





#### CITY ORDINANCE

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING TRAFFIC RULES AND REGU LATIONS RELATING TO THE INSTALLATION OF AN AU-TOMATIC SIGNAL LIGHT IN THE CITY OF HASKELL AT THE INTERSECTION OF WAL-TON AND CLARK STREETS, AND DECLARING AN EMER-

GENCY.
BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HASKELL, TEXAS:

Article 1 SECTION 1. It shall be unlawful for anyone to cross the street intersection of Clark and Walton street while the automatic signal light suspended there-over shows an illuminated red light.

SECTION 2. It shall be unlaw ful for anyone to make what is termed a "U" turn at the inter-ection of Clark and Walton streets in the town of Haskell, Texas, however nothing in this article shall be construed to prevent a left-hand turn at such intersection when such signal light shows an illuminated green light, also, no thing in this article shall be construed to prevent the making of a right-hand turn upon a red light after first coming to a halt. This article is applicable to all form of traffic, and applies to pedestrians as well as operators of vehicle of whatsoever nature.

SECTION 3. Any person who violates any of the foregoing sections of such article shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and on conviction shall be fined not less than one nor more than twenty five dollars.

The rule calling for a second and third reading of an ordinance shall be and is hereby waived and su pended and this ordinance shall become a law and be of force and effect from and after its







#### Good Terraces Hold Quick, Heavy Rains that we must use much less Mrs.

An Arkansas farmer is one of many who have learned what good terraces can accomplish. The Arkansan had been terracing his farm since he bought it in 1921 but his terraces gave way under heavy rains. Last spring, after he decided to cooperate in he Soil Conservation Service program of erosion control, his terraces were rebuilt to conform with the latest principles of design. In January of this year come 23 days of rain, as much as 5 inches falling within a 48 hour period. Yet not one terrace overflowed or broke and no outlet was scoured by the rainfall.

The old fa hioned terrace was a reasonably satisfactory structure as long as rainfall was moderate, but it broke under quick, heavy rains. The terrace most frequently used by the Soil Conservation Service is essentially a channel above a broad based ridge of earth thrown up along the contour of

sloping land to reduce run off.
Some water is held in the chi nels and absorbed by the earth. But each channel is tilted slightly along its length so that any excess mointure is discharged slowly down the channel in a sloping outlet tiled or sodded to prevent scourging or gullying. By broad-ening the base of the terrace and providing it with a safety valve the modern agricultural engineer creates a structure which usually will withstand even the heaviest

On its erosion control project and camp areas the Soil Conservation Service has supervised the con truction of more than 50,000 miles of terraces and nearly 135,-000 permanent outlet structures.

Turn switch for baking and set the automatic timer, or chef's brain, to turn heat on 30 minutes later, and to turn heat off I hour from time heat is turned on. The 30 minutes interval before the heat is turned on permits the bread to rise without requiring any attention. During this interval, the temperature in the electric oven makes an ideal proofing box-not too not not too cold.
