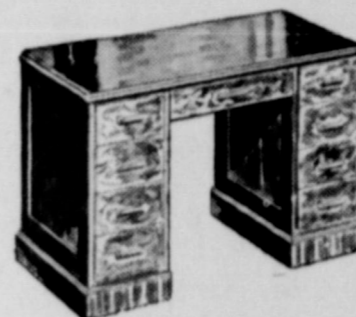

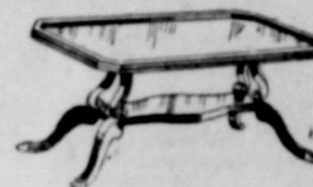

AUTO-BOX CARS, LOCOMOTIVES

Fred G. Gurley, president of the Santa Fe, announces that company has placed orders for 500 auto-box cars of the new all steel victory design and has also placed order for ten additional fifty-four hundred horsepower Diesel freight locomotives. When this and other Diesel freight locomotives now on order are received the Santa Fe will have a fleet of 78 of these huge locomotives by far the largest fleet in use on any railroad.

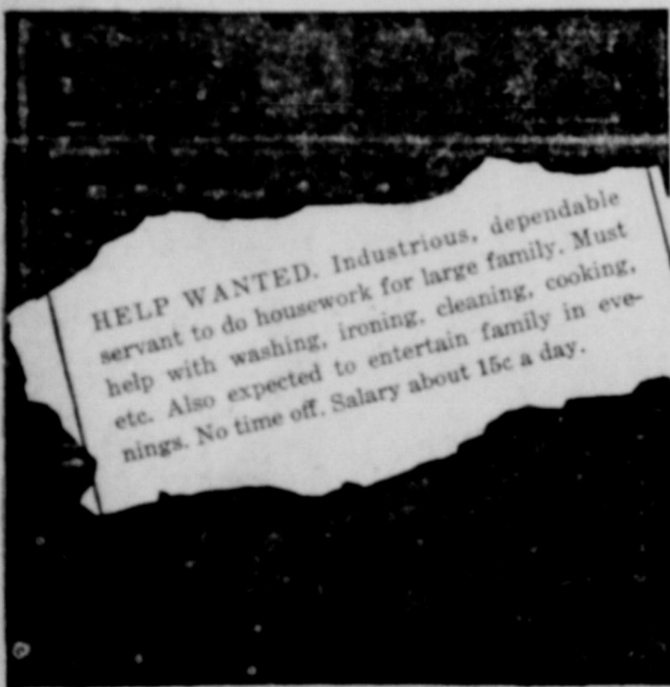
