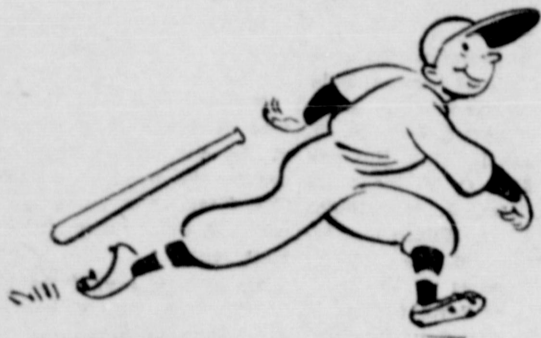

PREPARE FOR WAR ON BUGS

How about bugs? Are there any in your garden? Maybe the cut worm has cut your cabbage and tomato plants

To wage war on Cabbage bugs, dissolve 1 pound of soap in 2-3 gallons of water and spray the plants every ten days

Lice can quickly destroy such plants as mustard, turnips, cucumbers, canteloupes, and watermelons

A few cents spent for bug dope may save a hundred dollars worth of vegetables
