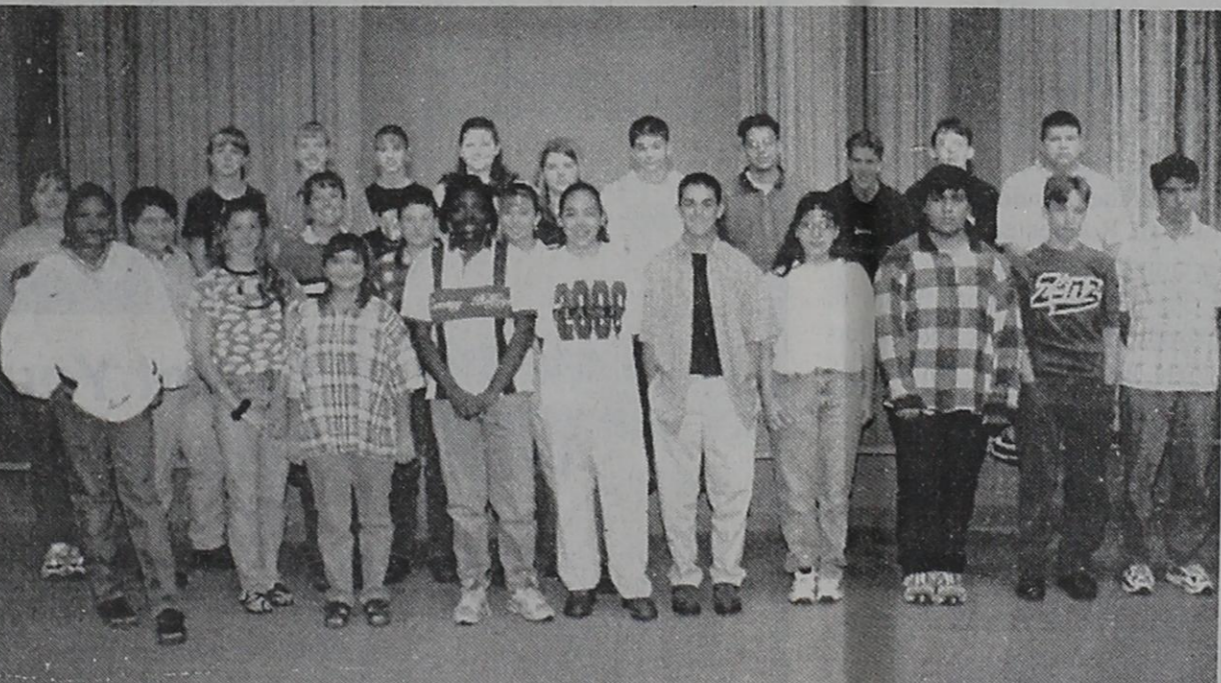

## Cotton Insect I.D. Training to be held April 23

The Knox County Boll Weevil Association, several chemical companies and the Knox County Extension Service are teaming up to sponsor a cotton insect identification training. This insect I.D. training will be held Thursday, April 23 at the K.C. Hall in Rhineland beginning at 7:00 p.m.

The training will be conducted by Emory Boring, Texas Agricultural Extension Service Entomologist in Vernon. Topics to be covered include: Cotton Insect Pest I.D., Beneficial Insect I.D., Cultural Pest Management and Cotton Pest Management Practices for 1998.

A free meal will be served for those registering by April 17. This program will offer one CEU in Integrated Pest Management for those who have a private, commercial or non-commercial applicators license with the Texas Department of Agriculture.

Some of the types of industries that could have possibilities in our area could be dog and cat foods, hats, caps, millinery, mobile home production, metal sanitary ware, engine electric equipment, mens and boys underwear and travel trailers and camper production.

The Rolling Plains Industrial Foundation will include communities of Anson, Stamford, Hamlin, Hawley, Haskell, Knox City, Munday, Aspermont, Roby and Rotan.

Attending the organizational program on Thursday, April 2 from the Munday area were: Dr. David Neal representing the Industrial Foundation of Munday, Mr. Jay White from the Munday City Council, and Mrs. Lenora Hammett and Mrs. Cynthia White representing the Munday Chamber of Commerce and Agriculture.

## Keep Texas Beautiful license plates available

The Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) announces the availability of Keep Texas Beautiful specialty license plates for passenger vehicles and light trucks.

The license plates cost \$50 annually in addition to the regular registration fee. (Personalizing the specialty plates costs an additional \$40 annually.)

These specialty plates feature the "Don't Mess With Texas" slogan and the words, "Keep Texas Beautiful."

House Bill 2681, passed by the 75th Legislature, created the Keep Texas Beautiful license plate. TxDOT will deposit \$5 from the sale of each set to the State Highway Fund to cover administrative costs. The department will use the remaining \$45 for the purpose of supporting TxDOT's litter prevention and community beautification programs.

Applications are available at county tax assessor collector offices statewide.

The 75th Legislature created 12 new specialty plates. There are now 79 specialty license plates available to the general public. In some cases, applicants for special plates must meet certain qualifications as specified by law.

License plate issuance is administered by TxDOT's Vehicle Titles and Registration Division. There are 15.3 million vehicles registered in Texas.

## Mogul Mania resurfaces in support of Theatre Arts Department

Not only does football, basketball, track and band rule in Munday, Texas but Munday High School's Theatre Arts Department has a long tradition of excellence that is being kept alive once again this academic year. In 1993 the Munday High School Theatre Arts Department won the state championship and they have gone as far as the Regional competition five times in the last twenty years.

And after a successful sports season "Mogul Mania" is yet again running rampant as students and the community back a troupe of young actors and actresses who are battling the odds and staying determined to take their one-act play up the UIL ladder of success.

"Nevermore", the life story of Edgar Allen Poe - written by Julia Wiles, is a spell-binding portrait of the mystifying Mr. Poe. The cast and crew members total twenty-one students - the maximum allowed under UIL guidelines.

Preparations began for the play some three months ago with the cast and crew members perfecting their skills to a shining polish. However, a wrench was thrown into the works by the abrupt exit of the plays main character role which was then portrayed by senior student Wes Stein. Stein made his departure after the students had advanced from district competition to the area level of competition and had only nine short days to prepare for that segment of the JIL event.

While students, their instructor and other adult leaders were skeptical of the future of the play the students were determined. At that time a young man who had no acting experience stepped to home plate and took a giant swing - he

propelled himself into the leading role of Edgar Allen Poe and had less than nine days to learn the entire performance, cues and directions.

With Tony Cunniff drilling away at the lead role the other students rallied around and strengthened their own skills while lending a hand to the new leading man. Community support for the students also poured in to the Theatre Arts Department in the form of letters and cards of encouragement from area citizens and also kind words and wishes.

Within five short days Cunniff had the play down in its entirety and began the act of polishing his character. The days spent between the district competition and the area competition were filled with students keeping their other class grades up and still maximizing their time for play practice.

The cast and crew tried to ease their stage butterflies by performing the play for other students and to the community - these were Cunniff's first time before an audience.

Thursday, April 9 arrived and the cast, crew and townspeople awaited the Area 3 One Act Play competition with baited breath. The auditorium at Munday High School was filled with community supporters and supporters from the three other schools who were in town to present their own one act plays for the competition. Those schools were Rule, Throckmorton and Aspermont.

At 5:30 the lights dimmed and Rule High School presented *The Secret Affairs of Mildred Wild* by Paul Zindel. This was followed by Throckmorton High School with *S/F The Foreigner* by Larry Shue and then Munday High School.

Following Munday High School was Aspermont High School with *Limbo* by Jerome McDonough.

The judge for the competition was Mr. Gregory Schwabb from Sul Ross University in Alpine. He is a member of the Texas Educational Theatre Association Adjudicators' organization which is dedicated to the development of quality theatre education in Texas schools.

At the close of the performances from the four schools the judge made his determination. Aspermont High School was disqualified because their selection ran thirty seconds longer than the required UIL length timetable. The two schools selected to advance to the Regional Competition scheduled for April 23 and 24 in Levelland were Throckmorton and Munday.

Barbi Cox was hired to replace Linda Edrington who is retiring at the end of this school year. Paula Cowser was hired to replace Nancy Lucas as special education teacher at the elementary school.

The next regular board meeting will be May 14th.

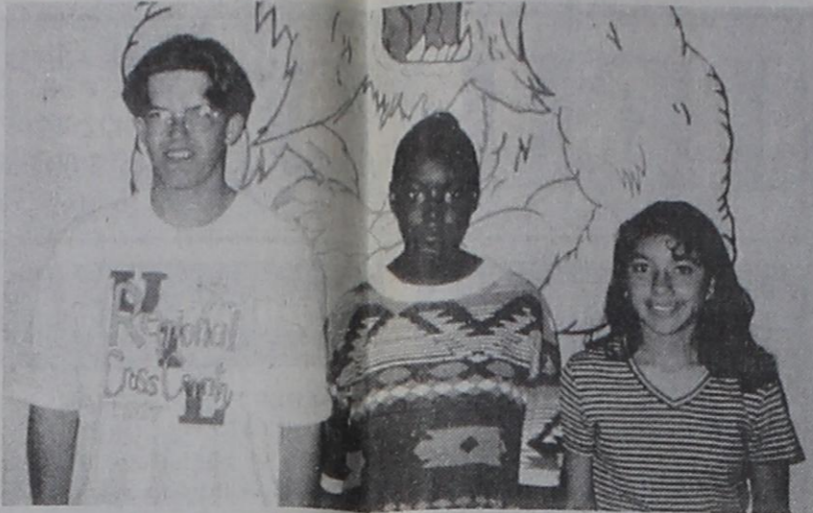
