Business Is Good for September Let's Go

Roger W. Babson, the famed statistician predicts a definite business pickup this fall. You will recall a year ago Mr. Babson was pessimistic regarding the general business outlook and predicted a sharp deciline. He stated that the public was so overly optimistic at that time that a decline was ineviable. In his recen address he says wth "the humble spirit prevailing today a turn for he better is sure to come." Mr. Babson continues and states that his reason for his present tatement are: "During he last year cosumption has falle off only about 10 per cent, taning all lines of industries and all sectlos of the country. Yet, while con sumption has fallen off only 10 per cent, production has fallen off 20 per cent, and trasportation of goods has fallen off 30 per cent.

"This means that the inventories of manufacturers, jobbers and retailers are becoming abnormally low. If consumption, production and transportation had fallen off about the same percetage there might be no logical reason for improving business this fall. Under the existing circumstances, however, it is very possible that there may soon be a stampe de of orders and congestion of freight in certain lines and sections. It is just as evident today that business is now bound to improve as it was evident a year ago that the high pace of early 1929 could not keep up.

School Enrollment Increases

Physical Training Good for Pupils

Since the opening day of school, September the first, the enrollment has increased from 354 to 377 .At the close of the first day of school 116 pupils were registered for high school. Tuesday the superincedent stated that he had entolled 125 hew. however, two of this number have since withdrawn; one with the inteption of attending the Sun Sec in Dallas and the other going to Colorado. This leaves a totl of 123 in high school now, 17 of which are in the graduating class.

The school work is getting off fine now, stated Mr. Cloud. All the teachers are getting along well with their work and the boys and girls are getting into their stury well.

The school is asking for two ane one half credits this year; two in Spanish, first and second year, which is under the instruction of Mr. Cotman; and one half in Physology. taught by Miss Moorehouse.

As a requirement of the State Board of Education, physical training is being taught in the school this year. This comes at 10:15 to 10: 30 each morning with the entire stud ent body on the ground. The first five grades are instructed by their own teachers. The girls of the sixth and seventh and all the high, school girls are instructed by Miss Moorehouse, Mrs. Emory and Mrs. Cash. The boys of the sirth seventh and eight are instructed by Mr. Underwood and in the ninth, tenth and eleventh by Mr. Cotman

Although they have been receiving instructions in physical training only a short while the children are getting to where they can go together pretty good now. When they learn their exercises and how to keep time together the xrciss will be pretty to look at. The pupils seem to enjoy this training, said Mr. Cloud, and it will do them much good.

The teachers also seem to enjoy the few minutes out.
