# Knowlege is the Key to Survival in Tornado Alley This Spring

The weather is not only deceiving at times but it also cries wolf. Many Preference is given to Osborne, residents feels that even though the siren is blowing a warning cry of potentially devastating weather, that nine times out of ten it will only be wind and rain. While that scenario is true most of the time we should not become so complacent that we ignore the warning all altogether. This article presents facts that should help you understand the phenomenon of tornadoes and what you can expect to happen before, during and after an outbreak.

Tornadoes form under a certain set of weather conditions in which three very different types of air come together in a certain way. A warm layer lies near the ground with strong south winds and humidity. In the upper atmosphere lies colder air and strong west or southwest winds. Temperature and moisture differences between the surface and the upper levels create what we call instability...while the change in wind with height is known as wind shear.

Between the warm moist air at low levels and the cool dry air aloft a third layer of very warm dry air is established This layer acts as a cap and allows the atmosphere to

The lifting causes the "cap" to become removed and begins to set the stage for explosive - tornadoes are too small to be thunderstorm development as resolved on the 88D radar. It is the strong updrafts develop. If the updraft and the surrounding winds both at storm level and near the surface cause the updraft to begin rotating - a tornado is born.

The Knox Prairie area is well suited to bring all of these ingredients together, as is the rest of "tornado alley." The main factors are the Rocky Mountains to the west, the Gulf of Mexico to the south, and a terrain that slopes downward from west to east.

Southern winds bring in warm moisture of the Gulf at low levels, very warm dry air form over the higher elevations to the west and becomes the cap as it spreads eastward over the moist Gulf air.

Where the dry air and the Gulf air meet the ground a dryline is formed. A storm system moving out of the southern plains or Rockies may push the dry line eastward which can produce severe thunderstorms or tornadoes along the dry line or in the moist air just ahead of it.

During times of possibly severe weather the National Weather Service contacts the local 911 office. Local storm spotters are put warm further...making the air even on alert and if conditions worsen

The Knox Prairie has certainly more unstable. When a storm they will be launched into activity. precede a tornado. Doppler radar shows "reflectivity" and "velocity" spotters job to watch for the tornadoes that may eventually affect our community. The NWS will issue a watch or a warning. A watch may cover an area of 20,000 square miles or so and tells us that there is a potential for even one

> tornadic thunderstorm. A warning is issued when a funnel has been sighted or that a mesocyclone (often the parent of a tornado) has been detected by radar. If a tornado or extreme wind conditions are detected by watchers then the local fire department and city employees will sound the siren, thus warning that approaching conditions may be hazardous to residents. One important fact to remember is that in Munday there will never be a siren blown to signal an all clear condition. If Munday residents hear the siren it is to signal the possibility of damaging weather conditions - not that the conditions have improved.

Also in Munday it is important for warnings to be taken into consideration as quickly as





# Minding Your Own Business

# Who do you call when you need legal advice?

It is common practice when You're starting or run- for: ning a business to try to save every nickel you can. However, there are some areas where saving a few dollars may cost hundreds or even thousands on down the road. Seeking sound legal advice is often one of those

I find that not only do pre-start-up entrepreneurs struggle with the issue of legal advice but also veteran business owners grapple with this issue as well. The answer to the question of whom to call for legal advice is both easy and difficult. The easy answer: call an attorney. The difficult part: which firm and which attorney?

In this column, I want to address three basic legal issues. First, why should you work with an attorney? Second, how do you find a good attorney? And finally, how can you minimize legal costs?

#### Why have a legal partner?

I've stated in previous columns that business owners need external partners or advisors to help them through difficult problems or uncharted territory. Attorneys, tax advisors and bankers are common external partners.

A good small-business attorney can help protect you and your assets from numerous business losses. Your legal partner can keep you out of trouble with employees, government regulations, vendors and customers. He or she can assist you with real estate purchases, legal structures, contracts and personnel policy issues.

#### Finding the right attorney

Selecting the right legal partner may not be as challenging as you think. You can call your state's bar association, consult legal directories or use your local yellow

My favorite method is to seek referrals from business friends and acquaintances. I call a few business associates. When the same name comes up a few times, I start with that firm or attorney. Remember, selecting an attorney is a personal issue. Find a person you're comfortable with and who has experience in small-business

· A positive attitude. I want to work with an attorney who can not only point out the legal problems but also propose positive, practical solutions.

· Common sense explanations. While attorneys are trained to work in "legalese," I expect simple, concise terms and everyday language when we talk.

• Respect for my business. Even though my business is small now, I don't expect it to stay that way. I want a partner who wants my business now and will help me grow into a bigger, better client.

· Broad-based experience. I want a partner with a broad, generalized knowledge of business law who won't hesitate to bring in a "specialist" if needed.

#### Saving money

Attorneys usually sell their knowledge, experience and skills by the hour. Charges vary from \$50 to \$500 per hour and more. My advice to small-business owners is to buy only the hours you need. Good friend, good relationship aside, it's still your money.

Here are some ways to lower your legal costs: • Don't visit or call your attorney until you gather all the facts on the issue you wish to discuss.

Write down notes and questions prior to your meetings

• Be honest with your attorney and give him or her all the facts both good and bad.

•Keep good records and take all related papers to meet-

· Call your attorney early if you see a problem develop-


Finally, as you build your legal relationship, remember that no attorney can guarantee legal outcomes. However, having a legal partner in your corner does improve the odds of your success
