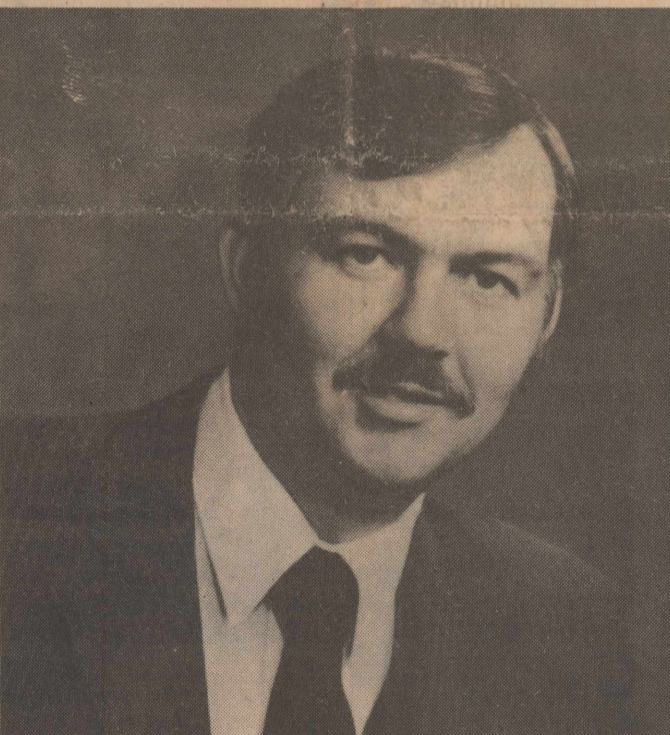

Steve Carriker Goes To Bat For Area Farmers

A bill by State Representative Steve Carriker (D-Roby) ensuring the right of farmers to move tractors on Texas roads passed the Legislature on Wednesday. The right of farmers to use public roads to move from field to field was jeopardized after federal action in 1982 that restricted the allowable width of vehicles.

"Texas was required to pass legislation to conform to the federal standards or risk losing highway dollars," Carriker said. "But some State Highway Department people were interpreting the Texas statute to mean that the roads should be off-limits to tractors and that farmers should be required to buy permits to get access to roadways."

Carriker then went to Highway Commission Chairman Robert Lanier and insisted that neither the federal government

nor the Texas Legislature had ever intended such a prohibition.

"Bob Lanier immediately went to bat for farmers and ordered Highway Department officials to consider tractors exempt from width restrictions. His order gave farmers relief until the Legislature could act on my bill," said Carriker. "The Texas Farm economy would grind to a halt with such a road restriction, and it was absolutely essential that we clarify the statute. We couldn't afford to risk having farmers ordered off the roads."

Senator Ray Farabee (D-Wichita Falls) carried the Carriker bill in the Senate, and it has been sent to the Governor for his signature.

"Governor White helped us protect tractor rights in 1983, so I fully expect him to sign the bill," Carriker said.

Dee Ann Montez Selected To Compete In Texas Miss T.E.E.N. Pageant

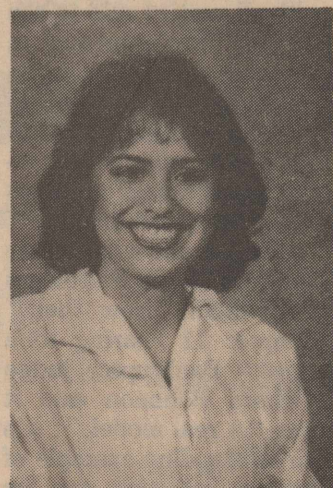

PARTNERSHIP, YES OR NO?

Before you jump into a business partnership, consider the pros and cons. Partnerships include joint ventures of all kinds, including closely-held corporations where two or more parties are involved.

There seem to be only two good reasons for having a partner. The most common reason is money. Some business ventures simply take more money than one individual can muster. The second reason, technical expertise, is still related to reason number one. If I need certain technical talent in my business and cannot afford to hire it, I may need to take that person on as a partner. Since many small businesses will never be profitable enough to justify two owners, it would be nice to avoid the partnership at the outset.

All partnerships are destined to terminate. Although some partnerships survive until one partner's retirement, most partnerships fail within a year or two. Ninety-four out of a hundred new businesses fail within the first five years. The mortality rate for partnerships is even greater.

If a partnership can't be avoided, make sure your partnership agreement covers what will happen when the partnership terminates.

Since many partnership terminations take place under hostile conditions, the partnership agreement should be well written. Your attorney has a good checklist of the provisions which should be spelled out in your partnership agreement.

People entering a business partnership are too amiable to see the trouble spots ahead. They need a devil's advocate when writing their partnership agreement and should seek professional assistance.

If you haven't reviewed your insurance coverage in light of recent tax laws, you could find yourself seriously underprotected.

In years past, Uncle Sam would help you bear an uninsured loss. If a diamond ring was stolen, or a tree fell on the house, you'd have to carry the first \$100 of the loss yourself, but you could deduct the rest from income on your tax return.

Now the "floor" on casualty and theft losses is 10 percent of adjusted gross income, PLUS that \$100, before you can deduct anything. And if you are subject to the alternative minimum tax, the effect is even worse.

Now it makes sense to insure just about everything worth stealing, and to up your coverage sufficiently to cover home, auto, or other holdings; if premiums are a problem, it's cost-efficient to increase deductibles.

Don't wait for the NEXT tax law change to review your policies. It's a good bet it won't be any more liberal.
