

The Haskell Maidens traveled to Coleman last Monday night, Feb. 13 to take on the Eldorado Lady Eagles to officially kickoff the much anticipated 2017 playoffs. The Maidens outscored the Lady Eagles 23-12 the

second half to get the 46-30 win and take the Bi-District Championship. The 19th ranked Maidens won their twentieth game in a row and they improved their overall record to 28-5.

"Offensively, I was pleased with our shot selection and our field goal percentage. The girls did a good job getting everyone involved and knocking down shots. We have to do a much better job of not turning the ball over and valuing each offensive possession. The margin of error will begin to tighten up a lot from this point forward," head coach Blake Eddleman said.

Haskell forced Eldorado to shoot (6-34) for 17% from the field and they held their best player #34 Sydney Covarrubiaz to 2 points. "Defensively, I thought Taylor, Jordan and Makinzie did a great job face guarding their best player and the rest of the girls made it really tough on their other players. I was very disappointed that we sent them to the freethrow line 32 times and that kind of stuff will get us beat from this point forward. We must be more disciplined and more intelligent from here on out," Eddleman said.

The Maidens won the rebound battle over the Lady Eagles 33-26. Sophomore C'Era Taylor led the way with 11 rebounds followed by Hanson with 8, J. Garvin 4 and Manske 4. Leading the team in steals were Taylor Manske with 4, C. Taylor 3, Bevel 2 and J. Garvin 2.

"Overall, we were happy about winning the Bi-District Championship and we are looking forward to playing Tahoka for the Area Championship. I thought we did a lot of good things on both ends of the floor. We just need to do a much better job of not fouling as much and not turning the ball over as much. Those two aspects of the game will be critical from this point forward," Eddleman added.




