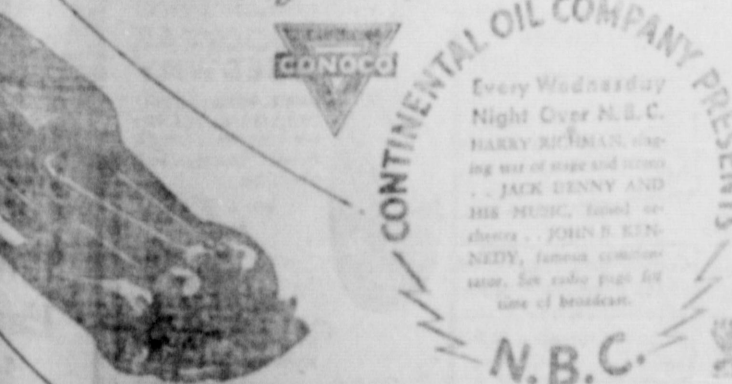

McFarlane Speaks In Munday

Ask Your Support for Second Term for Congress on his past Year and Half Record

Congressman W. D. McFarlane spoke in Munday Wednesday evening in the interest of his candidacy for re-election to Congress from the 17th District for a second term. He was introduced by Judge K. F. Billingsley, who expressed the opinion that it would be a great benefit to the State if McFarlane were re-elected. Commerce' Legislation. Other commendations quoted were from Joe Stouffman, Texas representative of the Brotherhood of Railroad Trainmen, and William Mitchell, nationally known aircraft authority.

Mr. McFarlane stated that during his entire life he had answered every mail-call, and had voted upon 174 bills before Congress, and from these 174 votes his opponent had found only two votes upon which they could base criticism, and stated that he felt that he had made a mistake in voting as he had done on the other two votes, admitted that he had voted right on 168 out of the

Mr. McFarlane expressed regret that the late adjournment of Congress had prevented him from making a thorough canvass of the entire district and give an accounting of his services, and asked that the voters investigate thoroughly and charge that might be serving at the last minute, and closed by asking his friends to give him any assistance possible in the few days that are left before the election.

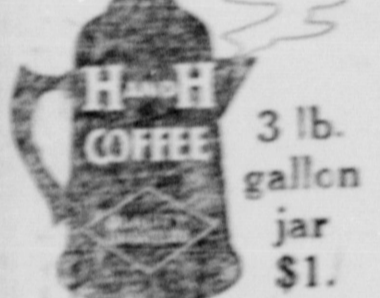
