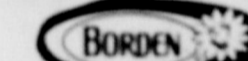

## Three Accidents Occur In July

The Texas Highway Patrol investigated six accidents on rural highways in Knox County during the month of July, according to Sergeant J. W. Garner, Highway Patrol supervisor of this area.  
These crashes resulted in no persons killed, and three persons injured.  
The rural traffic accident summary for this county during the first seven months of 1972 shows a total of 39 accidents resulting in four persons killed, and 21 persons injured.  
Region 5 of the Texas Department of Public Safety shows a total in July, of 713 accidents resulting in 34 persons killed and 388 persons injured as compared to the same month in 1971 with 564 accidents resulting in 38 persons killed and 324 persons injured.
