Cotton Mills Have Shipments From This Area

Munday territory Acala Eight cotton has been shipped to south-eastern mills under the One Variety Cotton Improvement program, F. B. Phinizy announced today. 2946 bales have been shipped from the compress in Seymour to mills in Georgia and North Carolina. The remaining 2800 bales purchased under this program will be shipped before February 1st.

This cotton is being shipped to the southeastern mills to advertise the One Variety Cotton produced in the Munday territory under a program sponsored by the U. S. Department of Agriculture, Mr. Rice told The Munday Times.

In addition to the advertising which this cotton will receive, the program has brought at least \$9000 into this community, above the loan which was in effect this Fall. The farmers who sold through this program have received an average of \$1.60 per bale above the loan.

The average price received by farmers under this program was ten cents, as compared with eight eighty-five in Knox City and nine cents in Weinert. About 450 Knox county farmers sold their one variety Acala cotton through this program.

Many farmers in this community received more than 10.20. For example, Mr. E. H. Nelson averaged 10.20 for 108 bales. Emil Jakubec made a sale for 11.47, which brought the best price on the program.
