Soil Conservation District Joins With Wildlife In Observing Wildlife Week

Conservation districts, the Soil Conservation Service and other agencies are joining with the National Wildlife Federation to observe National Wildlife Week, March 19-25, according to Arche Lieb, Soil Conservation Service, Knox City.

The theme, "This is Your Land," emphasizes the responsibility that all citizens have in protecting and improving the land and other natural resources, thus benefiting wildlife.

For years, the SCS has helped landowners through local conservation districts apply practices that benefit wildlife. These include grassed waterways, field borders of grasses and shrubs range and pasture development, farm ponds, watershed protection and flood prevention.

SCS biologists, conservationists, and other specialists assist farmers and ranchers to make decisions in the proper use of their land. Measures to improve wildlife cover were applied on nearly 200,000 acres of Texas lands last year.

Some farmers have found that

land unsuited to producing row crops or pasture can be used profitably for farm ponds and to provide food and habitat for small game. Fish and wildlife are providing many Texas farmers extra income, Lieb said.

Nationally, almost three million acres of land have been converted to wildlife and recreation from cropland and other uses since 1962.

The 194 soil and water conservation districts in Texas provide technical help in planning and applying conservation measures to public-owned land as well as that privately owned, according to Lieb.

Lawrence D. Smith Is Appointed Rural Development Officer of FHA

L. J. Cappelman, State Director of Farmers Home Administration in Texas, today announced the appointment of Lawrence D. Smith as Rural Development Officer. The position of Rural Development Officer is a new one created as a high level staff position in the Farmers Home Administration to implement recently authorized programs.

Mr. Smith will give consulting and coordinative leadership in the administration of the "Outreach" functions of development in rural areas, designed to assure that residents in rural communities are aware of, and receive benefits of Federal, State and local program services.

In making the announcement, Cappelman said it was necessary to select the best qualified individual with extensive knowledge not only of the Farmers Home Administration, but other Government agencies as well.

In his new assignment, Mr. Smith will be responsible for working closely with Federal, State and local Governmental Agencies in making benefits available to communities and individuals in rural areas of the State through the "Outreach" programs.

Mr. Smith was graduated from Texas A&M University in 1935, and holds an MS degree from the University of Tennessee. He has been Assistant State Director for the Farmers Home Administration in Texas since June 30, 1957. Other assignments in the Agency have included Chief, Program Operations, Operating Loan Specialist and Farm Management Specialist.
