Writes to Murray, Secretary Hogg Committee—
A Letter of Approval.

Texas Central Extension.

TERRILL, Tex., Sept. 19.—Joseph McWilliams, superintendent of the Garrett-Roberts branch of the Texas Central railway, was seen to-day by the News reporter and questioned as to the authenticity of the report that the road had been purchased by Mrs. Hattie Green and that it would be extended to Paris at once.

His statements to the reporter went to corroborate statements made by Mr. Green in an interview with the News representative published in Sunday's issue, and were that the road at the end of a month's time would be controlled solely by Mrs. Green, and that the extension would certainly begin just as soon as the transfer was made. As to Mr. Green above referred to, Mr. McWilliams substantiates all claims that he made for himself, and says that he (Green) is the son of Mrs. Hattie Green and that he was here as the duly qualified agent of his mother.—Dallas News.

RACY ROUND-UPS RENDERED READABLE. The board of equalization of Mason has raised taxable value \$110,000 above the amount rendered to the assessor.

Two Chinamen were recently thwarted at El Paso in an attempt to smuggle themselves into United States from Mexico. A college building is to be erected at Odien. Grayson county has been visited by fine rains.

Sherman has the cholera scare and will clean up. A public school building is to be built at Neotoma. Brenham is taking precautions against cholera.

Franklin's new opera house has been completed. The Jefferson mill will be completed by Oct. 1. Farmers around Lovelady complain of two much rain.

The Dublin oil mill will begin operations in a few days. Work has begun on the new school building at Hestrop. Work on the Gordon waterworks system has commenced.

A number of new residences are under construction at Italy. A movement is on foot at Tyler to organize a board of trade. Boll worms have greatly damaged cotton in the Paris section.

The cotton crop around Oldham promises an immense yield. The new court house at Haskell is being pushed to completion. Terrell's burnt district will be replaced by substantial bricks.

Work is progressing rapidly on the new Baptist church at Italy. Work will soon commence on a Masonic hall at Madisonville. An addition is being built to the Methodist church at Calvert.

Cotton worms are doing great damage in the Hempstead section. Work will be resumed in a few days on the addition to the well at Martin.

ST. LOUIS CARNIVAL.

Special Attractions for the Entertainment of the Crowds.

ST. LOUIS, Sept. 18.—The attendance in St. Louis today is remarkably large, the immense number of people having come in from all directions to witness the fifth of the series of twelve grand illuminations which are making the city famous this fall throughout the entire continent.

The carnival is now at its height and the Exposition is proving a wonderful success, the attendance during the first week showing an increase of over 25 per cent. Gilmore with his strengthened band of 100 pieces is doing magnificent work, and so popular are his concerts that many who obtain good seats to hear them remain seated during the hour's performance.

Very heavy rains are reported from all over the Abilene country. Cattlemen agree that there will be the finest fall grass ever seen for years. While firing anvils near Brenham a few days ago Charles Dagner had three pounds of powder explode in his hands, seriously injuring him.

The Texaco Valley fair grounds at San Angelo are said to be in perfect condition for the opening of the annual exhibition in October. It is said that preparations are being made at Alvarado for the removal of the division shops and headquarters from that place to Hillsboro.

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The mayor of Victoria has issued a proclamation enjoining the citizens to clean up their premises in conformity with the sanitary regulations of the city. Those failing to do so will be severely dealt with.

Near Greenville recently, while three negroes were stealing a ride on a Missouri, Kansas and Texas freight train, one of them fell under a wheel in attempting to pass from one car to another and was ground to atoms.

At Crawfords a few days ago John Hays, colored, was fired upon through the door of his house by unknown parties, one shot passing through his ankle and another through his hips. The wounds are considered very serious.

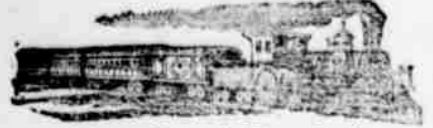
