Clyde Bulldogs gave up a first quarter touchdown on a blocked kick to the Roscoe Plowboys, but came back strong to win a 15-6 verdict.

About mid-way of the first quarter Roscoe rushed the Clyde punter, blocked the kick and recovered for the TD.

A pass for conversion failed. Clyde's first score came with only a minute and a half left in the second quarter. Fullback David Ramos scored from a yard out, climaxing a 60-yard drive. Tommy Cook kicked the extra point, making the score 7-6 at half-time.

The Bulldogs final score came near the end of the third quarter. Back Alton Brannan scored from one yard out, ending a drive starting at mid-field. A pass from Cook to left end McClusky was good for two points making the score 15-6.

Clyde Bulldogs will meet the Wylie Bulldogs at 8 p. m. tonight at the Clyde Stadium. Wylie played a 14-14 tie with Eldorado Eagles last Friday night at Wylie.

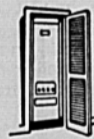

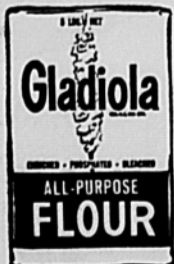
