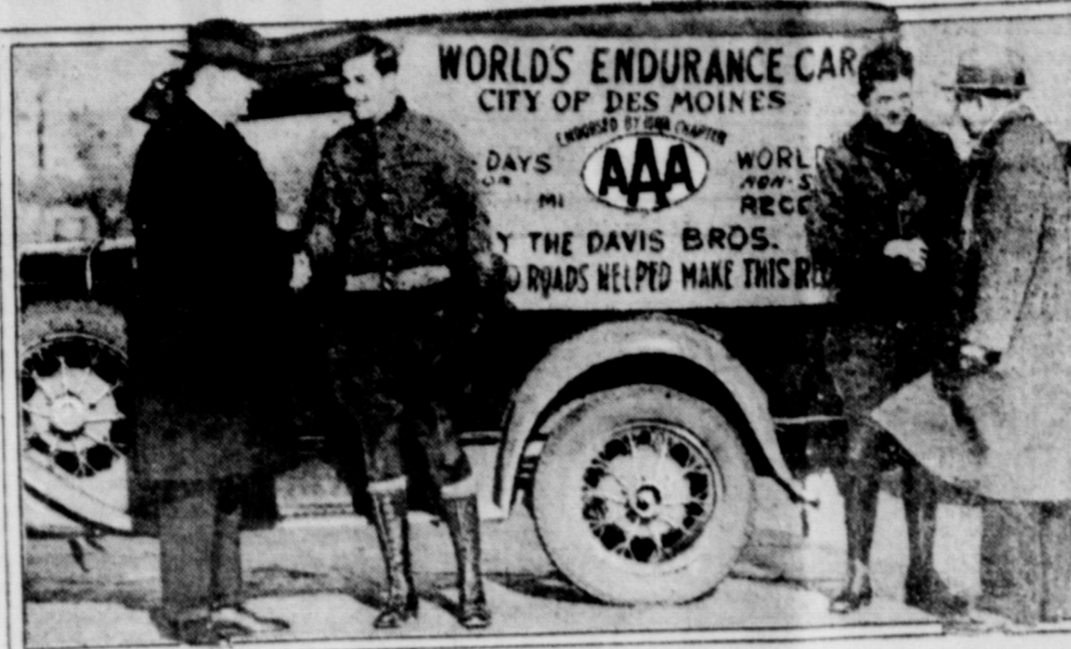

Iowa Brothers Set New World's Record in Ford

IOWA state officials and civic leaders witnessed the establishment of a new world's non-motor, non-wheel stop automobile endurance record recently, when Ralph and Roland Davis, brothers, brought their Model A Ford to a halt at the east entrance of the state capitol in Des Moines after 2,774 hours and 46 minutes of continuous driving.

When Governor Hammill, standing with Walter Ferrell of the American Automobile Association, gave the signal to stop, the Ford had traveled a total of 47,123.8 miles over all sorts of roads in all sorts of weather and had exceeded by 28,680 miles and more than 2,335 hours the American non-stop endurance record which, therefore, officially recognized, was made by a much heavier car under almost ideal conditions on the Indianapolis speedway. In the course of the endurance run, the car, known as "The City of Des Moines," covered practically the entire state of Iowa.

Engineers who examined the Ford at the conclusion of the run asserted that neither engine nor chassis showed evidence of the grueling strains to which they were subjected during the 115 days of continuous driving. Both apparently, according to the engineers, would have been good for another 50,000 miles or more.

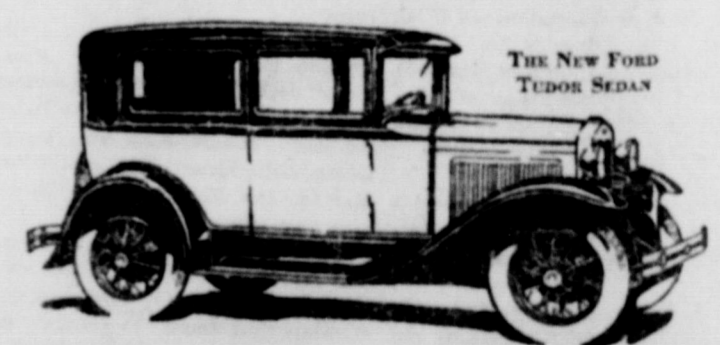

Much Property Loss In Texas Due To Lack of Terracing Farm Lands

Houston, Texas, Feb. 28.—"During the last four years more Texas land has been protected from washing than since when the memory of man runneth not to the contrary," stated A. K. Short, conservation and terracing agent for the Federal Land Bank of this city, here today. Mr. Short has just made a compilation of the terracing work which has been undertaken at the instance of the Texas State Agricultural College, the state experiment stations, the Federal Land Bank of Houston, chambers of commerce and others interested in the great work of conserving agricultural land in this state.

"From 1927 to 1931, 2,580,620 acres additional of land were protected. This land is slightly more in amount than was protected during all previous time, and makes the total acreage of Texas farm land protected by terraces or contour farming 4,213,415 acres of approximately 15 per cent of all land in cultivation within the state."

"Because of the constructive work done by the state experiment station at Spar and the general interest which has been aroused throughout the state to the value of soil and water conservation, the terracing and contour work in Texas is attaining nation-wide recognition and it is the direct cause of the Buchanan amendment to the church, and Bro. Hinderlight of the Presbyterian church.

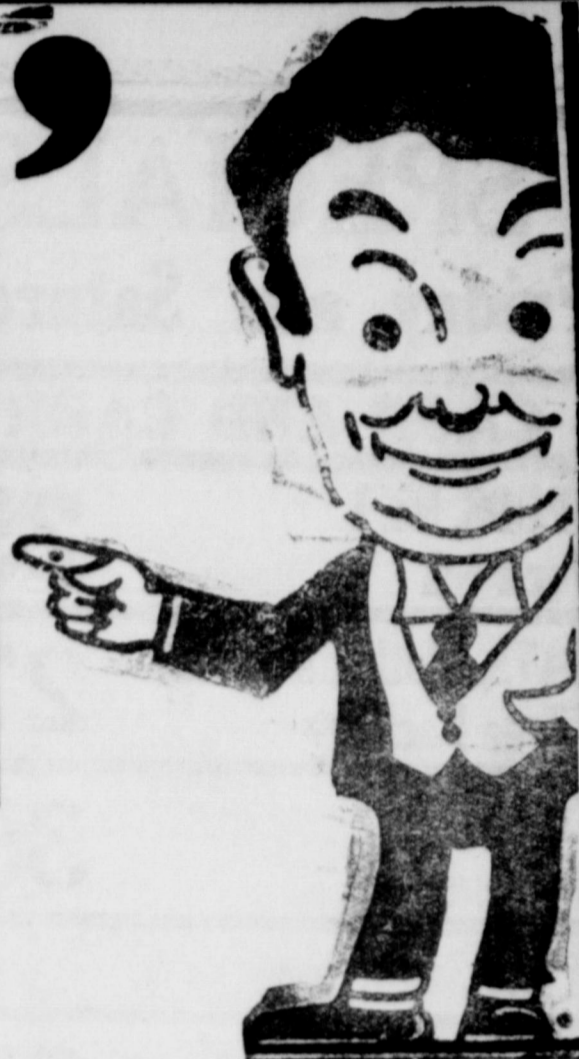
