Fisher County Commissioners To Purchase Phone System

The members of the Fisher County Commissioners Court voted to purchase a \$12,137.26 telephone system from Contel of Abilene through Bobby Campbell and agreed to purchase a van from the Rotan First Baptist Church for use by the Fisher County Senior Citizen's Center.

Two telephone representatives were present last Monday morning giving bid presentations and explanations of systems. Representing AT&T

was Robert Ortiz while Bobby Campbell represented Contel, the successful bidder.

Commissioners agreed to purchase a van from the First Baptist Church of Rotan for \$3,500 and to give the van to the Fisher County Senior Citizen's Center. The funds for the van purchase are to be paid back to the commissioners at a later date by the local senior citizen's center.

Steve Lahon, Sweetwater Juvenile Official, was present last Mon-

day seeking the renewal of the contract of detention services from Fisher County, Fisher, Nolan and Mitchell Counties currently contract with Taylor County to house juveniles. The rate was increased from \$50.00 a day to \$60.00 for the housing of juveniles.

Don Pullig was present representing the Roby Volunteer Fire Department. He was on hand to request that the commissioners leave the old county fire fighting truck with Roby when the new truck arrives. A new vehicle is expected to be in place in 6 weeks. Roby requested that the old truck be given to the department. Commissioners took the request under advisement and asked Roby and Rotan firefighters to get together and come to a joint decision concerning the old fire fighting vehicles.

Commissioners, acting on a request by Austin McKinney, Fisher County Veteran's Service Officer, voted to cover McKinney under the county group medical insurance plan.

Jerry Goad, representing Creative Programs, Inc., Abilene, Texas appeared before the court to explain a program designed to save both

the county and county employees money. The program is supposed to reduce F.I.C.A. and withholding employee payments for Fisher County and provide tax-deductible items for employees. Commissioners did not make a

decision on the request.

In final action commissioners rejected all bids on a 1982 Ford LTD. Bids of \$280.00 came from Michael Grady; \$200.00 from Marvin Kersch and \$200.00 from H.W. Grady.

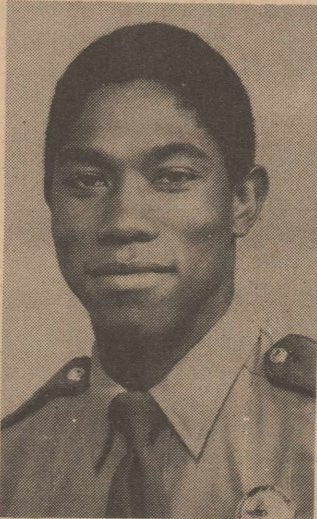
Colonel Jim Adams, DPS director, said he is especially pleased at the quality of people who are entering the law enforcement profession.

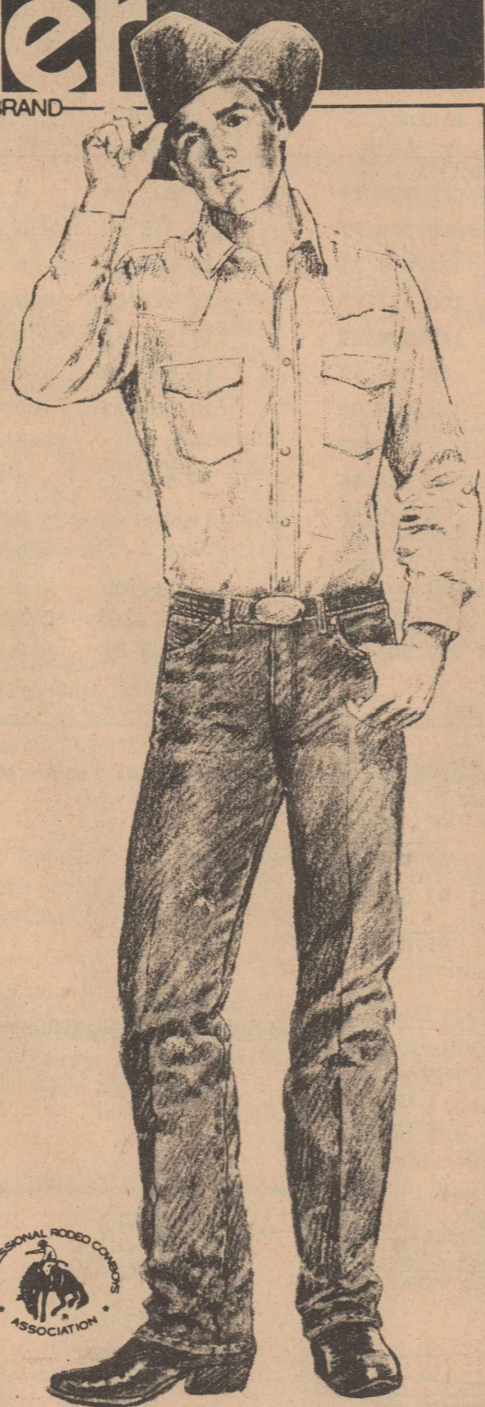

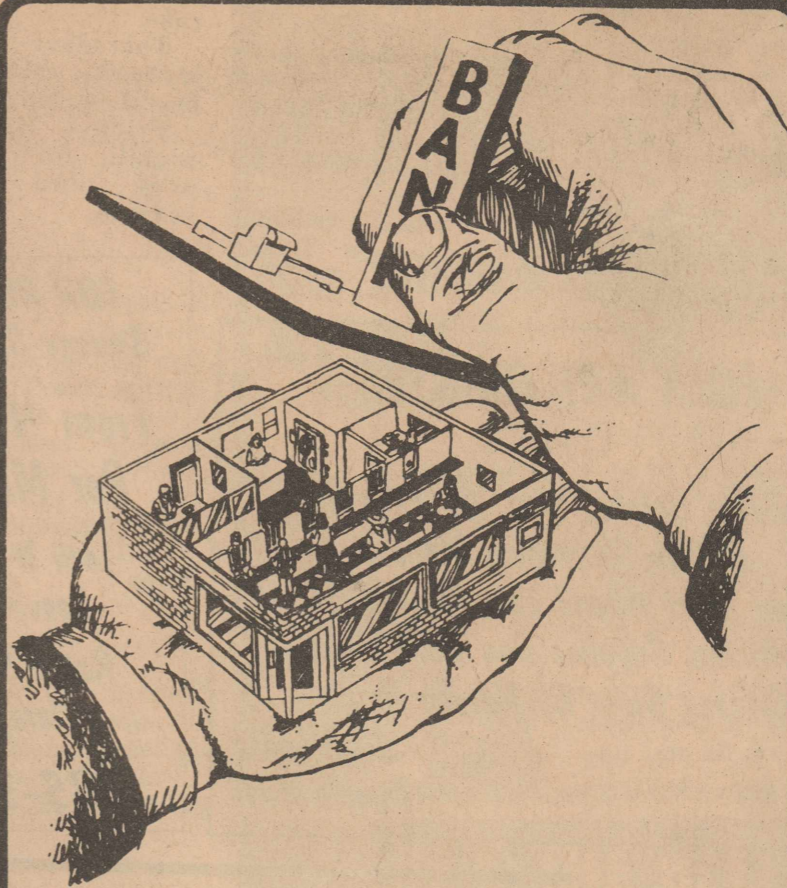

Roby Lions Take Victory Over Roscoe Plowboys 6-0

The Roby Lions, continuing to play good defensive football, scratched out a 6-0 victory over the Roscoe Plowboys Friday night.

The game opened with the Lions receiving the kick off and the Lions old menace—"the penalty" showed up quickly for the Lions were called for an ineligible block at the 16 yard line on the return and were moved back to the eight yard line to start their first possession of the night. The Lions were unable to make a first and punted on fourth and nine. Roscoe began then on their 48 and were thrown for two quick losses before getting a thirteen yard gain, a penalty on the Lions added another five yard, but on the next four plays, the Plowboys had lost four yards and on fourth and thirteen from the Lions 41, the Plowboys went for the first but the pass was incomplete. Roby took over again and had gained five yards in two plays but another fifteen yard penalty moved the Lions back to the 28—two plays later faced

with fourth and 22, the Lions punted, but the Plowboys were penalized for roughing the kicker. This gave the Lions a first on their 41, the Lions then moved to the Plowboys 47 in 3 plays an apparent first down was killed. When the Lions were again penalized fifteen yards, this moved them back to their 36. Roby punted again when faced with a fourth and seventeen. Roscoe took over then for their second possession, but on the second play fumbled the ball back to the Lions. Roby's Rodney Green came up with the loose ball. The Lions ran off five plays before the quarter ended.

Each team had three possessions in the second quarter. The Lions had three punts and the Plowboys two. Roscoe fumbled on their second possession and Roby's Greg Meek recovered the loose ball for the Lions. The Plowboys had also returned one of the Lions punts for an apparent touchdown but a clipping penalty against the Plowboys nullified it. The first

half ended in a 0-0 score.

The third quarter started much like the first two, their team was able to sustain a drive. The Plowboys on two possessions went for first downs on fourth down plays, but both times the Lions defense stopped them short. Roby on their second possession tried to kick a field goal, but the attempt fell short. It was in the Lions next possession that the Lions heads-up playing produced the only score of the game. Roby was on their 36 faced with a second and eight, Roby's Rodney Green had made a good run for about twelve yards, but on the tackle the ball shot up into the air. Roby's Greg Meek, caught the fumble in the air and out ran the Plowboys defense to the end zone. The PAT kick was blocked, with fifteen seconds left in the third quarter, Roby led 6 to 0.

In the final quarter, the Lions defense played a strong game to give the Lions the victory. The Lions had three possessions in the fourth quarter, but never made a first down and punted three times. The Plowboys had four possessions and punted only once. Roscoe's first possession ended on that punt.

Their second possession started at the Lions 39 and on fourth and five could only make one, their third possession started at the Lions 47, they had moved to the 39, but then on a fourth and thirteen play, Roby's Marlon Terry hit on the Plowboy's quarterback caused a fumble and team mate Jeff Branson recovered the ball for the Lions. Then on the Plowboys last possession the Lions defense really shined. With just over a minute to play and no

time outs left, after another good punt by Jay Linn Helms, Roscoe had the ball first and ten on their 26. In 3 plays, Roscoe moved to the Lions 48—two of these plays were side line passes to kill the clock.

Their next pass fell incomplete. The next play, the Lions were again penalized, this moved the ball to the 34, another pass completion and Roscoe had a first and goal on the eight yard line. The Lions

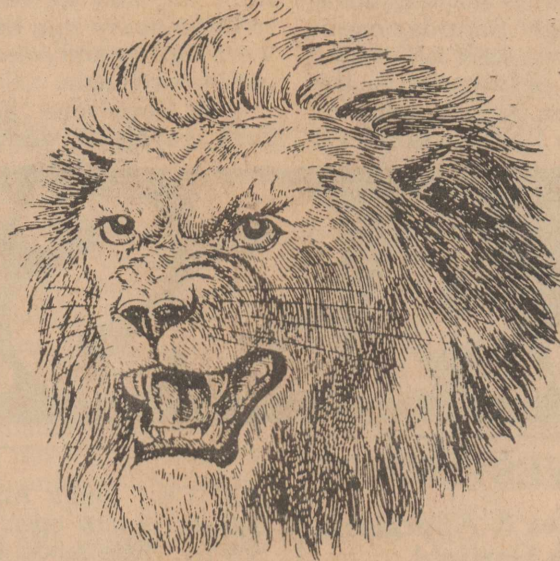
defense pressed the Plowboy quarterback causing an incomplete pass and two back to back sacks, but on the third down play the Lions were penalized, giving the Plowboys two more downs to get

into the end zone, but again the Lions defense blew thru the Plowboy line to get the quarterback for losses.

The Lions then at their twelve yard line, ran the last seven seconds off the clock to

end the game. The Lions are now 1 and 0 in District play.

This week the Lions will fill an open spot in their schedule by playing Sweetwater's J.V. Thursday night in Sweetwater at 7:30.
