Play it safe graduates. This is one of your elders talking, one who walked across the stage some 26 years ago. I was confident, excited, happy to have 12 years of formal education behind me and looking for a way to celebrate.

Things were no different then than they are now. It was the last chance to be involved in a "fling" with classmates-the ending of a happy period in our lives. Just as today-some of the more than 400 graduating seniors at my high school set up an all night "party" at a secluded area of a nearby lake-some 15 miles from our high school. I had planned to take part because many of my close friends were going to be there. Until the very last minutes-I was to be a part of that group at the all night party. I had driven to graduation exercises alone, ate alone at a restaurant before the exercises and apparently got ahead of something that didn't agree with me. After graduation, I went home, not because I wanted to, but through necessity. I was sick to my stomach.

The next morning, in the paper, I had an article brought to my attention by my Mother with the headline "Teenager Dies In Car Accident After Hitting Bridge". I missed the party, John Denagli didn't. He went to the event, apparently had a little too much to drink and failed to navigate a turn on the way home hitting a steel bridge and ending his life. It was sad. I will always remember the good times, but that one lost life overshadows every good time. I have thought a thousand times "what if". Now you ask yourself "what if?". You're special, this is a special time in your life and from one teenager that has been through it, one parent that is going through it, take a word of caution-play it safe on graduation night. John Denagli didn't think he was going to be the one in an accident, he didn't think he had too much to drink, he apparently thought he could navigate home safely.

I encourage you to find an alternative. Use your imagination-you can surely come up with some sort of celebration short of opening a 6-pack and getting bombed.

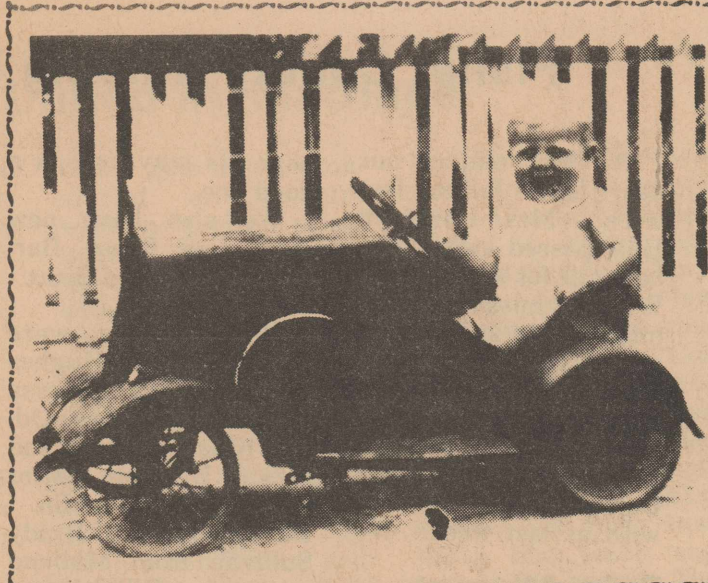

State Capital Highlights

Only a few days after Gov. Mark White agreed to fine-tune his education reforms, a Texas A&M poll showed him trailing his GOP opponent, former Gov. Bill Clements, by a 47-33 percent margin. Among independent voters, Clements leads White 52-21 percent with 27 percent undecided.

that Comptroller Bob Bullock is monitoring his progress on cutting state agency spending. Gov. White moved last week to renew the search for austerity. The governor asked agency heads and university presidents to review their budgets and meet his earlier call for 13 percent reductions.

Respondents favored White over Clements in public education policy 37-32 percent, but preferred Clements 40-13 on the issue of state taxes.

At the Capitol, observers watch a growing competition between White and Bullock over whether White's austerity program will resolve the projected \$1.3 billion deficit. No love is lost between the two rival staffs.

A few days earlier, White announced he would alter some of his controversial education reforms, but vowed not to change the hottest topic; the no-pass, no-play rule.

White, now on the campaign trail, says the austerity program will work, but Bullock won't let him make political hay without earning it. On the subject of state revenues, the expert Bullock is calling White's hand every step of the way.

He stopped short of saying he would abolish competency testing, a real sore point with career teachers.

White is keeping pressure on state agencies, but one reason is because Bullock is keeping the pressure on White to produce.

LAWSUIT OPPOSED
Last week, one of Texas' largest Hispanic groups voted not to support a teachers' group lawsuit which seeks to have the tests struck down for racial discrimination.

Perhaps the winner will be the taxpayer, if the competition does indeed result in a lower deficit.

"TWIN PLANTS" URGED
Black and Hispanic teachers scored lower than whites, but the League of United Latin American Citizens (LULAC) blasted the lawsuit as a "form of racism" itself for asserting that minorities cannot compete equally.

Growing Hispanic clout and the obvious need for a new Rio Grande Valley economy are two reasons why Lt. Gov. Bill Hobby urges more "twin plants" on the border.

Whether LULAC is promoting a new tact in fighting racism or simply sidestepping a political-legal fray is unclear. But LULAC is playing as a political insider, not an outsider.

Hobby told a law conference audience that foreign companies are interested in locating "twin plants" on the border. The plants basically hire Mexican labor to assemble U.S.-made supplies.

BUDGET CUTS SOUGHT
Knowing full well

Of the 250 twin plants on the Texas-Mexico border, only about a dozen are non-U.S. companies.
