# **Sheriff Issues Warrant**

Fisher County Sheriff Mickey Counts has been notified of a "fraud type theft alledgedly involving a man representing a nonexistant insurance company" that may have caused a Fisher County couple to lose \$980.00, according

The incident began on December 5th with an initial contact by a lady setting up appointments over the phone for an agent to visit prospective policyholders concerning health insurance.

An appointment was set up with a Rotan couple The couple was visited by a person representing himself to be from Southwestern Service Life Insurance Company. "He had paperwork from the company in the form of handouts," said Counts.

The representative attempted to sell health insurance that was supposed to "pick-up and pay where Medicare left off," said Counts. He sold the local couple a policy of

On January 22nd, after failing to receive a policy from the company, the local couple contacted Sheriff Counts for assis-

The person alledgedly represented himself as T. Dean Simmons of Lub-Counts made a Dean Simmons of Lubbock. Counts made a check with Southwestern Service Life in Fort Worth and was informed that the individual was not an employee of the company.

Counts indicated that a similar type incident recently took place in Gorman, Texas. The individual in that instance was using the name Charles Ray Bone.

The check given by the Fisher County couple was made out to Southwestern Service Life Insurance Company, it was endorsed "Southwestern Service Life and Marketing", and cashed at a Slaton, Texas bank.

"We have issued a warrant for the arrest of T. Dean Simmons," according to Counts.

"One thing we want to make Fisher County residents aware of is, the method being used to apparently take advantage of elderly people," said Counts. He cautioned individuals to check with companies to make sure repre-



# Tax Planning By Gerald podgers CPA

ESTIMATED INCOME TAXES (Know a little more tax)

The average person doesn't need to be a tax specialist. Accounts are here to serve that need; they will see that all the niceties are taken care of so that you pay the least amount of tax under the current law. Nevertheless, you will get more value from your accountant's services if you are better acquainted with general tax concepts.

Many taxpayers are paying unnecessary penalties for underestimating their income taxes. Most people who work for a salary have an adequate amount of taxes paid in through withholding to eliminate "underestimating. penalties". Those taxpayers with income not subject to withholding such as rents, royalties, dividends, interest or self-employment business income may need to pay quarterly estimated taxes.

In general, you will not be subject to an underestimating penalty if you have paid in 80% of your taxes due on your current tax return. It's difficult to determine 80% of your tax liability when you don't know your annual income until the year is completed. Therefore, many taxpayers use a second allowable computation for avoiding penalties; this is 100% of the prior year's tax liability. If you pay 100% of last year's tax liability, you will not be penalized for underestimating even if your current year tax liability is larger than that amount.

If you file your tax return and pay the remaining taxes due by January 31, 1986, you are not required to make your fourth quarter estimate which otherwise is due

If you receive a penalty notice for underestimating your taxes, do not pay it without a close review. There are three computations available to all taxpayers which may avoid a penalty for underestimating.



Adding to the Rotan score were Helen Reese with five points, LaTonya Daniel with four and Shannon Bennett with three.


