clean rest room as protection to your health. It is your right. See that you have it recognized so and maintained."

## New Industry Started In Rio Grande Valley

Down in Elsa, Hidalgo County, Texas, a new industry the offspring of the Lower Rio Grande Valley's gigantic citrus investment of \$125,000,000, has started production.

The first citrus meal ever made in the Rio Grande Valley was produced recently at the large dehydration plant of the Engelman Gardens Citrus Association.

The citrus meal, after being processed to make it palatable for livestock, may be used as feed. It is now a regularly quoted commodity on feed markets.

Citrus peel, which heretofore had been a troublesome problem for valley citrus juicing plants, was fed into the dehydrating equipment, where, within a few minutes, all moisture was removed. The peel was cut into small pieces and sacked. It had appearance of prepared breakfast food, but was bitter to taste.

Formerly juice plants were required to haul the peel away and dispose of it. Many growers dumped it between tree rows where it was plowed under as a fertilizer.

**1938 To Be Big Aviation Year**

A lot of flying over the world's ocean will be done in 1938, and much of it frankly could be labeled "window dressing."

At least seven nations will establish new trade routes, enmeshing the globe in a tangle of airways.

This new-born economic warfare among the powers, with the long-range airplane, a weapon gradually reaching mature growth involves national prestige almost as much as trade.

This country and Great Britain have the advantage of priority in the transoceanic flying field. France is lagging, but has announced plans for coming abreast of competition.

Germany plans to augment its airplane service across the South Atlantic, and its dirigible flights to both American continents, with flying boat schedules to the United States.

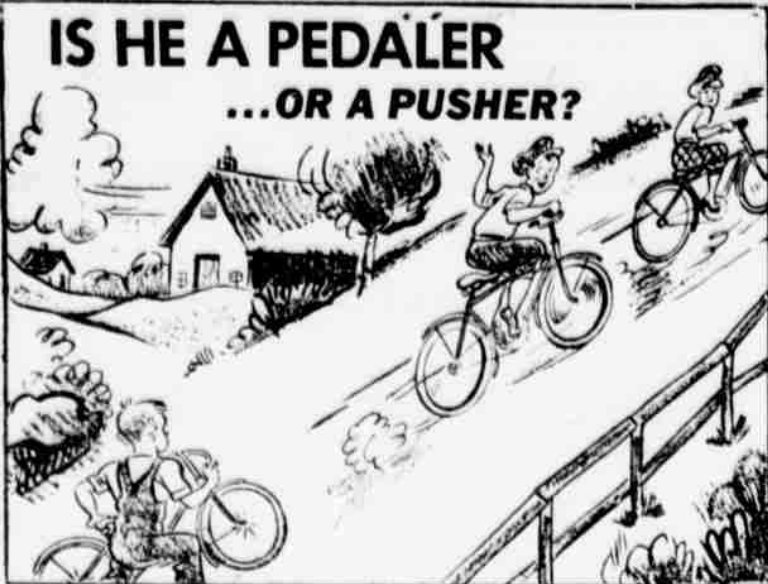

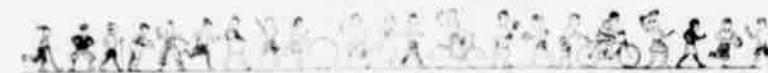

Slow Cooking Adds Tenderness to Roast

The various studies carried on by the Division of Rural Home Research and from which recent findings will be briefly reported here, classify under Food and Nutrition, or Textiles and Clothing, or Family Economics, three of the five broad subject matter decisions which comprise home economics. Dr. Cover's experiments with cooking "paired roasts" (corresponding cuts from right and left side of the same carcass) have indicated that tenderness is influenced more by length of cooking time than by over temperature. In general, the longer the cooking time the more tender the roast. The results were the same in the paired roasts cooked to the same degree of doneness whether one was cooked at a high temperature, the other at a low, or both were cooked at the same low oven temperature, one roast having skewers stuck in it to shorten the cooking time and the other without skewers. The unskewered slower-cooked roast was the more tender of the pair. The housewife is therefore advised that using slow cooking for roasts will increase her chances for having them tender when served.

Pressure cookers for home use are not usually equipped with thermometers and one of the most troublesome points in using them is to know when "live steam" is being produced so that it is safe to close the pet cock. From tests conducted in our laboratory with pressure cookers, each equipped with a thermometer as well as a gauge a practical rule for the housewife has been formulated. Heat the cooker quickly so that while the pet cock is still open the gauge will register a pressure of 1-2 lb. to 1 lb. The temperature inside the cooker will then be above boiling and "live steam" present. This rule should replace the one that housewives have been accustomed to use, that of closing the pet cock after so many minutes of heating.

Contrary to the satisfactory practice of immersing the usual pieces of cured meats, as hams and sides of bacon in cottonseed oil to prevent mold, tests made by the Divisions of Swine Husbandry and Rural Home Research cooperating with sliced bacon packed in cottonseed oil in various containers have proven unsatisfactory. The slices were hard to handle and appearance, texture, and flavor were not desirable. Therefore packing the large pieces of meat in oil remains the recommended procedure.

Following the observation made several years ago that the use of tea and coffee tended to crowd milk out of the diet of Texas school children 10 to 13 years of age. Among 8 children the effect of drinking a large glass of medium strength tea with lemon juice and sugar in it was strikingly similar to the effect of drinking cold lemonade having the same amount of lemon juice and sugar. Perhaps tea and coffee, which contain no food value in themselves, have been too severely damned for causing the body to expend energy for which no fuel is supplied to compensate. Still, permitting tea and coffee to crowd milk out of a child's diet cannot be too severely condemned.

Desirable roasts for lambasting the season of fresh consumption have been demonstrated by a cooperative study just completed by our Division and that of Horticulture. Cucumbers wrapped individually in moisture proof cellophane, or packed unwrapped in shipping containers lined with the cellophane or placed in wrapped in a refrigerator humidifier, and stored at a temperature of 42 to 44 degrees F. remained firm at least 8 days, practically as desirable as freshly harvested fruits. For 2 weeks most of them were quite acceptable though not in choice condition. The consumer may derive increased dietary satisfaction and grower and distributor increased profits from the lengthening of the season of this highly seasonal vegetable. Perhaps the method might be successfully employed with other perishable vegetables.

Wilt in cotton plants appears to be associated with a higher percentage of immature fibers and with less strength of fibers, as found by Miss Grimes in preliminary tests in connection with her study of physical characteristics of cotton fibers. This calls attention to the importance of the health of the plant in producing fibers with desirable characteristics.

School children of 6 to 18 years in San Antonio have been found to wear a weight of indoor clothing, exclusive of shoes and wraps, ranging from 4 oz to 4 3/4 lbs., amounts in marked contrast to the estimated weight of 3 1/2 or 4 lbs. to 7 1/2 to 8 lbs. 60 years old. Marked variation in the weight of clothing worn at different times by the same child, regardless of season, was the rule. No reliable averages could be derived and no safe guess can be made for the weight of clothing any child may wear on a given day. Since many schools include in their health programs weighing the pupils at regular intervals, it is highly important that the weight of the clothing at the time of weighing be known, since variation in clothing weight may entirely conceal the true change in body weight, especially if weighing is done at intervals of a month or less. The Texas Home Economics Assoc., with Miss Grimes of our Division as chairman of the Standardization committee, has just completed a study of 1500 labels from textile and food products bought in Texas. Not one label was ideal in the information it gave, and only 10 per cent gave the size in two or three essential points. In general these products carrying the most information were the most satisfactory. It would doubtless be to the advantage of the consumer, manufacturer and merchant, if products were labeled adequately and accurately.

Early Hatched Chicks Bring Extra Profits

Poultry prices over the state will be increased by some 40 million baby chicks during the next few months, according to Geo. P. McCarthy, poultryman of the Texas A. and M. College Extension Service. Purchasers of baby chicks can realize extra profits by buying early and by securing chicks from nearby hatcheries, McCarthy said. Early hatched chicks are available in a higher priced market than those hatched after March 15, he said, but the difference in price is more than made up by other benefits. Early chicks grow off faster and cockers from this group find a better market as fryers. There is also usually less loss from disease, especially in the case of acidosis.

Pullet from early hatched stock come into production earlier and lay more during the late summer, fall, and winter when eggs are relatively high, he pointed out.

Many Texans feel that they can purchase chicks of higher quality if they order from distant states. It is far better to buy chicks from hatcheries where products are known than to depend on the reputation of out of state operators, according to McCarthy.
