Extraordinary times Unique commencement ceremonies set for county schools

The year of 2020 will forever be remembered as an extraordinary moment in history, not only as a rite of passage for the high school seniors in the graduating class of 2020, but also as a year that transformed the entire world. The COVID-19 Pandemic greatly impacted American lives, as well as the lives of the world's citizens on a global scale.



2020: YEAR OF THE MASK

It is a year that everyone will remember "before" and "after." For this generation of high school graduates, their parents may have spoken of before or after the September 11, 2001 terrorist attacks. This generation will speak of life before, or after, The Great COVID Pandemic of 2020.

In December 2019, a novel (new) coronavirus known as SARS-CoV-2 ("the virus") was first detected in Wuhan, Hubei Province, People's Republic of China, causing outbreaks of the coronavirus disease COVID-19 that has now spread globally. No vaccine for the disease is yet available, and "ordinary life" has changed to a whole new meaning.

When the young men and women of the Class of 2020 look back, they will always remember that this was the year that students and teachers were banned from school in their second semester, to prevent the spread of the Coronavirus. On Friday the 13th (of March), President Donald Trump declared that the COVID-19 outbreak in the United States constituted a national emergency, and life as we knew it changed immediately. "Social distancing" became the catch-phrase for the year, with people asked to stay at least 6-feet apart.

Schools closed. Public events, and all professional and collegiate

sports events, were cancelled. The 2020 Summer Olympics were cancelled. Businesses locked their doors - some carried on with curbside or carryout delivery, or online/phone business only. Some businesses, deemed "not necessary" were closed altogether. Many employees began working remotely from home.

People were asked to stay home if at all possible, and to wear masks in public. Gatherings were first limited to 50, then quickly changed to no more than 10 people, as the number of people infected with the Coronavirus grew to more than 42,000 in Texas alone by mid-May, and numbering 1.3 million in the US, and 4.3 million worldwide.

Friday the 13th (of March) was the last day of regular classes held at school. It was the last day of class before Spring Break - and as it turned out, the last day classes were held at school facilities, before the governor closed schools on March 19, and then extended the closure for the next nine weeks, for the remainder of the 2020 school year.

Sports and UIL events were cancelled. Proms, senior trips, senior parties, and even casual dates to a movie were denied, as schools and businesses closed, social distancing was implemented, and people were asked to stay home and away from others.

By the beginning of May, local school officials began pondering alternative possibilities to hold commencement exercises for their graduating high school seniors, since social distancing requirements meant that long-held traditions of crowded ceremonies held in gymnasiums and auditoriums would not be an option for the

Class of 2020.

School officials began to think outside the box, with the following creative solutions planned for commencement ceremonies for the high schools in Lynn County.

There are 89 seniors from the four county schools, including 38 in Tahoka, 22 at New Home, 18 at O'Donnell, and 11 at Wilson ISD.

• Tahoka ISD

Live ceremonies will be held on the Bulldog football field at 8 p.m. Friday, May 22, with seating arranged for social distancing. Only those guests provided with tickets by students will be allowed in the stadium, with seating arranged in groups of no more than 8. Students will have tickets for 8 guests - 4 guests on the field and 4 in the stands - blue ticket holders will enter main gate on east side - white ticket holders enter middle gate on east side and sit in stands - must have a ticket to enter. A Graduation Parade will be held Thursday the 21st, starting at 7 p.m. Students (wearing graduation gown and cap) may line up in vehicles (must have an adult driver) at 6:30 p.m. Decorations are encouraged. Students will parade down Bulldog Lane, Main Street, and conclude at courthouse. Covid-19 guidelines will be followed.

The 2020 Tahoka High School Valedictorian is Kenzie Parks, with a GPA of 4.4618, daughter of Susan Parks. Kenzie will receive her Associates Degree from South Plains College before she gets her high school diploma. She will be attending the University of Hawaii at Manoa in the fall. The THS Salutatorian is Nadalie Carrasco, with a GPA of 4.4368. Nadalie is the daughter of Victoria Deleon, and Felipe and Veronica Deleon. She was on the SPC Dean's Honor Roll and will receive her Associates Degree from South Plains College before she gets her high school diploma. She will be attending the University of Texas at Permian Basin in the fall.

• O'Donnell ISD

OISD will have a virtual ceremony at 7 p.m. Friday, May 22, to be shown on the school's website or YouTube. Seniors were videoed as they came in at individually-scheduled times to receive diplomas, with a video combining all graduates to be shown. A Senior Parade of cars will start at 3:30 p.m. Friday, which will also be broadcast on Screamin' Eagle Radio.

The 2020 O'Donnell High School Valedictorian is Marcos Antonio Pedroza, son of Manuel and Melissa Pedroza of O'Donnell. He plans to attend Texas A&M University in College Station and major in Construction Science. The OHS Salutatorian is Brianna Ry'Ann Sauseda, daughter of Fred and Lori Vitolas. She was on the SPC Dean's Honor Roll and will be graduating high school with an Associates Degree from South Plains College, where she was a member of Phi Theta Kappa Honor Society. She plans to attend Lubbock Christian University.

OISD officials chose not to release GPA information.

Tahoka Police, fire dept., EMS join in search for missing boy

An emergency call reporting a missing 10-year-old boy in Tahoka last week had Tahoka Police calling for assistance in an immediate search, with members of the Tahoka Volunteer Fire Department and Lynn County EMS joining in the search. It ended well, with the boy located, unharmed, and returned to his family.

The call came in at 5:15 p.m. last Tuesday, May 12, when a Tahoka woman reported that her 10-year-old foster son had apparently run away from home, and that family members were unable to locate the boy. Police, TVFD, and EMS members joined in the search, and the boy was found walking down the US 87 access road about an hour later. He was unharmed, and was returned to his family. No charges were filed.

A week later, at 10:45 a.m. Monday, May 18, the juvenile was again reported as a runaway, and police were able to locate the boy and return him to the family.

A woman called Tahoka Police Tuesday morning, May 19, reporting her truck as stolen. She told police that her husband had taken the truck but when he returned home at 3:30 a.m. that morning he did not have the truck. This investigation is ongoing.

A female juvenile driving a vehicle that struck a stop sign at the intersection of N. 7th and Main was issued multiple citations on May 17, after a parent told police that the vehicle had been taken without permission. Another female juvenile was a passen-

ger in the vehicle. No injuries were reported.

Twenty red patio pavers were reported stolen from a back yard in the 1900 block of South 3rd, at 10 a.m. last Thursday. The owner reported someone had come in the back yard sometime during the night and taken the pavers.

Two females reportedly left a Tahoka convenience store without paying for the items, at 4:30 p.m. last Thursday. Police are continuing this investigation.

Other calls during the week included a couple of traffic hazards, with police picking up a blown tire on the US 87 and FM 400 exit on Sunday, and asking an owner to remove a trailer parked in a private driveway on Lockwood that was reportedly blocking the view of oncoming traffic, which the owner complied. Police responded to several domestic disputes, reports of reckless drivers, and offered assistance to EMS on several occasions, and assisted a sheriff's deputy on an early morning traffic stop with a probable cause search issued.

Lynn County Jail held 28 inmates during the week, including 14 held for Ector County, and 14 for Lynn.

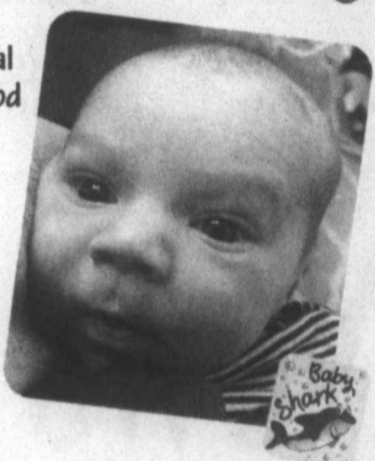

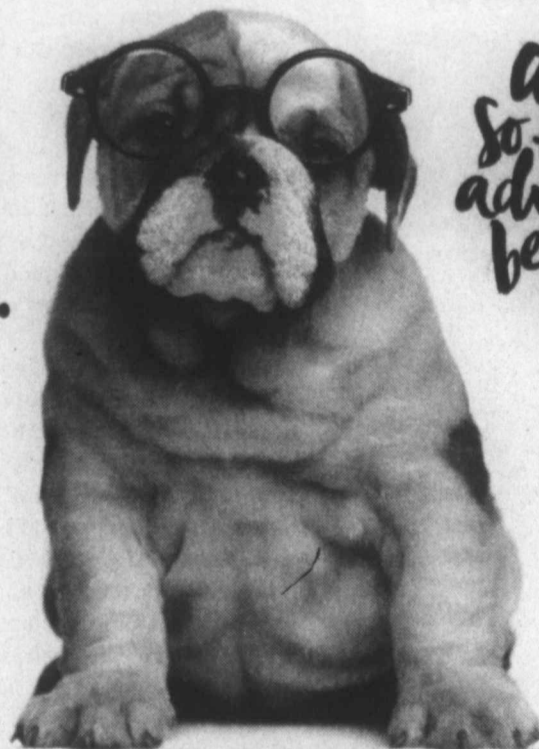

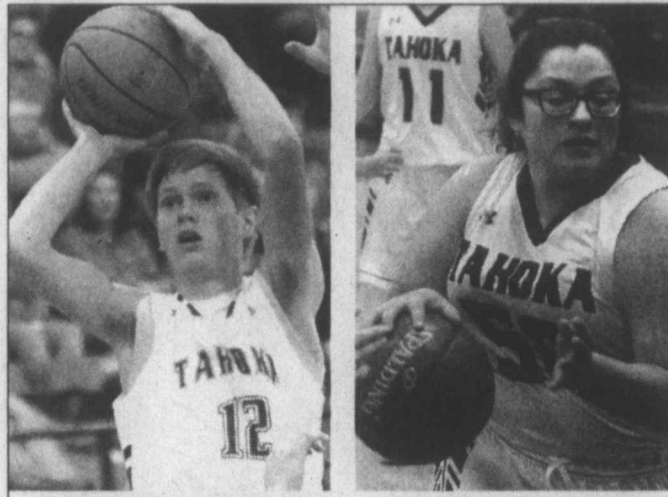
One person dead from COVID-19 in Slaton

Lamesa ISD announces graduation plans

LAMESA – Plans for Lamesa High School's graduation ceremonies were announced Friday by Superintendent Jim Knight. The plans were developed late this past week by a committee in order to comply with the guidelines established by Governor Greg Abbott during the COVID-19 crisis.

Lamesa High School's graduation ceremony will be held at the stadium at 8 p.m. on June 5. Each graduate will be allowed five guests who will be issued tickets to attend the graduation ceremony. In order to comply with state requirements to screen each person for COVID-19 symptoms, a screening questionnaire will be printed on the back of each ticket, Knight said.

"Every individual that comes in will have to sign the health screening," Knight said. The tickets will be collected as a record of proof of the screening. Hand sanitizer stations will be available at each entrance to the stadium.

State guidelines encourage attendees to wear masks but that will not be mandatory, Knight said.

Guests will be seated on a first-come, first-served basis on the home side of the stadium. In order to ensure proper spacing, every other row will be closed to seating. Each family will be required to sit in one of the areas marked off with blue tape, ensuring that each family is at least six feet from the next family.

Graduates will be seated on the field in chairs spaced six feet apart on all sides.

Knight said no gatherings will be allowed on the football field after the ceremony. — from *the Lamesa Press-Reporter*

Shotgun blast hits Lamesa teen
LAMESA – Lamesa police are continuing to investigate a shooting incident Tuesday night (May 12) which resulted in a Lamesa teenager being airlifted to a hospital in Lubbock.
The victim, a 17-year-old boy, was in stable condition at last report from the hospital, Acting Police Chief Josh Peterson said Wednesday morning.
"He was shot at close range with a 20-gauge shotgun," Peterson told the *Press-Reporter*.
The blast hit the teenager in his torso, according to Peterson. The incident apparently happened inside a residence in the 1300 block of S. 14th Street. Police were notified at 9:21 p.m.
The victim was transported by ambulance to O'Donnell, where a medical helicopter transported him on to Lubbock.
No one else was injured in the incident, Peterson said. Officers are still seeking to determine how the teen was shot.





Shotgun blast hits Lamesa teen
LAMESA - Lamesa police are continuing to investigate a shooting incident Tuesday night (May 12) which resulted in a Lamesa teenager being airlifted to a hospital in Lubbock. The victim, a 17-year-old boy, was in stable condition at last report from the hospital, Acting Police Chief Josh Peterson said Wednesday morning. "He was shot at close range with a 20-gauge shotgun," Peterson told the *Press-Reporter*. The blast hit the teenager in his torso, according to Peterson. The incident apparently happened inside a residence in the 1300 block of S. 14th Street. Police were notified at 9:21 p.m. The victim was transported by ambulance to O'Donnell, where a medical helicopter transported him on to Lubbock. No one else was injured in the incident, Peterson said. Officers are still seeking to determine how the teen was shot.

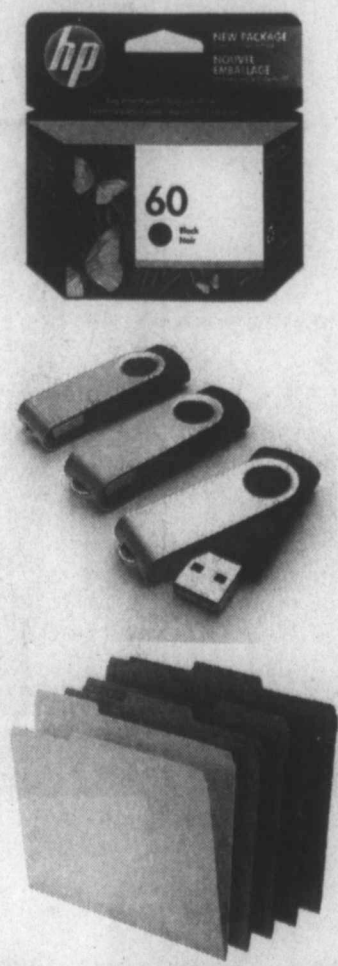

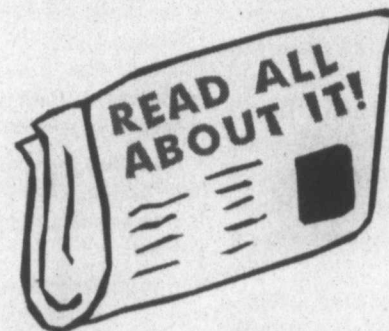

Dawson County COVID count at 37

LAMESA – A sudden jump in the number of COVID-19 cases reported in Dawson County shouldn't be cause for alarm, according to a local doctor.

Mayor Josh Stevens announced Friday that seven new cases of the novel coronavirus here have been confirmed this past week. That pushes the total number of confirmed cases in Dawson County to 37.

But Steven said there is good news in that the number of active cases here actually has decreased to nine. Eleven more individual who have had the virus have completed their quarantine period this week and are back in the public, Stevens reported.

The seven new cases confirmed in Lamesa include two children under the age of 10, two females over age 20, two females over age 60, and one female over age 70. All are quarantined at home and being monitored by the department of health.

Dr. Mark Key said the increase in the total number of cases can be attributed to an increase in the availability of testing for the virus. That improved availability is allowing more people to be tested – people who don't show as many signs of the virus as were previously needed in order to qualify for testing.
