THE STATE OF TEXAS To The Sheriff or any Constable of Haskell County, Greeting: You are hereby commanded to summon Albert Williams who is a transient person and whose residence is unknown, to appear at the next regular term of the District Court of Haskell County, Texas to be held at the Court House in the City of Haskell on the third Monday in April A. D. 1940, being the 15th day of April A. D. 1940, to answer a petition filed in the said court on the 9th day of March, A. D. 1940, the file number of which is 5471, in which suit, Clinton Williams, Veda Kingston and husband, D. M. Kingston are plaintiffs and Ruby Williams, Albert Williams, Mrs. Pearl Davis and husband, E. J. Davis, and Lena Stanton are defendants; the cause of action being alleged as follows:

Being a partition suit wherein Clinton Williams, Veda Kingston and husband, D. M. Kingston, are plaintiffs and Ruby Williams, a feme sole, Albert Williams, Mrs. Pearl Davis and husband, E. J.
