Rotan Yellowhammer Football Team Taking Measures To Improve Team For Coming Year

Next years Rotan Yellowhammer football players have already started taking some serious measures to improve their squad. According to Richard Gorman, head football coach and athletic director, the "thirty-six freshmen, sophomores and juniors have had a very good off-season program this year."

Gorman has implemented several motivational programs this year to improve team discipline. spirit, and physical fitness. Some of the programs include a two week superstar competition, a bench press weight club, and a player of the month award and has established a record board. superstars program consisted to 10 events to test strength, endurance and speed. Winners in the superstars events include: Vicente Ortega in the bench press with a lift of 270 lbs; John Pease in the obstacle course with a time of 23.85; Sammy Ramirez in the cones with a time of 6.04; Edward Martinez in the 40 yd. dash with a time of 4.71: Sammy Ramirez in the tire pull with a time of 5.73; Donnie Carl Gruben in a four lap race around the field in 3.59 minutes;

PARTNERSHIP, YES OR NO?

Before you jump into a business partnership, consider the pros and cons. Partnerships include joint ventures of all kinds, including closely-held corporations where two or more parties are involved.

There seem to be only two good reasons for having a partner. The most common reason is money. Some business ventures simply take more money than one individual can muster. The second reason, technical expertise, is still related to reason number one. If I need certain technical talent in my business and cannot afford to hire it, I may need to take that person on as a partner. Since many small businesses will never be profitable

enough to justify two owners, it would be nice to avoid the partnership at the outset. All partnerships are destined to terminate. Although some partnerships survive until one partner's retirement, most partnerships fail within a year or two. Ninety-four out of a hundred new businesses fail within

the first five years. The mortality rate for partnerships is If a partnership can't be avoided, make sure your partnership agreement covers what will happen when the

partnership terminates. Since many partnership terminations take place under hostile conditions, the partnership agreement should be well written. Your attorney has a good checklist of the provisions which should be spelled out in your partnership agreement.

People entering a business partnership are too amiable to see the trouble spots ahead. They need a devil's advocate when writing their partnership agreement and should seek professional assistance.

If you haven't reviewed your insurance coverage in light of recent tax laws, you could find yourself seriously underprotected.






