UNDERSTANDING THE SCRIPTURES

(continued from last week)

That denominations are not members of the true vine in the Lord's teaching in John 15:1-6 is proven by another passage in the Bible. Christ said. "I am the vine." So we are talking about being members of Christ. Paul said. "There are many members, yet but one body." (I Cor. 12:20) Individuals are the members. Different bodies of people do not comprise the body of Christ, but individuals who are in Christ (Gal. 3:27).

One can be a member of the body of Christ, a branch of the true vine, without being a member of any denomination. Much misunderstanding of the Scriptures would disappear if people were seeking how to become members of Christ rather than trying to determine which denomination they should join. A great blessing of such an attitude would be the fulfilling of the Lord's prayer that "they all may be one in us" (John 17:21). People could then be together in Christ as was said of the disciples in Jerusalem; "All that believed were together..." (Acts 2:44).

There is unity in Christ. "There is one body (His church—Epit. 1:22,23), and one Spirit, even as ye are called in one hope of your calling, one Lord, one faith (not 250 different faiths), one baptism, one God and Father of all. who is over all, and through all," and in all," (Epht. 4:4-6) Denominationalism divides; Christ unites. Christ came to unite all men "in one body unto God through the cross, having slain the enmity there'by.' (Epht. 2:16) He did not come so that men might "Join the church of their choice." He came to die for His church that He might "purchase it with his own blood." (Acts 20:28)




