#### Reading at Munday Elementary -**Practice Makes Perfect**

> As a teacher it is really a thrill to watch a child so involved in a book that he or she: 1. Can vividly visualize what is happening; 2. Gets tickled and enjoys a good laugh at a character or situation; 3. Catches such a satisfying experience from the book that he or she wants to buy it to read again and again: and, 4. Enthusiastically discusses with a friend the details of a book just read when checking out other books.


> The enjoyment of words, pictures, ideas, thoughts, and feelings drawn in the minds of children from reading books is immeasurable.
