## SEVEN AMENDMENTS PRESENTED FOR VOTERS' CONSIDERATION

Following is a brief and simplified version of the seven proposed constitutional amendments under consideration at this year's November 3rd, General Election.

**Amendment No. 1**  
Censure and Removal of Judges: To expand the power of the State Judicial Qualification Commission. To cover County Judges, Domestic Relations Judges, Juvenile Judges, Probate Judges, Corporate Judges, and Justices of the Peace, and would give authority to the Commission to censure or remove such judges from offices whose conduct is deemed inconsistent with the proper performance of the duties of the court.

**Amendment No. 2**  
Authority for Mixed Beverage Law: Impowers the Legislature to enact a mixed beverage law regulating the sale of mixed alcoholic beverages on a local option basis. Such a statute would enable each locality to vote on a mixed drink law on a local option basis.

**Amendment No. 3**  
Assessment of Farm, Ranch, and Forest Lands: Authorizes the Legislature to provide by statute for the establishment of a uniform method of assessing ranch, farm, and forest land based on the capability of the lands to support production of the various products rather than based on the value of such lands and crops.

**Amendment No. 4**  
Reconstitute State Building Commission: The proposed amendment establishes the State Building Commission as a three-member commission to be appointed by the governor with the advice and consent of the Senate. Members would serve six-year terms on a stag-

## FATAL WRECK NEAR ROWDEN KILLS ONE, INJURIES ANOTHER

BAIRD — James Paul Washburn, 32, of Big Spring, was charged with murder without malice in Justice of the Peace Garvin Jones' court here, in connection with a one vehicle accident which killed Wash-

burn's 6-year old daughter, Teri Lyn.

Teri Lyn was thrown from the car as it went out of control on a corner just east of Rowden on Highway 36. Investigating Officer Harold Hambrick of Baird stated that the car overturned once. The car was being driven by the child's father.

Also receiving bruises and abrasions in the crash was Washburn's 11-year old son, Ricky Wayne, who was reported in satisfactory condition in Hendrick Memorial Hospital at Abilene. Washburn was not injured in the crash.

It was reported that Washburn was taking the children to Houston when the accident occurred.

Teri Lyn was born Feb. 5, 1964 in Big Spring. She had lived there until about a year ago when she moved to Houston.

Survivors are her mother, Mrs. Frederick Bryant Baker of Houston; her father, James Paul Washburn of Big Spring; one brother, Ricky Wayne of Houston; and grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. Edward H. Moore and Mr. and Mrs. J. E. Washburn of Big Spring.

VIETNAM — U. S. Air Force Lieutenant Colonel Allen Bennett Jr., son of Mr. and Mrs. A. E. Bennett of Moran, has received the Air Medal at Tan Son Nhut AB, Vietnam, for air action in Southeast Asia.

Colonel Bennett, who holds the aeronautical rating of command pilot, was cited for his outstanding airmanship and courage on successful and important missions completed under hazardous conditions.

He serves at Tan Son Nhut as standardization evaluation pilot of the 460th Tactical Reconnaissance Wing, a unit of the Pacific Air Forces, headquarters for air operation in Southeast Asia, and Far East and the Pacific area.

The colonel, a 1948 graduate of Moran High School, attended Tarleton State college, Stephenville. He received his B. S. degree in education in 1953 at Texas Tech, and was commissioned there through the Air Force Reserve Officers Training Corps program.

Proposed **CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT**  
NUMBER SEVEN ON THE BALLOT (HJR 22)  
General Election Nov. 3, 1970

**BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:**  
Section 1. That Subsection (a), Section 64, Article III, of the Texas Constitution, be amended to read as follows:  
"Section 64. (a) The Legislature may by special statute provide for consolidation of governmental offices and functions of government of any one or more political subdivisions comprising or located within any county. Any such statute shall require an election to be held within the political subdivisions affected thereby with approval by a majority of the voters in each of these subdivisions, under such terms and conditions as the Legislature may require."  
Sec. 2. The foregoing constitutional amendment shall be submitted to a vote of the qualified electors of this state at an election to be held on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November, 1970, at which election the ballots shall be printed to provide for voting for or against the proposition: "The constitutional amendment authorizing the Legislature to provide for consolidating governmental offices and functions and allowing political subdivisions to contract for performance of governmental functions in any county."

Proposed **CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT**  
NUMBER SIX ON THE BALLOT (SJR32)  
General Election Nov. 3, 1970

**BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:**  
Section 1. That Section 51, Article XVI, Constitution of the State of Texas, be amended to read as follows:  
"Section 51. The homestead, not in a town or city, shall consist of not more than two hundred acres of land, which may be in one or more parcels, with the improvements thereon; the homestead in a city, town or village, shall consist of lot, or lots, not to exceed in value Ten Thousand Dollars, at the time of their designation as the homestead, without reference to the value of any improvements or subdivisions of the State to which provided, that the same shall be used for the purposes of a home, or as a place to exercise the calling or business of the head of a family; provided also, that any temporary renting of the homestead shall not change the character of the same, when no other homestead has been acquired."  
Sec. 2. The foregoing constitutional amendment shall be submitted to a vote of the qualified electors of this state at an election to be held on the first Monday in November, 1970, at which election the ballots shall be printed to provide for voting for or against the proposition: "The constitutional amendment increasing the value of the homestead which is exempt from forced sale."

Proposed **CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT**  
NUMBER FIVE ON THE BALLOT (HJR28)  
General Election Nov. 3, 1970

**BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:**  
Section 1. That Section 52, Article III, Constitution of the State of Texas, be amended to read as follows:  
"Section 52. (a) Except as otherwise provided by this section, the Legislature shall have no power to authorize any county, city, town or other political corporation or subdivision of the State to lend its credit or to grant public money or thing of value in aid of, or to any individual, association or corporation whatsoever, or to become a stockholder in such corporation, association or company."  
(b) Under Legislative provision, any county, any political subdivision of a county, any number of adjoining counties, or any political subdivision of the State, or any defined district now or hereafter to be described and defined within the State of Texas, and which may or may not include, towns, villages or municipal corporations, upon a vote of two-thirds majority of the resident property taxpayers voting thereon who are qualified electors of such dis-
