There has developed a habit of blaming Congress for anything and everything. Congress, as a collective body, is indefinite enough to be censured and abused with impunity. However, as a matter of fact, Congress has come pretty close to expressing the voice of the people, and if, upon occasions, it fails to do so the remedy presents itself every two years.

#### THE JOYFUL HARVEST

The harvest season has arrived and farmers everywhere are reaping and gathering their crops.

Ordinarily, it is time of rejoicing over bountiful crops, of thanksgiving for the bounties of nature and gratitude for the food for a coming year.

#### LIFE INSURANCE GAINS

Few people realize the tremendous amount of life insurance in effect in the United States. The Department of Commerce reports that the total amount represented by outstanding policies was increased by more than a billion dollars during the first six months of 1931.

Notwithstanding the depression life insurance protection made a substantial gain during these six months. It is estimated that disbursements to policy holders and beneficiaries during the same period amounted to at least a billion dollars. This comes, of course, as a result of the thrift and investment of citizens in this form of protection in previous years.

As far as possible, every citizen should try to carry some insurance. It would be well, however, if some method could be found to provide this insurance at a lower cost, as, for example, the savings-bank-insurance plan working so successfully in Massachusetts. Every encouragement should be given to citizens to protect their dependents in the case of premature death and society in general is interested, because, otherwise, these dependents will constitute charges on society for their care.

"Fraud orders are issued daily for hundreds of different 'tricks.'" The principal offenders are those operating medical, oil stock selling, and so-called "work-at-home" schemes by mail. Activities of concern selling worthless oil stock call for numerous investigations by the Department, and issuance of orders closing the mails to many such promoters and concerns. The pernicious trade in nostrums and worthless alleged curative devices continues, and during the last year a considerable number of promoters and concerns operating such schemes were denied use of the mails.

"The efforts of the Department in curbing these activities have undoubtedly resulted in saving millions of dollars to the small investor. If the American public would realize the illegitimacy of such enterprises, and refrain from subscribing to fraudulent schemes, it would save millions of dollars each year, and greatly simplify the Department's task of enforcing postal laws forbidding that mails be used for fraudulent enterprises."

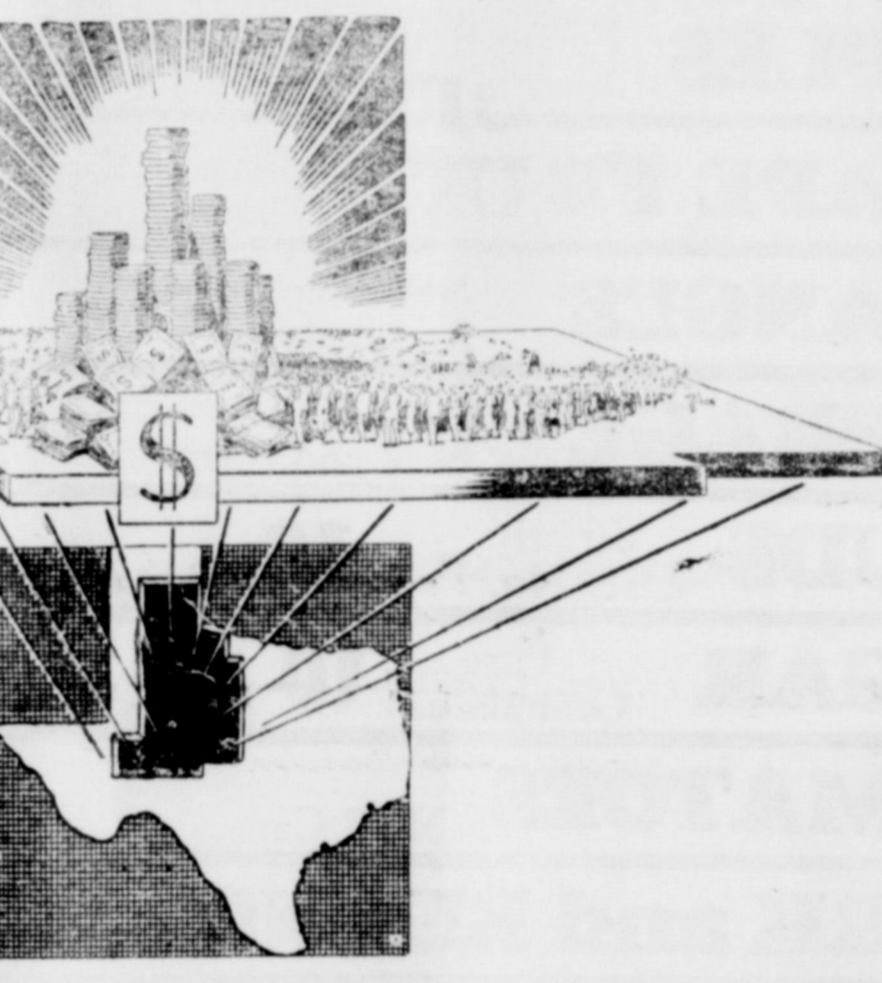

### "CHICKEN POX"

A disease that attack poultry. A great many of the farm poultry flocks in and around Munday right at present are infected with a disease known as, "Chicken Pox", this disease not only takes a high death rate but checks laying, birds go off feed, and are left in a weakened condition thereby subjecting them to other diseases such as Roup and infectious bronchitis.

Cause: Chicken pox is caused by a filterable virus in the blood of the bird, although secondary invading organisms may enter into the development of the lesions. Another disease associated with chicken pox is diphtheria, the same germ or virus causing both the formation of warts or pox nodules on the head and the cheesy patches in the mouth and eyes which are characteristic of diphtheria. This disease is strictly infectious and never develops as a result of exposure to dampness and drafts alone, although these conditions favor its spread and tend to increase its malignancy. This disease is spread from one flock to another by sparrows, pigeons and other wild birds, bringing poultry from an infected flock to the home flock, and can even be carried on the feet of man or beast.

Symptoms: Small blister like growths of a yellowish color appear on the comb, wattles or skin of the head. Later these sores become crusty and dry and are covered with dark brown scabs. There is inactivity, fever, sneezing and coughing. The eyes are watery and, as the disease progresses, the eyelids may become stuck together or very much enlarged. The sinuses become infected, causing the face to swell. Diarrhea is frequently present. Usually there is a nasal discharge. The bird has no inclination, or cannot see, to eat. Death is frequently caused by the stoppage of the windpipe, due to the inflammation and mucus which collects there.

The disease may appear in three forms. Cankers may be present on the inside lining of the mouth without any pox sores on the head, or the sores may come on the head without the cankers on the inside, or both may be present. Symptoms may appear from three to fifteen days after exposure and birds may die within two or three days after showing signs of the disease. The blisters or pox sores appear from the size of a pin head to the size of a bean.

Treatment: Birds most seriously affected be removed to comfortable well-ventilated rooms. The masses of exudate and cankers in the throat should be removed with forceps, or a splinter of wood. The sore places a splinter of wood. The sore places in the throat and the sores on the outside removed carefully and painted with tincture of iodine. Treatment repeated every two to four days as long as it is necessary. If necessary the eyes may be washed out with a 10% solution of argyrol. Temporary relief in breathing may be obtained by submitting the birds to vapor treatment with some coal tar product like creolin, turpentine or Vicks vapor rub. Each of the isolated birds should be given one-half teaspoonful of epsom salts in a little water once or twice a week. The whole flock should have a dose of epsom salts at the rate of one pound to reach 100 to 125 adult birds inasmuch water as they will consume in three to four hours. Potassium permanganate or some good disinfectant should be used in the drinking water.

Vaccination for chicken pox in addition to the local iodine treatment will hasten recovery and decrease the loss from death. Vaccination is not advised unless the sanitary measures can be carefully carried out, and unless the disease is in the flock. This does not carry permanent immunity, good for only a few months. The Munday Mill and Elevator Company are carrying the vaccine.

Look over your flocks and see that this disease is not present, and make sure that it is not.

pressure, or those early symptoms of heart disease or disturbance of the kidneys. An X-ray examination may reveal infection or pus sacs at the roots of one or more of the teeth—even though you may not be aware of their presence because they are causing you no pain.

If you have any dental infections that can be dealt with successfully only by sacrificing some teeth, sacrifice them. Whenever teeth can be saved with safety, this should be done. But they should not be saved when their continued presence in the mouth is a menace to the health. It is much better to part with some teeth than to take chances of developing incurable diseases of such important organs as the heart or the kidneys.

Watch Dead Teeth  
Dead teeth, especially, whether filled or crowned, will bear watching. They seem to be more liable to infection and should be regarded with suspicion whenever a focus of infection is suspected of being present in the body.
