# Rotan Motor Company Closes After 74 Years Of Service To Fisher County

Rotan Motor Company officially ceased to be an authorized Ford Motor Company dealership on October 31st, thus ending a string of service that dates back 74 years to 1912 when W.E. Spencer began the firm.

Rotan Motor Company opened for business under Ray Brown on February 23rd, 1946 when the dealership was purchased from J.C. Strange and R.L. Waddell.

W.E. Spencer began the dealership in 1912 and in 1914 sold to the Day Brothers. Bob Strayhorn purchased the dealership from Day Brothers in 1922. Jack Kennedy was a partner

for a year in the dealership before it was sold in 1938 to Carl Fraser and Lloyd Barker.

Dee Summerlin, owner of the dealership for a short period selling to R.L. Waddell, who

sold to Ray Brown in 1946.

Rotan Motor Company will be open for another week or two then will close for approximately a month while stock is inven-

toried and parts returned to Ford Motor Company.

Archie Neeley, part owner in the local firm since 1973, will open the location in late December as a garage,

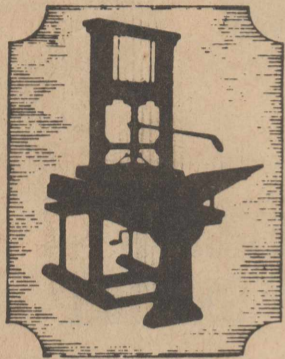

## Rotan Yellowhammers Take Victory Over Roby Lions

The Rotan Yellowhammers finished their season with a 7 to 5 win over the Roby Lions. This was another defensive game for the Hammers and was decided

by a 6 yard third quarter touchdown pass from Steve McClain to Jerry Carter.

After a short punt by Rotan, the Roby Lions scored first with a field

goal on a fourth and goal play. On the kick off, Roby scored a second time with a safety after a mishandled ball. Making the score 5 to 0. From that point on the game became a defensive game with both teams unable to move the ball.

Roby intercepted the ball and returned it for a touchdown during the second quarter, but the play was brought back with a flag on the down. Rotan also had a touchdown called back due to a flag on the play late in the fourth quarter.

Vincente Ortega intercepted a Roby pass and made a good run on the play for several yards. George Patterson then recovered a Roby fumble a few plays later. Both of these efforts provided the Rotan fans with excitement during the second quarter. Two key plays during the third quarter were the results of a good offensive play. George Patterson had a

long gainer run for a 1 and 10 on the 21 yard line and Robert Roddy made a nice run pulling the Hammers out of poor field position for a first and ten. During the fourth quarter, George Reyes recovered a fumble giving Rotan the ball.

The most active tackling for the game came from Vincente Ortega, Todd Gruben, George Reyes and Brad Long. Vincente had 9 unassisted tackles and 11 assisted; Todd had 9

unassisted and 2 assisted, George had six and six and Brad five and four.

On offense, Robert Roddy had nine carries for 38 yards, Brad Long had eleven carries for 43 yards, Steve McClain had five carries for 15 yards, and George Patterson one for 20 yards.

Rotan ends this season with a record of 1-3 district games and 5-4 for the year, which is a big improvement over last year's effort.

### Tax Planning

#### FAMILY EMPLOYEES

Family owned businesses have an opportunity to reduce their income taxes and gain other financial benefits by putting family members on the payroll.

If a husband and wife file a joint income tax return, the only income tax benefit from hiring the spouse will be for the extra IRA contribution deduction. Since wages to a spouse are not subject to social security, such wages may serve to reduce the social security contribution of the employer spouse.

If you are providing after tax dollars to parents, grandparents, brothers, sisters, children, or grandchildren, consider getting a legitimate deduction for services provided by them. If money is going for their benefit, it might just as well be taxed at their lower tax rate.

If done properly, the family employee arrangement can save substantial amounts of income tax. The employer gets a deduction for the wages, removing them from his high tax bracket, and the employee has taxable income presumably at a substantially lower or zero tax bracket.

An employed family member can contribute all of his/her earnings to an IRA, up to a maximum of \$2,000 annually. Not only does the family member get a deduction for the contribution, but the earnings inside the IRA are income tax free until they're withdrawn.

The compensation paid any family member has to be reasonable. There must be services performed and the amount of money paid must be essentially the same as you would pay a non-related employee for those services. If upon audit the IRS finds the wages to be unreasonably high, they will disallow a deduction to the employer, and the tax benefits to the family unit as a whole will be substantially reduced.

If the businesses incorporated, even though it's owned entirely by your family, you will have different payroll tax considerations and you may have to comply with child labor laws.

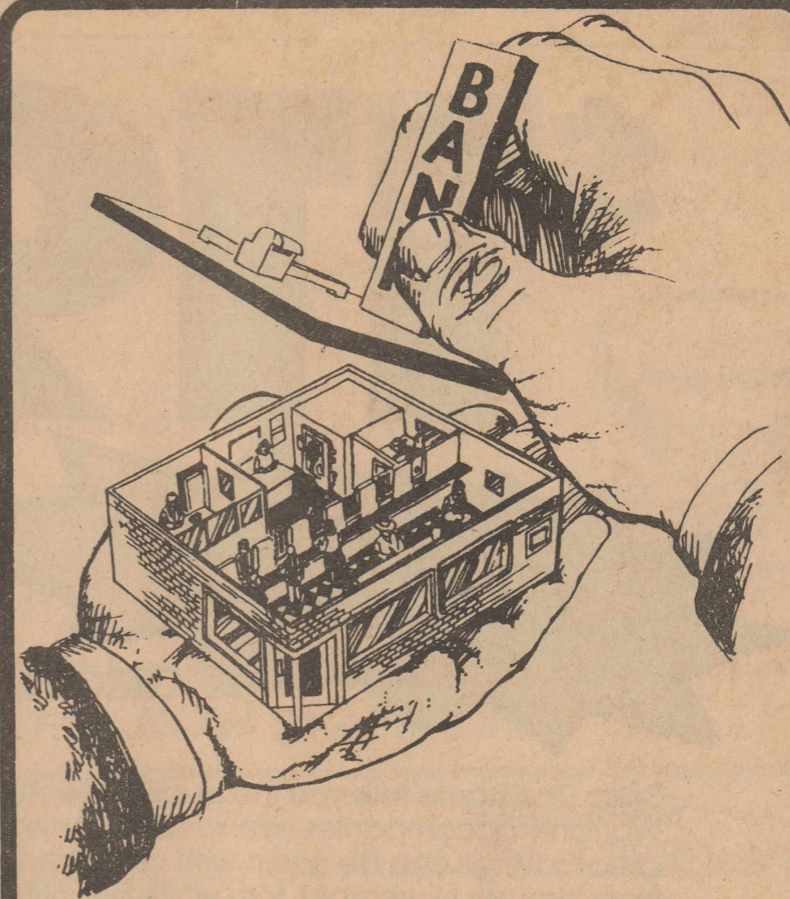

## County Agent News

By Richard Spencer

Fisher County farmers and ranchers who haven't already culled open, late-calving and poor performing cows should do so soon.

There's no need to put expensive winter feed into cows that are unproductive and inefficient. Culling the cow herd now will also help you more effectively plan on feed supplies for the winter months.

The culling process should also "weed out" cows with bad eyes, udders or feet and legs.

Also, pregnancy testing cows this fall may be a more profitable management tool than ever before.

Since it's difficult for a cow to produce a calf large enough to pay her annual maintenance bill and leave some profit for the producer, an open cow is surely losing money. In addition, cows calving late and during the summer months wean calves 30 to 90 pounds lighter than their herd mates which calve at earlier times.

For this reason it's advisable to cull cows which will calve late next year and purchase pregnant replacements which will calve early.

Whoever does the pregnancy diagnosis will be able to estimate

the calving date on each animal and make it easy to identify next year's late-calving cows. Work toward a 60-day calving season or one that's certainly no longer than 90 days.

Removing barren and late-calving cows from the herd will increase both the herd's reproductive potential and pounds of calf weaned.

Last week a wheat fertility test was established on the Richard Gaona farm located near Royston. Nitrogen rates of 20-40-60 and 80 pounds

were put down and these plots were replicated 3 times. The plots will be checked for forage and grain yield.

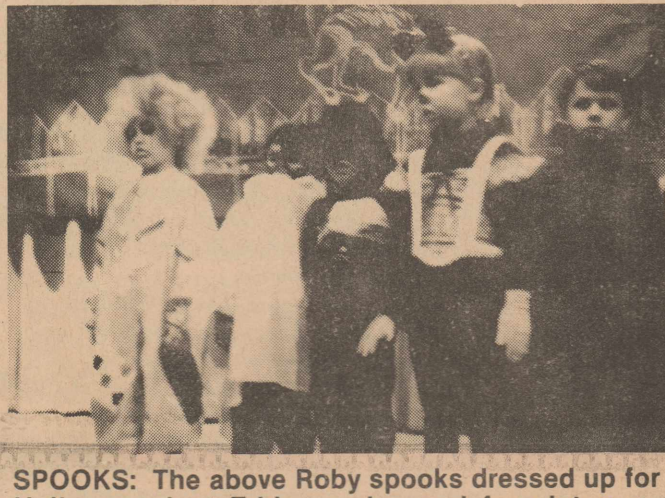
"Terra Nova" is based on the journals kept by three English ex-

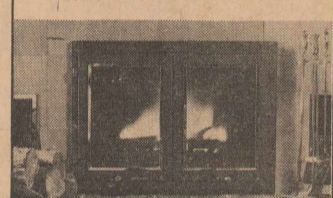

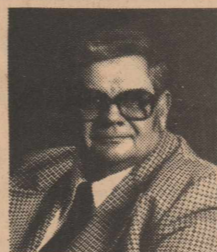

#### Weatherstripping

As much cold air can enter your home through a 1/16" crack along the sides and top of a typical doorway as through a 4" x 4" hole in the wall. Help keep the cold out by replacing worn weatherstripping around all doors and windows.

#### Caulking

Caulking in the cracks around door facings, windows, pipes and wiring will also help prevent air infiltration into your home. Polyurethane or similar caulking is available in an easy-to-install form at most hardware stores.

You can also help draft-proof your home by installing gaskets behind the cover plates of outlets and switches around your home. (Don't forget to turn the power off before removing the switch plates.)
