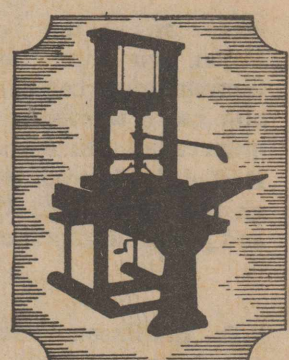

Dr. Bill Basansky Via Satellite At Maranatha Life Center

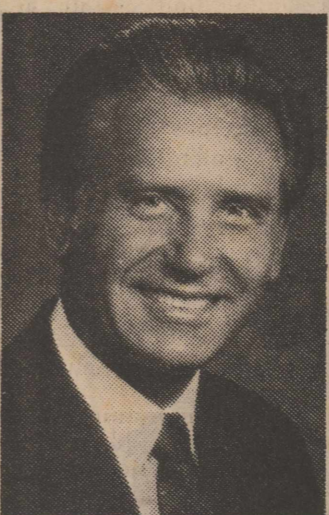

On his seventh birthday, my brother Jack scrambled out of bed at daybreak to look in the bedroom mirror. Suddenly he burst into tears. Because he was a year older, he had expected to be much taller. He was inconsolable because he had not outgrown his pajamas overnight. When he had recovered from his disappointment, Mother told Jack that if he wanted to grow he would have to eat all his meals, including fish, cabbage, rice pudding, and other foods he disliked. I smile when I recall Jack crying in front of the mirror, but it reminds me that if I am to grow as a Christian I cannot remain on a milk diet. I need solid, spiritual food. This means not just picking out the parts of the Bible I enjoy reading but absorbing all the biblical truths that will shape my life. It also involves feeding regularly every day instead of having one or two big meals on Sunday. My little brother had to learn that it takes time and good food to grow physically. I, too, have had to learn that it takes time and spiritual food to become a more mature Christian.

PRAYER: Loving God, grant us both the desire and the patience needed to become mature Christians. Amen.

Tax Planning

Nineteen eighty-five is already half gone and with it half of your opportunity to save by tax-wise financial action. Many tax planning steps are most uncertain because there are so many proposed changes that might occur. However, there are still a number of moves that can be safely made and are sure to reduce your tax bill if you give them enough time to work.

1. Your IRA contribution may be able to increase this year if the new tax bill goes through, but regardless it still will pay you to make at least the old maximum payment as early as possible.

2. If you can move assets by way of a trust or an outright gift to a lower taxed member of the family, then the interest or dividends from those assets paid between now and the end of the year will be taxed at the lower level.

3. If you can employ one of your dependents for the rest of the year or even only for the summer, the wages they earn if they directly reduce your farm or business profits will be taxed at a low level to them instead of at a high level to you or your company.

4. Major charitable contributions made now in July will earn interest for your chosen charity for the rest of the year, cutting your tax bill.

These are only a few of the many taxwise moves you can make using the remaining months of 1985. There are many opportunities already lost, but there are many still left. Your Tax Advisor will probably have many suggestions in addition to the above which will help you, even with this year's uncertain picture. Most of them take time to work and you should move promptly.
