Wartburg Seminary Chorus To Sing Here March 12

The chorus is under the direction of Dr. Albert A. Jagnow. Included in the program are familiar Chorales of the Reformation period, as well as works of contemporary composers. The chorus has twenty con-

certs scheduled in six states including Kansas, Iowa, Texas, Missouri, Arkansas and Oklahoma plus a pre-tour at Schapville, Ill. A free will offering will be received. The public is cordially invited to attend.

Nine Haskell County Soldiers To Take Part in 47th Division's Maneuvers

CAMP RUCKER, Ala.—Four hundred and four Texas soldiers from 206 communities will return to their home state in March as part of the 47th "Viking" Infantry Division stationed here to participate in Exercise Long Horn at Fort Hood.

The 47th's Texas contingent is composed of draftees and rotated Korean veterans.

Included in the ranks are: Cpl. Marvin H. Hancock, 1001 N. Ave. E.; Cpl. Tom B. Barnett and Cpl. Justin M. Puschel, Rt. 1, all of Haskell; Pfc. Bobby E. Hutchinson, Cpl. Erwin King, Jr., and Cpl. W. R. Herndon, all of O'Brien; Pfc. Joe Marion of Weinert; Pfc. Billy Miller of Rule; and Pfc. Edgar L. Schmidt of Sagerton—all of Haskell county.

The draftees poured into the 47th in the middle of February, 1951, after processing at Fort

Sill, Okla.

For some men, the joint Army-Air Force training maneuver will be staged in their own "back yard." Master Sgt. Jose Olivares of the 164th Infantry Regiment is a native of Lampasas, located within the Fort Hood boundaries. Sgt. Leo Dermody also of the 164th, lives at Temple, 25 miles from the maneuver site.

The 47th Division—Army home of so many Texans—is one of the youngest infantry divisions in active service. First organized as a Minnesota-North Dakota National Guard unit in 1946, the 47th was federalized in January, 1951. Since then, it has been training at Camp Rucker, sending thousands of personnel to Korea. In replacement, hundreds of Korean veterans have been assigned to the division.

Although the Division as a unit has no combat record, the individual regiment and battalions have fought under other divisions' colors. The 175th Field Artillery Battalion fired a million and 300 thousand rounds in Africa and Italy in World War II, and gave Hitler his first taste of American artillery at Medjez El Bab, North Africa, on November 19, 1942.

The 164th Infantry Regiment hit the Solomons, Leyte, and Guadalcanal. The 135th Infantry Regiment was the first to land American troops in Europe. The 136th Infantry Regiment fought in New Guinea, Morotai, and Luzon. The 188th Field Artillery Battalion saw action at Utah Beachhead, St. Lo, and the Battle of the Bulge. The 194th Tank Battalion was caught in the fall of Bataan. Seventy-five per cent of the survivors died either in the infamous "Death March" or in prison camps.

For Exercise Long Horn, the 47th will have to transplant itself lock, stock, and barrel. That entails moving a "city" of some 15,000 men—with equipment—900 miles across four states.

Long Horn will highlight 13 months of intensive combat infantry training for the Viking Division.

The 47th is now called an "All-American" Division with men from 48 states and three territories.

Exercise Long Horn will include 150,000 men from eight Army and numerous Air Force units. The problem is designed to give realistic training in large scale offensive and defensive operations.

Juicy Meat Loaf

1 lb. ground beef
1/2 cup Fat Milk
1/4 cup rolled oats
2 1/2 tablespoons finely cut onion
1 teaspoon salt
1/2 teaspoon pepper
2 slices bacon, cut in half
4 medium onions, cut in half crosswise

Mix well beef, milk, oats, onion, salt and pepper. Dip hands in water and shape mixture into a loaf. Put into greased pan. Place onions around loaf and bacon slices on top. Bake in moderately slow oven (350) 30 minutes, then turn onions and bake 30 minutes longer, or until loaf is brown. Serve hot or cold. Makes 4 servings.

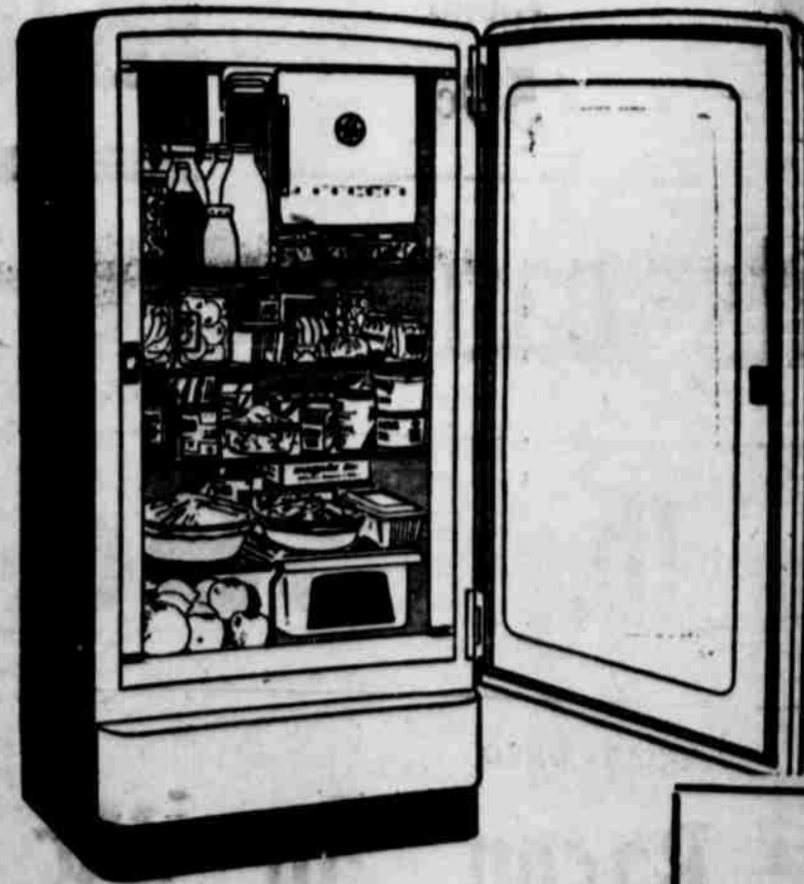

The plant site has been underway for several weeks. This preliminary work, much of which is in the lake basin and has to be completed before the dam is closed, consists of laying one-half mile of eight foot reinforced concrete pipes in the lake basin and excavation of a canal extending from the end of the pipe farther into the basin proper. Under normal conditions, the pipe and the canal will be submerged under the waters of the lake.

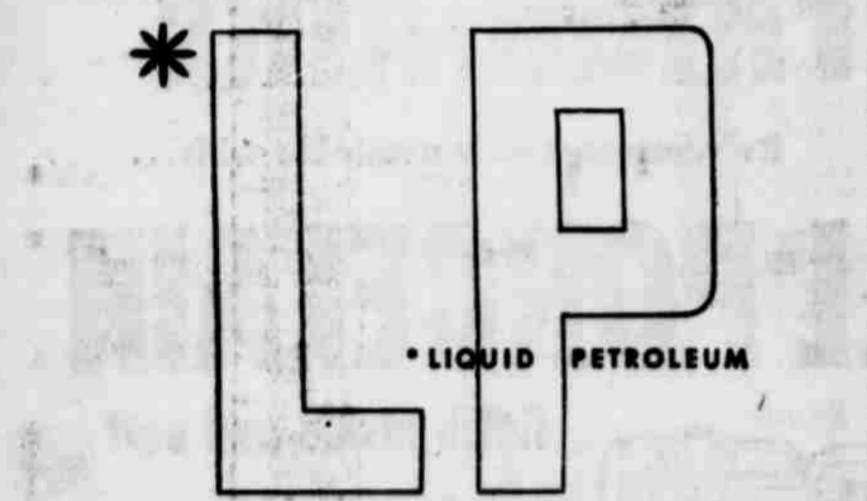
