## THE TEXAS SAFETY - RESPONSIBLITY LAW

REQUIRES YOU as the driver of a motor vehicle, if involved in an accident re sulting in bodily injury or death of any person or damage to the property of any person in excess of $\$ 100.00$, to:

1. Forward a written report of such accident within 10 days to the Department of Public Safety on forms designed for this purpose.
2. Within 60 days after receipt of above report, you must furnish proof of your financial ability to pay damages by one of the following methods:
(a) Show that an insurance liability policy with adequate limits was in force at the time of the accident; or
(b) Deposit cash or negotiable sec irities with the Department of Public Safety in an amount up to $\$ 15,000.00$; or
(c) Deposit a surety bond in such amount as shall be prescribed by the Department of Public Safety; or
(d) File proof with the Department of Public Safety showing that all claims have been settled.
PENALTY: For the failure to report a motor vehicle accident or to furniish proof be suspended by the Department of Public Safety, and a fine of 25 dollars is included.
