



Reform Act of 1969 easier to qualify children as dependents, Rep. J. R. Smith Jr., IRS District Director for North Texas said.

A child now can be a dependent on the same basis as a natural child with the taxpayer as a member of the household the entire year. Effect of the Act also is to make a taxpayer a dependent exemption for a foster

child who makes \$625 or more if the child is under 19 or a full-time student and the other dependency tests are met. Previously, such a foster child could not qualify as a dependent even though all other dependency requirements were met.

A foster child is defined as one in the care of someone other than natural or adopted parents who cares for the child as his own.

I sincerely hope the elegance of a few will not mar the holiday happiness of many," the Governor said.

The Governor pointed to a chart in his office which shows traffic fatalities this year are running slightly below the number recorded last year. "We have the opportunity to reduce the number of traffic deaths in Texas this year," Gov. Smith said. "But to do so, Texas motorists must heed the safety admonitions which are being publicized through an all-out effort of newspaper, radio and television facilities in our State."

He further expressed full support of the Department of Public Safety's "Operation Motorcide," the law enforcement department's effort to prevent highway violence. The DPS has estimated 87 persons will die on Texas streets and highways during the two holiday weekends, but is planning a massive drive to help keep the toll under its own estimate.

The Governor pointed out that his office of traffic safety has sponsored drives during each of the dangerous holiday weekends during the year. He expressed the view that the statewide campaign was paying dividends. "The expression 'DRIVE FRIENDLY' is taking on a realistic meaning for Texas motorists," he said. "DRIVE FRIENDLY" is the phrase the state's traffic safety campaign has been using for the past year.

"There is ample evidence that 'DRIVE FRIENDLY' is becoming a state of mind among Texas motorists," he said. "During Thanksgiving, slightly more than 30 fatalities were recorded. Last year, 58 were killed in traffic during the same holiday weekend.

"In my view, this is confirmation that Texas drivers are more safety conscious than ever before," the Governor



Science Dept. News

With the holiday season just around the corner, the Advanced Biology students did not have a lab this week. Their labs are generally long and in order to avoid going into something new, their labs have been postponed until 1971.

Never the less, General Biology students did have a lab this week and a very technical one at that.

In order that their lab did not end in disastrous results, Mr. Winchester advised that they be specific and accurate in carrying out their procedures.

This lab involved the production of something very vital in that it makes it possible for man to exist.

No doubt the entire class held a silent debate trying to decide whether it could be anything from a solution for the common cold to a solution that produces instant snow.

Taking a deep breath, they acquired the material needed for the experiment.

Step one called for sixteen grams of a dark brown powder, probably the unknown material which in the end would play the most important role.

Next the instruction sheet called for the student to pour the brown powder into a large beaker, adding thirty-three grams of sucrose.

Once this solution was combined, the students added twenty-

five grams of a white chemical solution and stirred vigorously until the solution was completely combined. This made the material appear somewhat thick and slightly syrupy.

The next step was to add five hundred millimeters of water. Heat was applied in order to speed up a chemical reaction.

When the solution began to show signs of boiling, the material was quickly removed from the heat and poured into two separate beakers to allow cooling.

The students were then given what appeared to be two large disc-shaped tranquilizers that had been coated with sucrose crystals. In the process of making the tranquilizers, the students analyzed that considering their appearance, the tranquilizers were crisp instead of brittle.

The final step called for each student to taste the tranquilizers and the dark chemical solution. Somewhat frightened, they carried out the final step.

The experiment turned out exceptionally successful. For those of you who still may be wondering what the result was, it was hot cocoa and cookies.

This report was somewhat different from those in the past. The main purpose was to show that in case the labs sound like a drudge at times, they are not. In reality they involve much seriousness, but they can be fun.

On behalf of Mr. Winchester and the entire Science Department, may the holiday season bless each and everyone of you with happy tidings.


