

**RECIPE OF THE WEEK**

**Cranberry Puddings**  
Broadcast: October 4, 1952

1 package vanilla pudding powder  
1 cup Fat Milk  
1 cup water  
1 teaspoon vanilla  
1 cup washed, filled cranberry sauce, cooked or canned

Put pudding powder into a 1 1/2-quart saucepan. Stir in gradually until smooth a mixture of the milk and water. Cook and stir over medium heat until mixture boils and is thick, about 5 minutes. Remove from heat and stir in vanilla. Cover and cool thoroughly. Fill 4 dessert dishes with layers of pudding and equal parts of cranberry sauce. Chill. Keep chilled until ready to serve.
