

# Fisher County Stock Show Grosses Kids Over \$50,000

The Fisher County Jr. Livestock Show Premium Sale saw 86 animals go through, grossing exhibits over \$50,000, a sale record.

The show had 5 pairs of broilers, 4 pairs of fryer rabbits, 62 market hogs, 39 lambs, 2 heifers and 34 steers exhibited.

Volume buyers in the Premium Sale was Terry Gin of Roby spending over \$2,800. Other buyers

spending near the \$2,000 dollars mark were First National Bank of Rotan, Rotan Insurance Agency, Farm Tractor & Service of Rotan and Jim Wilburn of Sweetwater.

26 head of steers averaged above the 90 cent mark, 20 lambs averaged 2.05 per pound and 33 hogs near the \$1.00 mark.

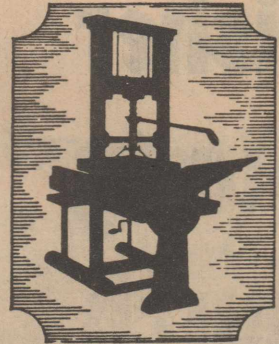

## County Gins Reach 22,742 Bales

The seven Fisher County gins ginned 1,577 bales from Jan. 3 through Jan. 10. The 1,577 bales brings the total amount of bales ginned to 22,742 which is 97% of the projected seasons total.

The Rotan Gin was first in bales ginned from Jan. 3-Jan. 10 with 513 and remains in first place in total bales for the season with 8,061. Terry Gin ginned 419 bales during the past week which brings their total amount for the season to 4,159. The 4,159 bales shows Terry Gin to be in second place in total bales ginned.

Third place belongs to Hobbs Gin with a total of 3,756 bales ginned for the season. They ginned 181 ales last week. Farmers Union Coop Gin ginned 36 bales which brings their total to 2256 and is fourth place of the seven Fisher

County Gins. Fifth place belongs to Farmers Gin of Rotan with a total of 1,890 bales for the season and 80 bales for the past week. Longworth Gin remains in sixth place with 292 bales for the past week and 1,724 for the season.

Seventh place belongs to the Sylvester Gin which

showed 76 bales ginned during the past week and

has a total for the season of 896.

### Paper Subscription Deadline Fri.

This Friday, January 13th is the deadline for renew-

ing subscriptions to the Roby Star Record-Rotan Advance for the year 1984, according to Kim Pease, Editor.

When the newspaper converted to using a computerized mailing list approximately two years ago, it moved the subscription renewal time up to January 1, on most subscriptions.

"We ask all subscribers to check the expiration date on the top line of their

mailing label this week", said Pease. "If we have not extended your subscription to 1/85 and you have sent in your 1984 renewal, please let us know" he continued.

Subscription rates have not increased in the past 2 years. The 1984 renewal price for residents of Fisher and surrounding counties is \$9.50; other Texas counties-\$10.00 and for out state subscribers \$11.00.

The terms of Gene Tabb, Billy Wayne Jeffrey and

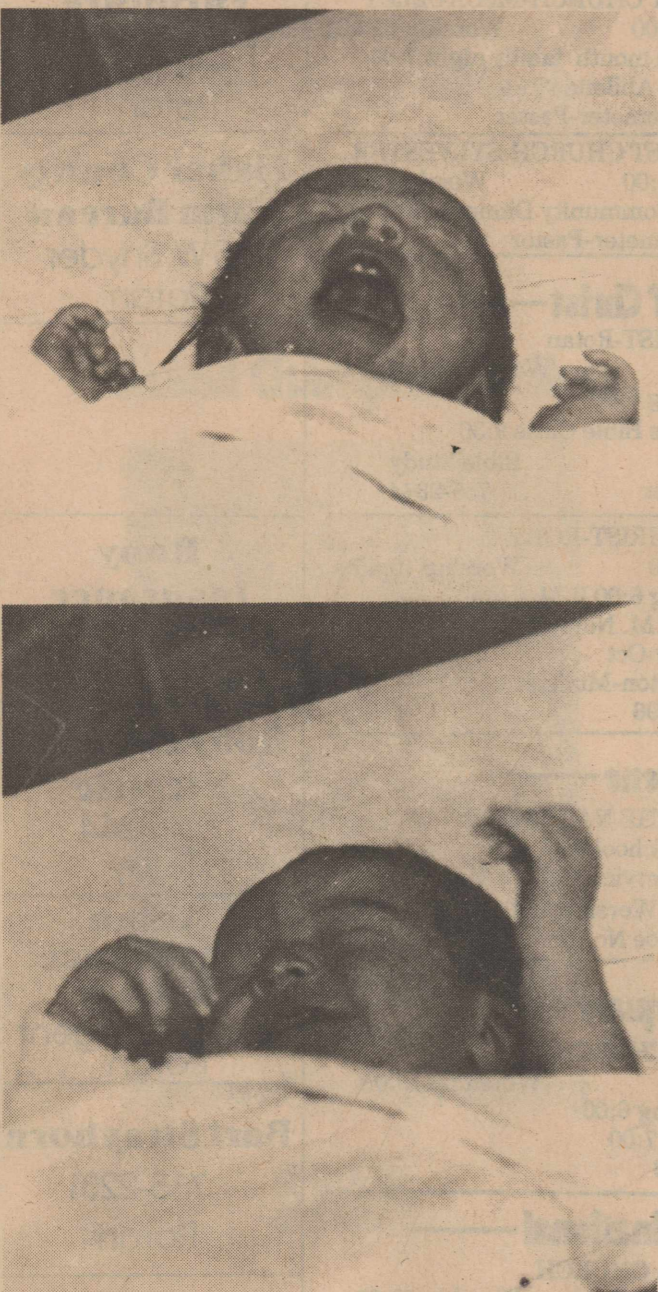
David Hill expire this year.

### IRREVOCABLE LIVING TRUSTS

(Big Words With Big Savings)

Just what is an irrevocable living trust and why have they become so popular?

The "irrevocable" part simply means you cannot change your mind and take back assets which you have placed in this trust. Once you have made the transfer, you have no control over the assets nor are you entitled to any of the income or benefits generated by the assets.

3. Transfers to the trust may be subject to gift taxes.
4. There is an expense involved in creating and operating the trust.

### Read Romans 5:1-5

By [Christ] also we have access by faith into this grace wherein we stand. —Romans 5:2 (KJV)

OUR minister was not what some would call a great preacher, but he had living relationships with people young and old alike. Literally hundreds of people had one of his poems, sent as birthday greetings, framed and hanging on the wall of their living rooms. He showed them how accessible God's grace is.

The word *access* is still worth a double underlining, because God's grace is available to us all today.

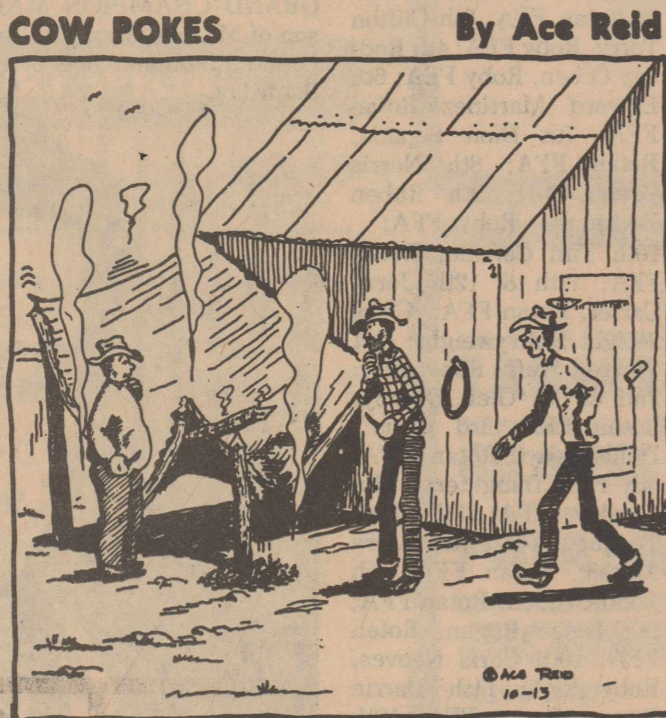

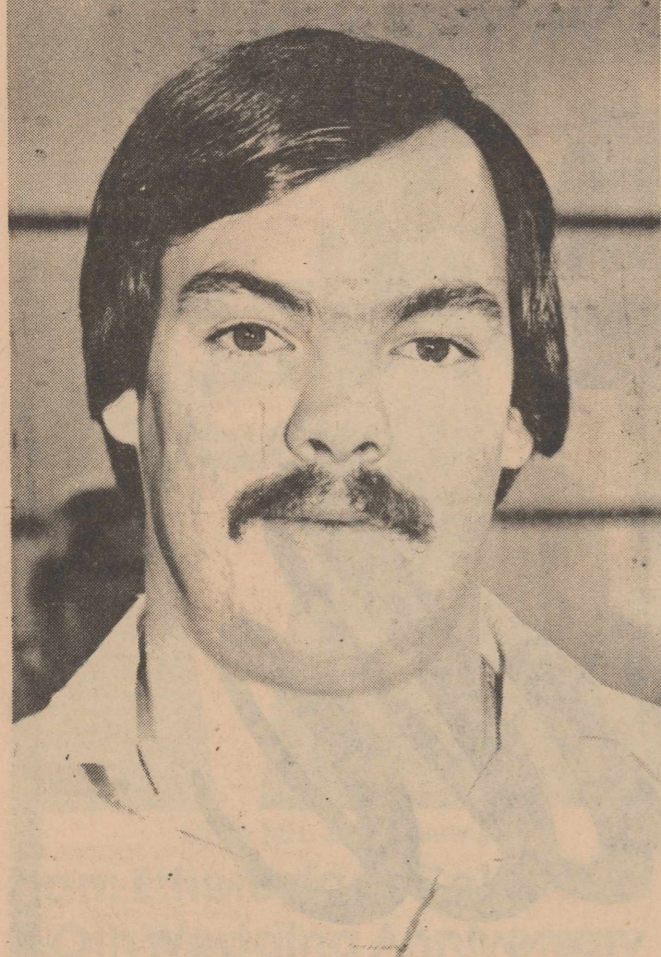

### WTU Beginning Refund Procedure

New rates for West Texas Utilities Co.'s retail customers have received final approval of the Public Utility Commission of Texas, and are now in effect.

The rates are designed to provide an annual revenue increase of \$11.97 million. The company, in its rate request filed last June 10, had asked for \$26.5 million.

Although the change means a 5.2 per cent increase in total retail rates, the current effect will be a decrease for customers who have been paying temporary rates the past 2 1/2 months.

WTU had started collected interim rates, as allowed by law, on Oct. 22 from all customers except those in 30 towns whose cases had been appealed to the PUC.

Because the final rates approved by the PUC are lower than the temporary rates, WTU will refund the difference plus interest. This will be done by crediting customer bills and should be accomplished during February and March.

Cash refunds will be mailed to customers who have moved off WTU lines or transferred to towns where the interim rates were not in effect. These checks will be sent to the customer's last known address.

If these customers have not received refunds by April 1, they should contact their former local WTU office. Amount of refunds will

vary according to the size of the customer bills. For example, for a customer using 1,000 kilowatt-hours of electricity a month, the difference would be \$4.34.

At this rate, his refund for the entire period would amount to about \$12.

Refunds will be made to all customers served by WTU during the period from Oct. 22 to Jan. 6, except those who live in the city limits of the following towns:

Alpine Aspermont, Balmorea, Bronte, Clyde, Cross Plains, Dodson, Estelline, Hawley, Iraan, Jayton, Junction, Lawn, Lueders, Marfa, Memphis, Menard, Merkel, Miles, Presidio, Putnam, Quitaque, Rankin, Santa Anna, Shamrock, Sonora, Sterling City, Turkey, Fuscola and Valentine.

None of the rate changes apply in the City of Vernon, where WTU's rates are kept the same as those of the city's municipal system and already are higher than those in the remainder of the system.
