### **Questions** And **Answers On IRS Tax Matters**

This Column of questions and answers on federal tax maters is provided by the local office of the U. S. Internal Revenue Service and is published as a public service to taxpayers. The column answers questions most frequently asked by taxpayers.

Q-I filed for my refund a month ago. Isn't it about time I received it?

A-No, it is still too soon. Look for the refund to arrive anytime after the first of June. Some returns filed at the deadline may not be processed completely till the end of June. If your return is incomp'ete or contains an error, processing will take longer. There will also be a delay if the return is selected for audit before the refund is issued.
