## Cotton Ginning Underway 515 Bales Ginned In Week

Cotton gining in Fisher County got under way last week when Farmers Union Coop Gin began work on October 21. Other local gins also began ginning last week with Hobbs Gin cranking up on October 28, Rotan Gin on November 1, Longworth Gin on November 6 and Sylvester Gin on October 31. As of early this week a total of 515 bales of cotton were ginned. Indications are that this will be a good year for cotton harvest. While the first grades are not yet available all gins reported the cotton looked good.

When contacted they had cotton on the yard but one of their motors malfunctioned and needed to be repaired. Longworth Gin expected to be open yesterday morning. Farmers Gin has baled the most cotton to date with a total of 203 bales done. Sylvester has done 100 bales followed by Hobbs Gin at 98 bales, Farmers Union Coop Gin at 58 and Rotan Gin at 56 bales.



## Tax Planning

### TAX BITS AND PIECES

These items may be of interest to you as 1985 tax return filing time approaches.

1. The standard mileage deduction for business use of an automobile has just been increased by the IRS. For 1984 it was 20.5 cents per mile for the first 15,000 business miles driven. For 1985, it will be 21 cents a mile. The standard rate for business miles in excess of fifteen thousand will remain at 11 cents a mile. The deductible standard rate for using your car for charitable activities increases from 9 cents to 12 cents a mile for 1985.

2. If you have overdue government loans, any 1985 federal income tax refund you are due may be held back to cover the loan payments. This new program is part of a two-year test to have the IRS collect non-tax federal debts by withholding income tax refunds.

3. Effective January 1st, 1986, the interest rate that the IRS charges on overdue taxes and pays on overdue refunds will drop from 11% to 10%.

4. Though the business equipment recordkeeping rules were eased in 1985, taxpayers will still be required to provide information on their 1985 tax returns that they have not been asked before. This information for automobiles includes:

- the total number of miles driven during the year.
- the percentage of personal use claimed.
- whether the vehicle was used for commuting or not, and, if it was, the commuting distance.
- whether the vehicle was available for personal use in off-duty hours.
- whether another vehicle was available for personal use.
- whether adequate records or sufficient evidence exists to justify the deductions, and whether or not such evidence is written.

The Lions will end their season this Friday when they travel to Forsan, where they will play a strong and undefeated team.

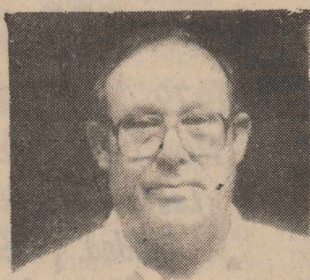

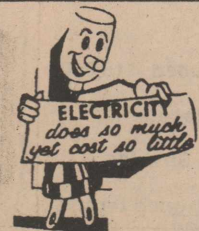

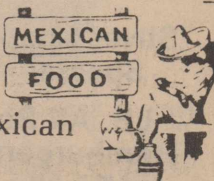

Thursday night is the night all the little ghosts and goblins will be out Trick or Treating, so watch out for them. Have a safe and Happy Halloween. See you next week.

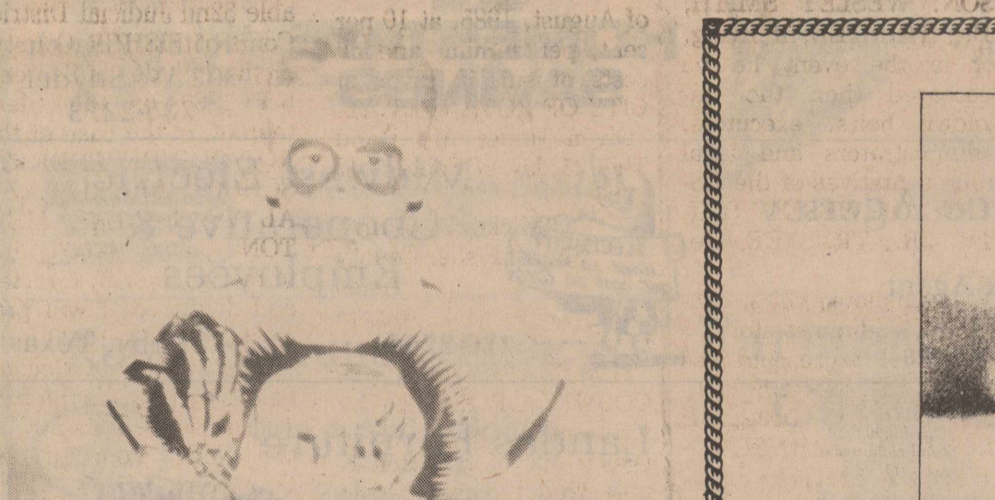
### Pink Ladies To Hold Monthly Meeting Nov. 13
