Farm & Ranch Notes

By W. J. Bryan, County Agent

In checking livestock over the county I have found that we have a very bad infestation of lice on most cattle herds. Cattle infested with lice have a rough, coarse appearance and do not gain properly. They also rub the hair off in spots.

Lice usually are more abundant during the winter and spring when the hair is long.

Several commercial sprays are available to control lice. Good control can be secured by spraying with 5 percent DDT, 5 percent toxaphene, 3 percent lindane or 3 percent gamma B.H.C.

**THE STATE OF TEXAS**  
**KNOX COUNTY WATER CONTROL AND IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NO. 1:**  
 To the Resident, Qualified Electors of Knox County Water Control and Improvement District No. 1 Who Own Taxable Property in Said District and Who Have Duly Rendered the Same for Taxation: TAKE NOTICE that an election will be held in the District on the 26th day of March, 1935, on the proposition and at the place more particularly set forth in the election order adopted by the Board

of Directors on the 26th day of January, 1935, which is substantially as follows:  
**"RESOLUTION"**  
 By the Board of Directors of Knox County Water Control and Improvement District No. 1 Calling An Election On the Question of the Issuance of \$135,000.00 of Improvement Bonds Payable From a Pledge of Net Revenues and the Levy of Ad Valorem Taxes Adequate to Provide for Such Payment.  
 WHEREAS said District has adopted a plan for improvements designed to furnish a water system and has an expectancy of net revenues from the operation of

such system and  
 WHEREAS the plan for improvements thus adopted were prepared for the District by Engineers duly employed for such purpose, such Engineer's report being substantially as follows:

WHEREAS the Board of Directors deems it advisable to issue the bonds of said District for the purposes hereinabove mentioned; THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF KNOX COUNTY WATER CONTROL AND IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NO. 1:  
 1. That an election be held in said Knox County Water Control and Improvement District No. 1 on the 26th day of March, 1935, at which election the following proposition shall be submitted:  
 "Shall the Board of Directors of Knox County Water Control and Improvement District No. 1 be authorized to issue the bonds of said District in the sum of \$135,000.00, maturing serially in such installments as may be fixed by the Board of Directors, the maximum maturity being not more than thirty five (35) years from their date, bearing interest at a rate not to exceed four (4%) per cent per annum, for the purpose of acquiring a water supply system for said District, to be issued in accordance with and secured in the manner provided by Chapter 25, Acts of the Thirty-Ninth Legislature, 1925; Regular Session, as amended by Chapter 32, Acts of the Forty-Third Legislature, 1934; Third Called Session, secured by a pledge of the net revenues from the operation of said system and by the levy of an ad valorem tax upon all taxable property within such District sufficient in amount to pay the interest on such bonds together with an additional amount to be placed in the sinking fund sufficient to redeem and discharge such bonds at maturity?"  
 2. That said election shall be held at the Courthouse Assembly Room, Benjamin, Texas, within said District, and the following named persons are hereby appointed directors of said election: Von Ray Terry, Presiding Judge, Mrs. Ernest Allen, Judge, Mrs. J. D. Redwine, Clerk, Mrs. Claude Jenkins, Clerk.

3. That said election shall be held under the laws governing general elections except as otherwise provided by the provisions of Chapter 25, Acts of the Thirty-Ninth Legislature, 1925, Regular Session, as amended, by Chapter 32, Acts of the Forty-Third Legislature, 1934, Third Called Session and only legally qualified electors residing within said District who own taxable property in said District and who have duly rendered the same for taxation shall be qualified to vote.  
 4. The ballots of said election shall have written or printed thereon the following:  
 "FOR THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS AND THE PLEDGE OF NET REVENUES AND THE LEVY OF AD VALOREM TAXES ADEQUATE TO PROVIDE FOR THE PAYMENT THEREOF"  
 "AGAINST THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS AND THE PLEDGE OF NET REVENUES AND THE LEVY OF AD VALOREM TAXES ADEQUATE TO PROVIDE FOR THE PAYMENT THEREOF"  
 Concerning said proposition, each voter shall mark out with black ink or black pencil one of the above expressions, thus leaving the other as indicating his vote on the proposition.  
 5. Notice of said election shall be given under the hand of the President and Secretary of the Board of Directors, stating the

maximum amount of bonds to be issued and the proposed maximum interest thereon, the maximum maturity date of said bonds and the time and place of holding the election. Said notice shall be published once a week for four consecutive weeks in a newspaper having general circulation in the County in which said District is located, the first of which publications shall be at least twenty-eight days before the date of such election. Said notice further shall contain substantially the proposition to be voted upon and a summary of the engineer's estimate of the cost of the proposed improvements as shown by said Engineer's report on file in the office of the District as approved by the Board of Directors. Said notice of election also shall be posted by the Secretary at three public places within said District and on such notice shall be posted at the door
