These people had become Christians (Acts 18:8), now Paul tells them watch their lives carefully so they will remain Christians and not fall back into sin. The Bible tells us how to become Christians and how to maintain this wonderful relationship with God. Any man who accepts Christianity as less than a way of life has been deceived. Let us keep Christ in Christianity.

After moving to Baird in 1899, she continued her teaching, again being associated with her father in Baird College.  
As a teacher, she had great influence over her pupils. They reflected the influence of her fine Christian spirit and her refined personality. She specialized, in her later years, in the teaching of handicapped children. She understood human nature and had an unerring sense of detecting trouble in the minds of her pupils and her friends, thus helping them over many rough places.  
She was married to Rufus Leander Alexander, a young graduate of Cumberland University School of Law, Lebanon, Tenn., on Oct. 4, 1904.  
To this union were born four children: Baby Alexander, girl, still-born, Jan., 1909; John Collier Alexander, boy, Oct. 3, 1910; James Marshall Alexander, Jr., boy, Nov. 14, 1915; Henry Franklin Alexander, boy, May 22, 1918 (died March 1, 1922).  
She enjoyed her club work, being a member of the Wednesday and the Delphian Clubs. She became a member of the Wednesday Club in 1920, and was a charter member of the Delphian Club.  
She was faithful in her duties, a loving and loyal friend.  
From the early 1930's she taught the Bethany Woman's Class of the First Presbyterian Church of Breckenridge, Texas until her failing health prevented her from making the regular Sunday morning trips.  
She was a member of the Masonic Order of the Eastern Star, which she served as Worthy Matron.  
After a long illness, she passed away Feb. 14, 1955.  
Her husband, two sons, and three grandchildren survive her.

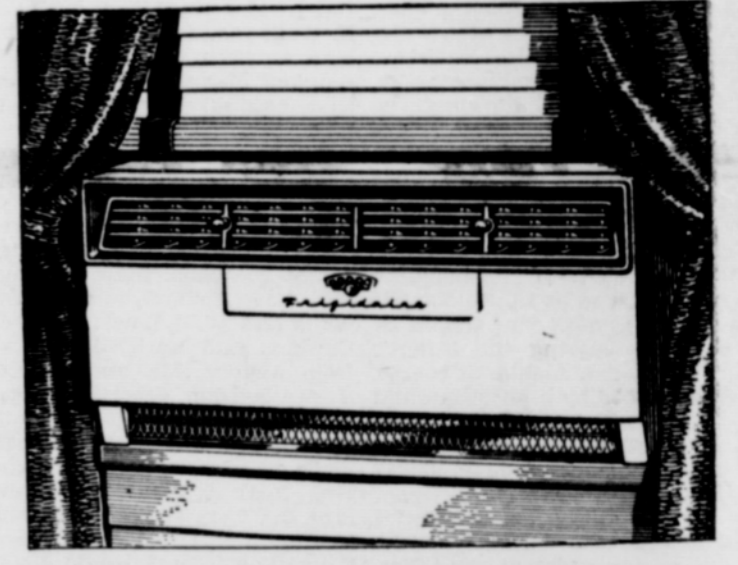

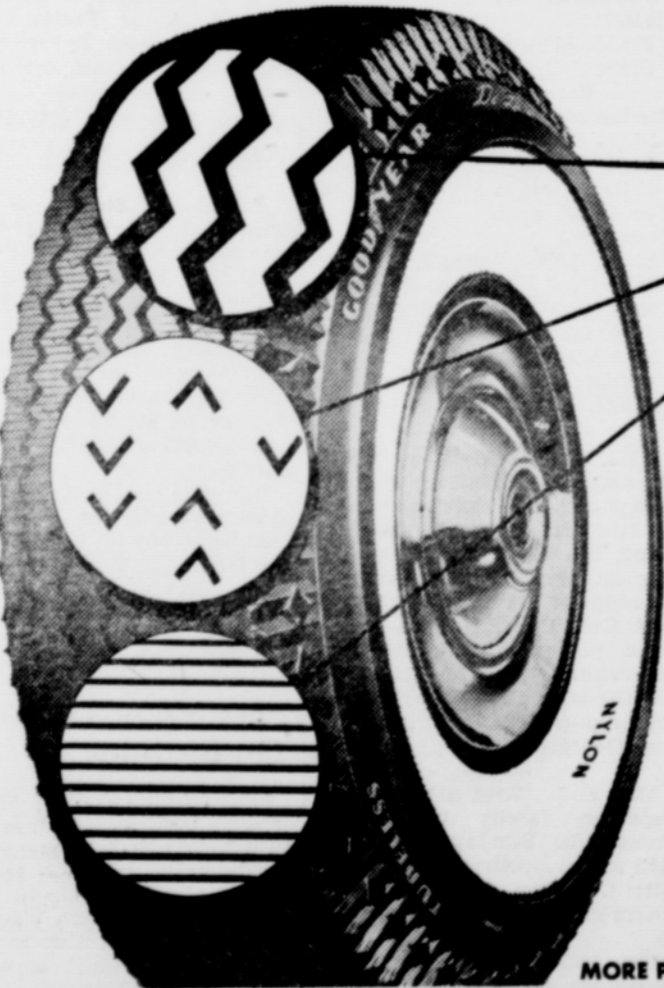
