



Tax Planning By Gerald Rodgers CPA



TAX BITS AND PIECES

These items may be of interest to you as 1985 tax return filing time approaches.

1. The standard mileage deduction for business use of an automobile has just been increased by the IRS. For 1984 it was 20.5 cents per mile for the first 15,000 business miles driven. For 1985, it will be 21 cents a mile. The standard rate for business miles in excess of fifteen thousand will remain at 11 cents a mile. The deductible standard rate for using your car for charitable activities increases from 9 cents to 12 cents a mile for

2. If you have overdue government loans, any 1985 federal income tax refund you are due may be held back to cover the loan payments. This new program is part of a two-year test to have the IRS collect non-tax federal debts by withholding income tax refunds.

3. Effective January 1st, 1986, the interest rate that the IRS charges on overdue taxes and pays on overdue refunds will drop from 11% to 10%.

4. Though the business equipment recordkeeping rules were eased in 1985, taxpayers will still be required to provide information on their 1985 tax returns that they have not been asked before. This information for automobiles includes:

a. the total number of miles driven during the year. b. the percentage of personal use claimed.

c. whether the vehicle was used for commuting or not. and, if it was, the commuting distance.

d. whether the vehicle was available for personal use in off-duty hours. e. whether another vehicle was available for personal

f. whether adequate records or sufficient evidence

exists to justify the deductions, and whether or not such evidence is written.
