





FARMHOUSE SPECIALS Housing experts agree on five features that every-well plan-

ned farmhouse should have. Mrs. Bernice Claytor, extension home management specialist of Texas A. & M. College, cut down the amount of storsays these features have been named "Farmhouse Specials" who is in charge of housing and in the USDA's Bureau of Human Nutrition and Home Economics.

Briefly, the five features are: 1) Entrance to both living and work rooms convenient to the main driveway, which also should be convenient to the farm buildings.

2) A well-located kitchen, with a view of the drive and farm buildings. "This feature has a number of advantages," Mrs. Thye says. "The housewife can see any visitors arriving, keep in touch with the children outdoors and have a watchful eye on the farmstead when the men are in the fields." 3) Good traffic lane, so that all parts of the house may be

reached without passing through the kitchen work areas and other centers of activity. 4) Adequate work areas for

preparing and preserving food. 5) Adequate dining area in a pleasant place, with enough space to serve and eat regular

"These farmhouse specials are important in any farm and ranch home, whether in Texas or in some other part of the country," Mrs. Claytor points out. "They are also points to be considered in building a home in

In keeping with the terms of the legislation creating the Texas Veterans' Land Board, its administration and operating policies will be kept as simple as the problems of this huge program will permit.

The fact that approximately 13,000 veterans have already contacted this office for information on the working details of the plan indicates the commendable desire of veterans to own a farm or ranch home under the idea originally conceived by the author five years ago.

#### Farmers Urged To Seek Benefits Of Smith-Doxev Act

Cotton farmers in organized improvement groups are urged to file their applications for benefits due them under the Smith-Doxey Act as soon as they have planted their crops.

"This is because it takes time for groups to make arrangements for having samples taken and submitted to the classifying office," says Mr. H. J. Matjowsky, who is in charge of the Abilene classing office of the Cotton Branch, Production and Marketing Adimistration, U. S. Department of Agriculture, said

He explained that it takes at least 15 days to process applications and then deliver supplies to gins, warehouses, compresses or other agencies approved to take samples.

Groups that file their application as soon as their cotton is planted will be sure of getting hem approved in plenty of time to get their first bale classed. Cotton is classed without cost for farmers belonging to organized improvement groups under the Smith-Doxey Act.

Applications for this service should be sent to the U.S. Department of Agriculture, PMA, Cotton Branch, P. O. Box 2001, Abilene, Texas. Also, they can be secured from this office, the county PMA office, county agent or local ginner.
