\$40.7 Million Dollar County Safety Improvement Program

Projects in Callahan County are included in a \$40.7 million program to increase safety and improve sections of non-Interstate highways in Texas.

District Engineer J. C. Roberts of Abilene said work to be performed under the annual program includes such things as widening of pavements and structures, reconditioning, resurfacing, providing additional surfacing, sodding and improvement of shoulders and other miscellaneous work.

The projects in Callahan County will involve only a seal coat on the existing pavement.

Fifty-seven percent of the work statewide will be on US- and State-numbered highways and 41 percent on Farm to Market Roads with two percent reserved for later assignment.

Clyde Band Booster Club Holds Meeting; Last Year's Budget Given

CLYDE — The Band Booster Club met in regular monthly meeting Monday, Oct. 8th, and business was headed by president John McClaran. There were 16 present, and as no membership drive for this year has yet begun, this was thought to be an ample crowd.

The Booster Club exists to boost the band and projects to help in the money raising for this school year were discussed. Last year's budget was also presented for public approval.

Last year the Band Booster Club raised about \$2600, and spent about \$3100 on the bands of Clyde. When the school year began last year, the Club had on hand about \$850, and this year they have on hand about \$300.

Money was raised last year mainly from the calendar and from the concession stand. Each of these raised about \$1000. Other funds were raised from membership fees and the usual money-raising projects of cookbooks and bumper stickers.

Over \$1400 was spent for new instruments which were presented free and clear to the school;

\$80 was spent to clean the drapes in the band hall; over \$300 was spent to send the band to Six Flags for their end of the year trip; over \$250 was spent for UIL awards for reserving band members, (award sweaters, jackets, etc); and an area band trip which cost in the vicinity of \$150 for those who made the Area band. Other money spent was for the junior high band picnic at the end of the year; band supplies, and paying off debts for instruments purchased in previous years.

The Band Booster Club has raised and spent on the band over \$25,000 in the past 10 years, and all those who contribute by joining the Club or purchasing a name on the calendar are very highly appreciated by the band members and boosters. A special thanks was given to the merchants who bought advertisements on the calendar.

All of the band, from the 5th graders up through high school, are trying very hard to represent Clyde Schools and Clyde so that everyone will be proud when they perform.

Immunization Clinic At Baird School Nov. 2


Homecoming Game Seats Available
