ments to deficient bridges on city streets and county roads across Texas received preliminary ap-
proval today form the Texas Transproval today form the Texas Trans-
portation Commission. portation Commission.
The plan, along with recent funding increases, is expected to triple the number of deficient bridges that are upgraded each year and provide local communities a way o stretch their limited transportation dollars, according to state ransportation officials.
The result, according to state officials, will be improved safety and mobility for motorists by bringing more of the 7,200 deficient bridges on city and county roads up to minimum standard to carry a

comment period, the bridge plan could get final approval by the ommission late this summer. One aspect of the plan will alow the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) to waive the local match for a bridge project on a city street or county road. In return, local officials must commit to roll the saving into improvements to o

This fist phase, the center arch, will be dedicated tentatively September 1, or a date to be announced. Three months later on November 11, Veterans Day the completed monument with all eight columns engraved with the $\mathbf{2 0 0 0}$ plus names will be dedicated. September 1,2000 is the last date for finalizing names in time for the dedication of the second phase of the monument.
