The Knox City Greyhound track field is a beehive of activity this week as Coach Jimmy Rogers, assisted by Coach Jerry Lowrey, Coach T. R. Stillbower, and Coach Charles Hibbits and members of the Greyhound track and field teams prepare for the annual invitational track meet to unfold here Saturday, March 20, at 9:30 a.m.

A Texas A&M University Extension service cotton team will present information on narrow row cotton, weed control, mechanization and insect control starting at 2:00 p.m. Wednesday, March 24 in the Munday Chamber of Commerce Meeting Room, according to county agricultural agent Herman H. Collier.
