**AN ORDINANCE** regulating the Parking on Fifth Street in the City of Knox City along Lot No. 1, Block 51 of the original townsite and providing a penalty for violation. Declaring an Emergency, thereof.

BE IT ORDAINED by the City Commission of the City of Knox City:

- That hereafter it shall be unlawful for any person or persons to park their car or cars or other vehicles along Lot No. 1, Block No. 51 on Fifth Street, in the City of Knox City, Knox County, Texas.
- Any person or persons violating this ordinance shall upon conviction be fined in any sum of not less than One Dollar and not more than Ten Dollars.
